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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5135**

October 27, 2011, Introduced by Reps. Hughes and Bumstead and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 2008 PA 549, entitled

"Michigan promise zone authority act,"

by amending sections 7 and 15 (MCL 390.1667 and 390.1675).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 7. (1) A promise zone authority created under section 5
   shall prepare a promise zone development plan.
- 3 (2) The A promise zone development plan shall include, but is
  4 not limited to, all of the following:
  - (a) A complete description of the proposed promise of financial assistance. The proposed promise of financial assistance shall include, but is not limited to, a promise of financial assistance to all **ELIGIBLE** students residing within the promise zone and who graduate from a public high school or nonpublic high school located within that promise zone, **IN AN AMOUNT ESTABLISHED**

- 1 BY THE BOARD TO REFLECT THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR DISBURSEMENT TO
- 2 ELIGIBLE STUDENTS AND INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET UNDER SECTION
- 3 15. The AMOUNT OF proposed promise of financial assistance shall,
- 4 at a minimum, provide funding sufficient to provide an eligible
- 5 student the tuition necessary to obtain an associate degree or its
- 6 equivalent at a community or junior college in this state or
- 7 combination of community or junior colleges in this state and, at
- 8 most, provide funding sufficient to provide an eligible student the
- 9 tuition necessary TO AN ELIGIBLE STUDENT SHALL NOT EXCEED THE
- 10 AMOUNT THE BOARD DETERMINES IS SUFFICIENT TO PAY FOR THE TUITION
- 11 NECESSARY FOR THAT STUDENT to obtain a bachelor's degree or its
- 12 equivalent at a public postsecondary institution in this state or
- 13 combination of public postsecondary institutions in this state,
- 14 subject to any limitations authorized under this section. The
- 15 proposed promise of financial assistance may also, at most, provide
- 16 funding for an eligible student to attend a private college in this
- 17 state in an amount not to THAT DOES NOT exceed the average tuition
- 18 necessary to obtain a bachelor's degree at all public universities
- 19 in this state. The proposed promise of financial assistance may
- 20 also authorize the expenditure of funds for educational improvement
- 21 activities designed to increase readiness for postsecondary
- 22 education at public schools located in the promise zone.
- 23 (b) A complete description of any limitation on the promise of
- 24 financial assistance, ; if INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ANY OF
- 25 THE FOLLOWING:
- 26 (i) IF the promise of financial assistance will be prorated
- 27 based on the number of years the student has resided within the

- 1 promise zone. ; if
- 2 (ii) IF the promise of financial assistance will be restricted
- 3 to students who have resided within or attended a public high
- 4 school or nonpublic high school within the promise zone for a
- 5 minimum number of years. ; if
- 6 (iii) IF the promise of financial assistance is predicated on
- 7 the student maintaining a minimum college grade point average and
- 8 carrying a minimum college credit hour classload. ; or if
- 9 (iv) IF the promise of financial assistance is restricted to
- 10 attendance at 1 or more public or private postsecondary
- 11 institutions in this state.
- 12 (v) IF THE PROMISE OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IS LIMITED TO
- 13 STUDENTS WHOSE CUMULATIVE HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE EXCEEDS A
- 14 SPECIFIED MINIMUM. HOWEVER, A BOARD MAY REVISE, ESTABLISH, OR
- 15 ELIMINATE A HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE REQUIREMENT FOR
- 16 STUDENTS AFTER IT SUBMITS A PROMISE ZONE DEVELOPMENT PLAN TO THE
- 17 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY AND IS NOT REQUIRED TO AMEND THE PLAN OR
- 18 OBTAIN APPROVAL FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY FOR THAT CHANGE.
- 19 (c) A requirement that graduates of a public high school or
- 20 nonpublic high school exhaust all other known and available
- 21 restricted grants for tuition and fees for postsecondary education
- 22 provided by a federal, state, or local governmental entity, as
- 23 determined by the board.
- 24 (d) How the funds necessary to accomplish the promise of
- 25 financial assistance will be raised. Any amount received under the
- 26 state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1601 to 388.1772,
- 27 388.1896, shall not be included as a method of raising the

- 1 necessary funds. The promise zone development plan shall be
- 2 financed from 1 or more of the following sources:
- (i) Donations.
- $\mathbf{4}$  (ii) Revenues.
- 5 (iii) Money obtained from other sources approved by the
- 6 governing body or otherwise authorized by law.
- 7 (e) An actuarial model of how much the proposed plan is
- 8 estimated to cost, based on actuarial formulas developed by the
- 9 department of treasury.
- 10 (3) The proposed promise of financial assistance under
- 11 subsection (2) shall not include funding for attendance at a public
- 12 or private postsecondary institution not located in this state.
- 13 (4) The board shall submit the promise zone development plan
- 14 to the department of treasury promptly after its adoption. The
- 15 promise zone development plan shall be published on the website of
- 16 the eligible entity that established the promise zone.
- 17 (5) The department of treasury shall review the promise zone
- 18 development plan submitted under subsection (4). Not more than 60
- 19 days after receipt of a promise zone development plan submitted
- 20 under subsection (4), the department of treasury shall either
- 21 approve the promise zone development plan or provide a written
- 22 notice of deficiencies. If the department of treasury does not
- 23 approve a promise zone development plan submitted under subsection
- 24 (4) or provide a written notice of deficiencies within 60 days, the
- 25 promise zone development plan shall be considered approved. If a
- 26 promise zone development plan is approved, the department of
- 27 treasury shall certify that the promise zone development plan meets

- 1 all requirements under this act and is sustainable.
- 2 (6) The department of treasury shall review any proposed
- 3 amendments to a promise zone development plan. Not more than 60
- 4 days after receipt of proposed amendments to a promise zone
- 5 development plan, the department of treasury shall either approve
- 6 the proposed amendments or provide a written notice of
- 7 deficiencies. If the department of treasury does not approve
- 8 proposed amendments or provide a written notice of deficiencies
- 9 within 60 days, the proposed amendments shall be considered
- 10 approved. If proposed amendments are approved, the department of
- 11 treasury shall certify that the amendments meet all requirements
- 12 under this act.
- Sec. 15. (1) The director of the authority shall submit a
- 14 budget to the board for the operation of the authority for each
- 15 fiscal year before the beginning of the fiscal year. The budget
- 16 shall be prepared in the manner and contain the information
- 17 required of municipal departments. After review by the board, the
- 18 budget shall be submitted to the governing body. The governing body
- 19 must approve the budget before the board may adopt the budget.
- 20 Unless authorized by the governing body, funds of the eligible
- 21 entity shall not be included in the budget of the authority.
- 22 (2) THE BUDGET DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) SHALL INCLUDE THE
- 23 AMOUNT THE AUTHORITY INTENDS TO DISBURSE TO EACH ELIGIBLE STUDENT
- 24 IN THE FISCAL YEAR COVERED BY THE BUDGET. SUBJECT TO THE MAXIMUM
- 25 AMOUNTS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 7 (2) (A), THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH THE
- 26 AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL PAYMENT TO ELIGIBLE STUDENTS AND, IN MAKING
- 27 THAT DETERMINATION, SHALL CONSIDER THE FINANCIAL RESOURCES

1 AVAILABLE TO THE AUTHORITY FOR DISBURSEMENT TO THOSE STUDENTS.
