Senate Bill 1159 (Substitute S-1 as reported) Senate Bill 1160 (Substitute S-1 as reported)

CONTENT

Both bills would amend the Michigan Election Law relative to the date of the presidential primary election.

<u>Senate Bill 1159 (S-1)</u> would require a statewide presidential primary election to be conducted on the third Tuesday in March in each presidential election year, rather than on the fourth Tuesday in February as currently required.

<u>Senate Bill 1160 (S-1)</u> specifies that, although the February regular election date is the fourth Tuesday in February, in each presidential election year when a statewide presidential primary is held, the February regular election date would be the third Tuesday in March.

The bills are tie-barred.
