SENATE BILL No. 1078

September 18, 2014, Introduced by Senator CASWELL and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2008 PA 549, entitled "Michigan promise zone authority act," by amending sections 7 and 15 (MCL 390.1667 and 390.1675), as amended by 2013 PA 210.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 7. (1) A promise zone authority created under section 5
 shall prepare a promise zone development plan.
 - (2) A promise zone development plan shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following:
 - (a) A complete description of the proposed promise of financial assistance. The ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO A proposed promise of financial assistance:

- 1 (i) IT shall include, but is not limited to, a promise of
- 2 financial assistance to all eligible students residing within WHO
- 3 RESIDE IN the promise zone and who graduate from a public high
- 4 school or nonpublic high school located within that promise zone. 7
- 5 in an
- 6 (ii) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3) (B), THE amount OF THE PROPOSED
- 7 PROMISE OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SHALL BE established by the board
- 8 to reflect the amount available for disbursement to eligible
- 9 students and included in the annual budget under section 15. The
- 10 (iii) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3) (B), THE amount of THE proposed
- 11 promise of financial assistance TO AN ELIGIBLE STUDENT shall, at a
- 12 minimum, equal or exceed the amount the board determines is
- 13 sufficient to pay for the qualified educational expenses for an THE
- 14 eligible student to obtain an associate degree at a community or
- 15 junior college in this state, and shall not exceed the amount the
- 16 board determines is sufficient to pay for the qualified educational
- 17 expenses for an-THE eligible student to obtain a bachelor's degree
- 18 or its equivalent at a public postsecondary institution in this
- 19 state or combination of public postsecondary institutions in this
- 20 state, subject to any limitations authorized under this section.
- 21 The proposed promise of financial assistance may also, at most,
- 22 provide funding for an eligible student to attend a private college
- 23 in this state in an amount that does not exceed the average amount
- 24 of qualified educational expenses to obtain a bachelor's degree at
- 25 all public universities in this state.
- 26 (iv) The proposed promise of financial assistance may also
- 27 authorize the expenditure of funds for educational improvement

- 1 activities designed to increase readiness for postsecondary
- 2 education at public schools located in the promise zone.
- 3 (b) A complete description of any limitation on the promise of
- 4 financial assistance, including, but not limited to, any of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (i) If the promise of financial assistance will be prorated
- 7 based on the number of years the student has resided within the
- 8 promise zone.
- 9 (ii) If the promise of financial assistance will be restricted
- 10 to students who have resided within or attended a public high
- 11 school or nonpublic high school within the promise zone for a
- 12 minimum number of years.
- 13 (iii) If the promise of financial assistance is predicated on
- 14 the student maintaining a minimum college grade point average and
- 15 carrying a minimum college credit hour classload.
- (iv) If the promise of financial assistance is restricted to
- 17 attendance at 1 or more public or private postsecondary
- 18 institutions in this state.
- 19 (v) If the promise of financial assistance is limited to
- 20 students whose cumulative high school grade point average exceeds a
- 21 specified minimum. However, a board may revise, establish, or
- 22 eliminate a high school grade point average requirement for
- 23 students after it submits a promise zone development plan to the
- 24 department of treasury and is not required to amend the plan or
- 25 obtain approval from the department of treasury for that change.
- 26 (vi) If the promise of financial assistance is limited to
- 27 students who comply with requirements established by the board in

- 1 order to improve student progress toward degree completion.
- (vii) If the promise of financial assistance in a promise zone
- 3 that encompasses more than 2 school districts is limited to
- 4 students who reside in and graduate from high schools located
- 5 within the boundaries of fewer than all of its constituent school
- 6 districts.
- 7 (c) A requirement that graduates of a public high school or
- 8 nonpublic high school exhaust all other known and available
- 9 restricted grants for qualified educational expenses for
- 10 postsecondary education provided by a federal, state, or local
- 11 governmental entity, as determined by the board.
- 12 (d) How the funds necessary to accomplish the promise of
- 13 financial assistance will be raised. Any amount received under the
- 14 state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1601 to 388.1896,
- 15 shall not be included as a method of raising the necessary funds.
- 16 The promise zone development plan shall be financed from 1 or more
- 17 of the following sources:
- 18 (i) Donations.
- 19 (ii) Revenues.
- 20 (iii) Money obtained from other sources approved by the
- 21 governing body or otherwise authorized by law.
- 22 (e) An actuarial model of how much the proposed plan is
- 23 estimated to cost, based on actuarial formulas developed by the
- 24 department of treasury.
- 25 (3) The ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO A proposed promise of
- 26 financial assistance under subsection (2):
- 27 (A) THE PROPOSED PROMISE OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE shall not

- 1 include funding for attendance at ATTENDING a public or private
- 2 postsecondary institution THAT IS not located in this state.
- 3 (B) THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD FOR DISBURSEMENT TO
- 4 ELIGIBLE STUDENTS IN A FISCAL YEAR, AND THE AMOUNT ACTUALLY
- 5 DISBURSED, SHALL NOT EXCEED \$500,000.00. IF NECESSARY, THE BOARD
- 6 MAY REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF DISBURSEMENTS TO ELIGIBLE STUDENTS IN A
- 7 FISCAL YEAR UNDER SUBSECTION (2) ON A PRO RATA BASIS TO REFLECT THE
- 8 AMOUNT AVAILABLE UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION.
- 9 (4) The board shall submit the promise zone development plan
- 10 to the department of treasury promptly after its adoption. The
- 11 promise zone development plan shall be published on the website of
- 12 the eligible entity that established the promise zone.
- 13 (5) The department of treasury shall review the promise zone
- 14 development plan submitted under subsection (4). Not more than 60
- 15 days after receipt of RECEIVING a promise zone development plan
- 16 submitted under subsection (4), the department of treasury shall
- 17 either approve the promise zone development plan or provide a
- 18 written notice of deficiencies. If the department of treasury does
- 19 not approve a promise zone development plan submitted under
- 20 subsection (4) or provide a written notice of deficiencies within
- 21 60 days, the promise zone development plan shall be—IS considered
- 22 approved. If a promise zone development plan is approved, the
- 23 department of treasury shall certify that the promise zone
- 24 development plan meets all requirements under this act and is
- 25 sustainable.
- 26 (6) The department of treasury shall review any proposed
- 27 amendments to a promise zone development plan. Not more than 60

- 1 days after receipt of RECEIVING proposed amendments to a promise
- 2 zone development plan, the department of treasury shall either
- 3 approve the proposed amendments or provide a written notice of
- 4 deficiencies. If the department of treasury does not approve
- 5 proposed amendments or provide a written notice of deficiencies
- 6 within 60 days, the proposed amendments shall be IS considered
- 7 approved. If proposed amendments are approved, the department of
- 8 treasury shall certify that the amendments meet all requirements
- 9 under this act.
- 10 Sec. 15. (1) The board shall adopt a budget for the operation
- 11 of the authority for each fiscal year, before the beginning of that
- 12 fiscal year, based on a budget submitted to it by the director. The
- 13 budget shall be prepared in the manner and contain the information
- 14 required of municipal departments. Unless authorized by the
- 15 governing body, the budget of an authority shall not include any
- 16 money of the eligible entity.
- 17 (2) The budget described in subsection (1) shall include the
- 18 amount the authority intends to disburse to each eliqible student
- 19 in the fiscal year covered by the budget. Subject to the maximum
- 20 amounts described in section 7(2)(a) AND (3)(B), the board shall
- 21 establish the amount of the annual payment to eligible students
- 22 and, in making that determination, shall consider the financial
- 23 resources available to the authority for disbursement to those
- 24 students.
