HOUSE BILL No. 5142

December 10, 2015, Introduced by Reps. Cochran, McCready, Heise, Kelly, Graves, Canfield, Liberati, Callton, McBroom and Lucido and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 226, 226a, 226b, and 227 (MCL 257.226, 257.226a, 257.226b, and 257.227), section 226 as amended by 2004 PA 163, section 226a as amended by 2006 PA 516, section 226b as amended by 2003 PA 152, and section 227 as amended by 2011 PA 92.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 226. (1) A vehicle registration issued by the secretary of state expires on the owner's birthday, unless another expiration date is provided for under this act or unless the registration is for the following vehicles, in which case registration expires on the last day of February:

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(a) A commercial vehicle except for a commercial vehicle

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issued a registration under the international registration plan or
 a pickup truck or van owned by an individual.

3 (b) Except for a trailer or semitrailer issued a registration
4 under the international registration plan, a trailer or semitrailer
5 owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an
6 individual; or a pole trailer.

7 (2) Until February 1, 2005, the expiration date for a
8 registration issued for a motorcycle is March 31. Beginning
9 February 1, 2005, the THE expiration date for a registration issued
10 for a motorcycle is the motorcycle owner's birthday.

11 (3) The expiration date for a registration bearing the letters
12 "SEN" or "REP" is February 1.

13 (4) In the case of a vehicle owned by a business, corporation,
14 or an owner other than an individual, the secretary of state may
15 assign or reassign the expiration date of the registration.

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(5) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:

(a) After the October 1 immediately preceding the year
designated on the registration, issue a registration upon
application and payment of the proper fee for a commercial vehicle,
other than a pickup or van owned by an individual; or a trailer
owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an
individual.

(b) Beginning 60 days before the expiration date assigned on an international registration plan registration plate, issue a registration under section 801g upon application and payment of the proper apportioned fee for a commercial vehicle engaged in interstate commerce.

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1 (c) Beginning 45 days before the owner's birthday and 120 days 2 before the expiration date assigned by the secretary of state, issue a registration for a vehicle other than those designated in 3 4 subsection (1)(a) or (b). However, if an owner whose registration 5 period begins 45 days before his or her birthday will be out of the 6 state during the 45 days immediately preceding expiration of a registration or for other good cause shown cannot apply for a 7 renewal registration within the 45-day period, application for a 8 renewal registration may be made not more than 6 months before 9 10 expiration.

11 (6) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection AND 12 SECTION 226B(2), the secretary of state, upon application and 13 payment of the proper fee, shall issue a registration for a vehicle 14 or a motorcycle to a resident that shall expire on the owner's birthday. If the owner's next birthday is at least 6 months but not 15 more than 12 months in the future, the owner shall receive a 16 17 registration valid until the owner's next birthday. If the owner's 18 next birthday is less than 6 months in the future, the owner shall 19 receive a registration valid until the owner's birthday following 20 the owner's next birthday. The tax required under this act for a registration described in this subsection shall be either of the 21 22 following:

(a) For an original registration, the tax shall bear the same
relationship to the tax required under section 801 for a 12-month
registration as the length of the registration bears to 12 months.
(b) For a renewal of a registration, either of the following:
(i) For a registration that is for at least 6 months but not

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1 more than 12 months, the same amount as for 12 months.

2 (ii) For a renewal of a registration that is for more than 12
3 months, 2 times the amount for 12 months.

Partial months shall be considered as whole months in the
calculation of the required tax and in the determination of the
length of time between the application for a registration and the
owner's next birthday. The tax required for that registration shall
be rounded off to whole dollars as provided in section 801.

9 (7) A certificate of title shall remain valid until canceled
10 by the secretary of state for cause or upon a transfer of an
11 interest shown on the certificate of title.

12 (8) The secretary of state, upon request, shall issue special 13 registration for commercial vehicles, valid for 6 months after the 14 date of issue, if the full registration fee exceeds \$50.00, on the 15 payment of 1/2 the full registration fee and a service charge as 16 enumerated in section 802(1).

17 (9) The secretary of state may issue a special registration18 for each of the following:

(a) A new vehicle purchased or leased outside of this state and delivered in this state to the purchaser or lessee by the manufacturer of that vehicle for removal to a place outside of this state, if a certification is made that the vehicle will be primarily used, stored, and registered outside of this state and will not be returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for use or storage.

26 (b) A vehicle purchased or leased in this state and delivered27 to the purchaser or lessee by a dealer or by the owner of the

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vehicle for removal to a place outside of this state, if a
 certification is made that the vehicle will be primarily used,
 stored, and registered outside of this state and will not be
 returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for use or
 storage.

6 (10) A special registration issued under subsection (9) is 7 valid for not more than 14 days after the date of issuance, and a fee shall be collected for each special registration as provided in 8 9 section 802(3). The special registration may be in the form 10 determined by the secretary of state. If a dealer makes a retail 11 sale or lease of a vehicle to a purchaser or lessee who is 12 qualified and eligible to obtain a special registration, the dealer 13 shall apply for the special registration for the purchaser or 14 lessee. If a person other than a dealer sells or leases a vehicle to a purchaser or lessee who is qualified and eligible to obtain a 15 16 special registration, the purchaser or lessee shall appear in 17 person, or by a person exercising the purchaser's or lessee's power 18 of attorney, at an office of the secretary of state and furnish a 19 certification that the person is the bona fide purchaser or lessee 20 or that the person has granted the power of attorney, together with 21 other forms required for the issuance of the special registration 22 and provide the secretary of state with proof that the vehicle is 23 covered by a Michigan no-fault insurance policy issued pursuant to 24 section 3101 of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 25 500.3101, or proof that the vehicle is covered by a policy of 26 insurance issued by an insurer pursuant to section 3163 of the 27 insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3163. The

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certification required in this subsection shall contain all of the
 following:

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(a) The address of the purchaser or lessee.

