SENATE BILL No. 1040

September 10, 2014, Introduced by Senator CASWELL and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill to amend 1941 PA 122, entitled

"An act to establish the revenue collection duties of the department of treasury; to prescribe its powers and duties as the revenue collection agency of this state; to prescribe certain powers and duties of the state treasurer; to establish the collection duties of certain other state departments for money or accounts owed to this state; to regulate the importation, stamping, and disposition of certain tobacco products; to provide for the transfer of powers and duties now vested in certain other state boards, commissions, departments, and offices; to prescribe certain duties of and require certain reports from the department of treasury; to provide procedures for the payment, administration, audit, assessment, levy of interests or penalties on, and appeals of taxes and tax liability; to prescribe its powers and duties if an agreement to act as agent for a city to administer, collect, and enforce the city income tax act on behalf of a city is entered into with any city; to provide an appropriation; to abolish the state board of tax administration; to prescribe penalties and provide remedies; and to declare the effect of this act,"

by amending section 22 (MCL 205.22), as amended by 2007 PA 194.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 22. (1) A taxpayer aggrieved by an assessment, decision,

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- 1 or order of the department may appeal the contested portion of the
- 2 assessment, decision, or order to the tax tribunal within 35-60
- 3 days, or to the court of claims within 90 days after the
- 4 assessment, decision, or order. The uncontested portion of an
- 5 assessment, order, or decision shall be paid as a prerequisite to
- 6 appeal. However, an action shall be commenced in the court of
- 7 claims within 6 months after payment of the tax or an adverse
- 8 determination of the taxpayer's claim for refund, whichever is
- 9 later, if the payment of the tax or adverse determination of the
- 10 claim for refund occurred under the former single business tax act,
- 11 1975 PA 228, and before May 1, 1986.
- 12 (2) An appeal under this section shall be perfected as
- 13 provided under the tax tribunal act, 1973 PA 186, MCL 205.701 to
- 14 205.779, and rules promulgated under that act for the tax tribunal,
- 15 or chapter 64 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236,
- 16 MCL 600.6401 to 600.6475, and rules adopted under that chapter for
- 17 the court of claims. In an appeal to the court of claims, the
- 18 appellant shall first pay the tax, including any applicable
- 19 penalties and interest, under protest and claim a refund as part of
- 20 the appeal.
- 21 (3) A taxpayer or the department may take an appeal by right
- 22 from a decision of the tax tribunal or the court of claims to the
- 23 court of appeals. The appeal shall be taken on the record made
- 24 before the tax tribunal or the court of claims. The taxpayer or
- 25 department may take further appeal to the supreme court in
- 26 accordance with the court rules provided for appeals to the supreme
- 27 court.

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- 1 (4) The assessment, decision, or order of the department, if
- 2 not appealed in accordance with this section, is final and is not
- 3 reviewable in any court by mandamus, appeal, or other method of
- 4 direct or collateral attack.
- 5 (5) An assessment is final, conclusive, and not subject to
- 6 further challenge after 90 days after the issuance of the
- 7 assessment, decision, or order of the department, and a person is
- 8 not entitled to a refund of any tax, interest, or penalty paid
- 9 pursuant to an assessment unless the aggrieved person has appealed
- 10 the assessment in the manner provided by this section.
