## SENATE BILL NO. 1073

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 43516 and 43523a (MCL 324.43516 and 324.43523a), section 43516 as amended by 2016 PA 36 and section 43523a as added by 2013 PA 108, and by adding section 43526b; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 43516. (1) An-UNTIL MARCH 1, 2018, AN individual who has been issued a hunting, fur harvester's, or fishing license shall carry the license and shall exhibit the license upon the demand of a conservation officer, a law enforcement officer, a tribal conservation officer who complies with subsection (3), (6), or the owner or occupant of the land if either or both of the following apply:

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(a) The person-INDIVIDUAL is hunting, trapping, or fishing.

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(b) Subject to section 43510(2) and except as provided in
section 43513, the individual is in possession of a firearm or
other hunting or trapping apparatus or fishing apparatus in an area
frequented by wild animals or fish, respectively.

6 (2) Subject to section 43510(2) and except as provided in 7 section 43513, an individual shall not carry or possess afield a shotgun with buckshot, slug loads, or ball loads; a bow and arrow; 8 9 a muzzle-loading rifle or black powder handgun; or a centerfire 10 handgun or centerfire rifle during firearm deer season unless that 11 individual has a valid deer license, with an unused kill tag, if 12 issued, issued in his or her name. The individual shall exhibit an 13 unused kill tag, if issued, upon the request of a conservation 14 officer, a law enforcement officer, or the owner or occupant of the 15 land.

(3) BEGINNING MARCH 1, 2018, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS BEEN ISSUED 16 A HUNTING, FUR HARVESTER'S, OR FISHING LICENSE SHALL CARRY THE 17 LICENSE OR, IF APPLICABLE, AN ELECTRONIC COPY OF THE LICENSE AND 18 19 SHALL EXHIBIT THE LICENSE OR, IF APPLICABLE, AN ELECTRONIC COPY OF 20 THE LICENSE UPON THE DEMAND OF A CONSERVATION OFFICER, A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, A TRIBAL CONSERVATION OFFICER WHO COMPLIES 21 22 WITH SUBSECTION (6), OR THE OWNER OR OCCUPANT OF THE LAND IF EITHER 23 OR BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY:

24 (A) THE INDIVIDUAL IS HUNTING, TRAPPING, OR FISHING.

(B) SUBJECT TO SECTION 43510(2) AND EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN
SECTION 43513, THE INDIVIDUAL IS IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM OR
OTHER HUNTING OR TRAPPING APPARATUS OR FISHING APPARATUS IN AN AREA

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1 FREQUENTED BY WILD ANIMALS OR FISH, RESPECTIVELY.

2 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DISPLAYS AN ELECTRONIC COPY OF HIS OR HER LICENSE USING AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION 3 4 (3) IS NOT PRESUMED TO HAVE CONSENTED TO A SEARCH OF THE ELECTRONIC 5 DEVICE. THIS STATE, A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY, A TRIBAL CONSERVATION 6 OFFICER WHO COMPLIES WITH SUBSECTION (6), AN EMPLOYEE OF THIS STATE 7 OR A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY, OR THE OWNER OR OCCUPANT OF THE LAND IS NOT LIABLE FOR DAMAGE TO OR LOSS OF AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE THAT 8 9 OCCURS AS A RESULT OF A CONSERVATION OFFICER, A TRIBAL CONSERVATION 10 OFFICER WHO COMPLIES WITH SUBSECTION (6), A LAW ENFORCEMENT 11 OFFICER, OR THE OWNER OR OCCUPANT OF THE LAND VIEWING AN ELECTRONIC 12 COPY OF A LICENSE IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, 13 REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE CONSERVATION OFFICER, TRIBAL CONSERVATION 14 OFFICER WHO COMPLIES WITH SUBSECTION (6), LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, OR OWNER OR OCCUPANT OF THE LAND WAS IN POSSESSION OF THE 15 ELECTRONIC DEVICE AT THE TIME THE DAMAGE OR LOSS OCCURRED. 16

17 (5) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONTINUE TO EXPLORE THE EXPANDED USE
18 OF ELECTRONIC TECHNOLOGY TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL SERVICES THAT WILL
19 ENHANCE HUNTING AND FISHING EXPERIENCES FOR INDIVIDUALS IN THIS
20 STATE.

(6) (3) A tribal conservation officer under subsection (1),
(3), OR (4) must be in uniform, display proper credentials, and be
on official duty within the ceded territory of the treaty of March
28, 1836, 7 Stat 491.

(7) (4) As used in this section, "tribal conservation officer"
means a conservation officer employed by the Great Lakes Indian
fish and wildlife commission, the Bay Mills Indian Community, the

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Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, the Little Traverse Bay
 Bands of Odawa Indians, the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and
 Chippewa Indians, or the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians.

Sec. 43523a. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this part, an
individual shall not hunt small game, unless the individual
possesses a current base license. A base license authorizes the
individual named in the license to hunt for small game, except for
animals or birds that require a special license.

9 (2) If authorized in an order issued under part 401, an 10 individual that WHO possesses a current base license may take 11 specified fur-bearing animals by means other than trapping during 12 the open season for hunting these fur-bearing animals. However, an individual who goes on a bobcat hunt with a licensed hunter is not 13 14 required to possess a base license if the individual does not carry 15 a firearm, bow, or crossbow and does not own dogs used to chase or locate a bobcat during the hunt. 16

17 (3) Beginning March 1, 2014, the THE fee for a base license is18 as follows:

19 (a) Subject to subdivision (b), for a resident, \$10.00.

20 (b) For a resident minor child or nonresident minor child,21 \$5.00.

(c) Subject to subdivision (b), for a nonresident, \$150.00.
(4) A base license is void between the hours of 1/2 hour after
sunset and 1/2 hour before sunrise with the exception of coyote
hunting.

26 (5) Beginning March 1, 2014, a A nonresident may purchase a
27 limited nonresident small game license entitling that individual to

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hunt for a 7-day period all species of small game that are 1 2 available to hunt under a nonresident base license. The fee for a limited nonresident small game license is \$80.00. The purchase of a 3 4 7-day limited nonresident small game license does not entitle the 5 holder to purchase any additional licenses.

(6) NOT LATER THAN MARCH 1, 2018, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP 6 AN ELECTRONIC LICENSE THAT ALLOWS AN INDIVIDUAL TO DISPLAY AN 7 ELECTRONIC COPY OF HIS OR HER BASE LICENSE USING AN ELECTRONIC 8 9 DEVICE.

SEC. 43526B. THE DEPARTMENT MAY DEVELOP AN ELECTRONIC LICENSE 10 11 THAT ALLOWS AN INDIVIDUAL TO DISPLAY AN ELECTRONIC COPY OF HIS OR 12 HER KILL TAG UNDER SECTION 43524, 43527A, 43528, 43528A, 43528B, OR 43529 USING AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE. 13

Enacting section 1. Section 43545 of the natural resources and 14 15 environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.43545, is 16 repealed.
