## HOUSE BILL No. 4757

June 18, 2015, Introduced by Reps. McBroom, Aaron Miller, Glenn, Lyons, Theis,
LaFontaine, Franz and Hooker and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.
A bill to amend 1893 PA 58, entitled
"An act to provide for selecting seats for members in the hall of the house of representatives,"
by amending section 1 (MCL 4.61).
THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. As a part of the organization of the house of representatives upon the first day of the first regular session of each legislature, the CLERK OF THE HOUSE SHALL ASSIGN MEMBERS seats in the hall of the house. shall be selected by the members in a manner as follows: The clerk shall call the names of the members

6 having the greatest total length of sexvice in the house who shall members in the order of their total length of service in the house, who shall select seats of their choice not already selected, down to and including those members commencing their second terms. If
there are 2 or more members who have an equal length of service the Elexk shall prepare a list of their names and place opposite each name a number, which shall be drawn by lotery as prescribed in this section for members entering their first terms. The clerk shall then prepare a list of members entering upon their first terms, listing the names of such members alphabetically and placing opposite each name numbers in consecutive order from 1, using as many numbers as are necessary. A box shall be provided in which shall be deposited numbered white balls, which shall bear the same numbers as those appearing on said list. A boy or girl, selected by the clexk, then being blindfolded shall draw from the box 1 ball and hand it to the clexk, who shall announce the number on the ball, and the clexk shall call the member's name found on the list opposite the corresponding number, who shall then select a seat not previously selected. In like mannex all members entering upon their first terms shall select seats. Any representative-elect necessarily absent on the first day of the session may, in writing, appoint any representative to select a seat for him, and if no one appears for such absent representative-elect, then the clerk of the house shall make a selection for him, when his name is called.THE SEATS ASSIGNED BY THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE SHALL BE THE MEMBERS' SEATS UNLESS A RESOLUTION ALTERING THE MEMBERS' SEATS IS ADOPTED BY A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS VOTING ON THE RESOLUTION.
