- 17 (e) "Security interest" means any interest in real or personal
- 18 property that secures payment or performance of an obligation.
- 19 (f) "Substituted proceeds of a crime" means any property
- 20 obtained or any gain realized by the sale or exchange of proceeds
- 21 of a crime.
- 22 (G) "WILLFUL BLINDNESS" MEANS THE INTENTIONAL DISREGARD OF
- 23 OBJECTIVE FACT THAT WOULD LEAD A REASONABLE PERSON TO CONCLUDE THAT
- 24 THE PROPERTY WAS DERIVED FROM UNLAWFUL ACTIVITY OR WOULD BE USED
- 25 FOR AN UNLAWFUL PURPOSE.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 27 after the date it is enacted into law.

- Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect 1
- unless House Bill No. 5234 of the 97th Legislature is enacted into 2
- 3 law.
