#### HB-4310, As Passed House, May 22, 2013

# HOUSE BILL No. 4310

February 26, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Cotter, Walsh, Kelly and Kesto and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled

"Occupational code,"

by amending sections 1204 and 1205 (MCL 339.1204 and 339.1205), section 1204 as amended by 2003 PA 57 and section 1205 as amended by 1997 PA 97.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1204. (1) The department shall issue a license to a
 person for the operation of a cosmetology establishment if all of
 the following requirements are met:

(a) An application is submitted by the owners or managers of the establishment.

(b) The application **DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A)** includes a drawing or diagram indicating **THAT DESCRIBES** the premises to be licensed and the location of **ALL** required equipment and facilities.

(c) The premises has HAVE satisfactorily passed an inspection
 conducted by the department for the purpose of determining whether
 the establishment has met MEETS sanitation and equipment standards
 prescribed in rules promulgated by the director.

(d) Except as provided in subsection (3), (2), the cosmetology
establishment shall be IS under the daily attendance and
supervision of a licensed cosmetologist who is not less than 18
years of age and has had not less than AT LEAST 1 year's practical
experience in cosmetology.

10 (2) A cosmetology establishment shall be completely separated 11 by full partitions and doors from a dwelling or a school of 12 cosmetology.

13 (2) (3) The department may issue a limited cosmetology 14 establishment license to a person who THAT seeks to perform only 1 15 or more services of cosmetology on the premises. If the establishment license is limited to only manicuring services or 16 17 skin care services, the supervising licensee may be an individual 18 WHO IS licensed only in that service. A licensed cosmetologist WHO 19 **IS** working in a limited licensed cosmetology establishment shall 20 not perform cosmetology services for which the premises are not 21 licensed. If the cosmetology establishment license is limited to 22 electrology, the supervising licensee shall be a licensed 23 electrologist. A licensed cosmetologist shall not supervise a 24 cosmetology establishment whose cosmetology license is limited to rendering electrology unless the cosmetologist is licensed as an 25 electrologist. 26

(3) (4) The department may grant a temporary establishment

license to a person who THAT has fulfilled all licensure
 requirements except for the completion of the inspection.

3 (4) (5) The transfer of ownership or location of a cosmetology
4 establishment voids the license. The filing of a new license
5 application is REQUIRED BEFORE a predicate to the change in
6 ownership or location of an establishment.

7 (5) (6) The license of the establishment and of each
8 individual working in the establishment shall be displayed in a
9 prominent place which THAT is visible to the public at all times.
10 The license of an individual WHO IS working in the establishment
11 may be posted at the individual's work station.

Sec. 1205. (1) The department shall issue a license to a person for the operation of a school of cosmetology if all of the following requirements are met:

(a) An application is submitted by the owner or manager of theschool.

(b) The application includes a drawing or diagram that
indicates DESCRIBES the premises to be licensed , showing that the
premises are fully partitioned from any other activity, business,
or dwelling. The AND SHOWS THE location of ALL required equipment
and facilities. shall also be shown on the diagram.

(c) A cash or surety bond of \$10,000.00 has been IS furnished
in favor of the people of this state for the use and benefit of
students and conditioned upon ON the faithful performance and
satisfaction of the contractual rights of students.

26 (d) Provisions have been ARE made for the school to be under
27 the daily supervision of a licensed instructor who has at least 3

years' experience in all OF THE services of cosmetology being
 taught in the school.

3 (e) The premises has HAVE successfully passed an inspection by
4 the department THAT WAS conducted for the purpose of determining
5 whether the school has met MEETS the standards set forth in this
6 article and rules promulgated by the director.

7 (2) A school of cosmetology shall fulfill all of the following8 requirements:

9 (a) Shall maintain a course of practical training and 10 technical instruction, as outlined in the various curricula set 11 forth in rules promulgated by the director, equal to the 12 requirements for prelicensure training under this article. A school of cosmetology shall teach hair care services, skin care services, 13 14 and manicuring services and may hold a limited license for the 15 teaching of electrology. However, a school of cosmetology with THAT HAS a license limited only to the teaching of electrology shall 16 17 teach only electrology and not any other cosmetology service.

(b) Shall possess efficient apparatus and equipment prescribed
in rules promulgated by the director THAT ARE sufficient for the
ready and full teaching of each subject in the curriculum.

(c) Shall maintain 1 person INDIVIDUAL WHO IS licensed as an
 instructor - AND IS competent to impart instruction in each subject
 of its curriculum - for every 20 students.

24 (d) Shall be operated for teaching purposes only. Instructors
25 shall practice on the public only to demonstrate techniques to
26 students and to correct the work of students.

(e) Shall provide for the display of the license of the school

of cosmetology and of each instructor working in the school in a
 prominent place that is visible to the public at all times. A

(F) SHALL DISPLAY A sign shall be displayed indicating THAT STATES that services are rendered by students of the school.

5

(G) (f) At the time of the enrollment of a student, shall
furnish the student a financial contract showing the total cost and
all charges involved in the complete course of study. Advertising
matter put out by schools, when mentioning the cost of tuition or
related subjects, shall furnish the same financial information as
described in this subsection.SUBDIVISION.

11 (3) A cosmetology establishment exacting THAT CHARGES a fee 12 for the teaching of TO TEACH cosmetology or 1 or more services of cosmetology is considered a school of cosmetology and is required 13 14 to comply with this section. A cosmetology establishment conducting 15 THAT CONDUCTS an apprenticeship program without charging a fee for the teaching of cosmetology shall comply with subsection (5). A 16 17 cosmetology establishment which THAT has successfully trained 1 18 apprentice is eligible to train additional apprentices except that a cosmetology establishment shall not have more than 2 apprentices 19 20 at the same time.

(4) The department may issue a limited school of cosmetology license to a school teaching THAT TEACHES only electrology. A school of cosmetology whose license is limited to teaching only electrology shall fulfill all of the requirements of this section, except that AN ELECTROLOGY INSTRUCTOR SHALL PROVIDE THE daily supervision of the school shall be provided by an electrology instructor and the curriculum offered and equipment and facilities

required shall be only those required for the teaching of
 electrology.

3 (5) A school of cosmetology or a cosmetology establishment
4 conducting THAT CONDUCTS an apprenticeship program shall comply
5 with all of the following requirements:

6 (a) Require that a student or apprentice be in attendance not7 more than 7 hours per day or not more than 40 hours per week.

8 (b) Keep a daily record of the attendance of each student or
9 apprentice, PROVIDE a copy of which shall be sent THE DAILY RECORD
10 to the department monthly, establish grades, and require a student
11 or apprentice to pass an examination before certifying to the
12 department that an individual has completed training.

(c) Permit a cosmetology student or apprentice to practice on 13 14 the public only after completing at least 350 hours of instruction 15 in the general cosmetology curriculum, including both theory and practical hours. A student or apprentice in a natural hair 16 17 cultivation, manicuring, skin care, or electrology curriculum may 18 practice on the public only after completing at least 1/4 of the 19 hours required by the applicable curriculum, including both theory 20 and practical hours.

(6) The transfer of ownership or location of a school of cosmetology voids the license. The filing of a new license application is **REQUIRED BEFORE** a predicate to the change in ownership or location of a school.