4 (b) A statement that the vehicle is purchased or leased for5 registration outside of this state.

6 (c) A statement that the vehicle shall be primarily used,7 stored, and registered outside of this state.

8 (d) The name of the jurisdiction in which the vehicle is to be9 registered.

10 (e) Other information requested by the secretary of state.
11 (11) Upon request, the secretary of state may issue a
12 registration valid for 6 months after the date of issuance for use
13 on a trailer or semitrailer weighing 1,500 pounds or less and that
14 is used for recreational purposes, upon payment of 1/2 the full
15 registration fee imposed under section 801(1)(*l*). This subsection
16 does not apply after October 1, 2003.

17 (11) (12)—In the case of a commercial vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer issued a registration under the international 18 19 registration plan, the secretary of state in mutual agreement with 20 the owner may assign or reassign the expiration date of the 21 registration. However, the expiration date agreed to shall be either March 31, June 30, September 30, or December 31. Renewals 22 expiring on or after September 30, 1993 shall be for a minimum of 23 at least 12 months if there is a change in the established 24 25 expiration date.

26 (12) (13) The expiration date for a multiyear registration
27 issued for a leased vehicle shall be the date the lease expires but

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1 shall not be for a period longer than 24 months.

2 Sec. 226a. (1) Temporary registration plates or markers may be 3 issued to licensed dealers in vehicles and to persons engaged in 4 the sale of vessels required to be numbered by part 801 of the 5 natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, 6 MCL 324.80101 to 324.80199, upon application accompanied by the proper fee, for use by purchasers or lessees of vehicles, for A 7 PERIOD not to exceed 15 days pending receipt of regular 8 9 registration plates from the dealer or person. Only 1 temporary 10 plate or marker may be issued to a purchaser or lessee of a 11 vehicle. If a dealer or person requires a purchaser or lessee of a 12 vehicle or purchaser or lessee of a vessel to pay for a temporary 13 plate or marker, the dealer or person shall not charge the 14 purchaser or lessee more than the dealer or person was charged by the secretary of state for the individual plate or marker. The 15 16 secretary of state shall determine the composition and design of 17 the temporary registration plates or markers.

18 (2) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ISSUE A TEMPORARY
19 REGISTRATION PLATE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO OBTAINS A TEMPORARY
20 REGISTRATION UNDER SECTION 226B(2), UPON APPLICATION ACCOMPANIED BY
21 THE PROPER FEE, THAT IS VALID FOR A PERIOD OF NO MORE THAN 30 DAYS.

(3) (2) A temporary registration plate or marker shall show in
ink the date of issue, a description of the vehicle for which
issued, and any other information required by the secretary of
state. A dealer or person WHO ISSUES A TEMPORARY REGISTRATION PLATE
OR MARKER UNDER SUBSECTION (1) shall immediately notify the
secretary of state of each temporary registration plate or marker

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issued by the dealer or person, on a form prescribed by the
 secretary of state. Upon the attachment of the regular plate to a
 vehicle for which a temporary registration plate or marker has been
 issued, the temporary plate shall be destroyed.

5 (4) (3) All temporary registration plates or markers shall be
6 serially numbered and upon issuance the number shall be noted on
7 the statement of vehicle sale form or in the case of a boat trailer
8 on a form prescribed by the secretary of state.

9 (5) (4) A dealer or person, upon demand, shall immediately
10 surrender any temporary registration plates or markers in his or
11 her possession if the secretary of state finds, after
12 investigation, that the dealer or person has violated this section,
13 and the dealer or person shall immediately forfeit any right to the
14 temporary registration plates or markers.

(6) (5) The secretary of state may issue a registration plate upon application and payment of the proper fee to an individual, partnership, corporation, or association who in the ordinary course of business has occasion to legally repossess a vehicle in which a security interest is held. A registration plate issued pursuant to **UNDER** this subsection shall be used to move and dispose of a vehicle.

(7) (6) The secretary of state may issue a registration plate upon application and payment of the proper fee to an individual, partnership, corporation, or association who in the ordinary course of business has occasion to legally pick up or deliver a vehicle not required to be titled under this act, to legally pick up or deliver a commercial motor vehicle being driven to a facility to

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undergo aftermarket modification, or to repair or service a vehicle, or to persons defined as dealers under part 801 of the natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.80101 to 324.80199, for the purpose of delivering a vessel or trailer to a customer or to and from a boat show or exposition. A registration plate issued under this subsection shall be used to move the vehicle.

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(8) (7) The secretary of state may issue a registration plate 8 9 upon application and payment of the proper fee to an individual, 10 partnership, corporation, or association who in the ordinary course 11 of business operates an auto auction, and who in the ordinary 12 course of business has occasion to legally pick up a vehicle which 13 will be offered for sale at the auction, or deliver a vehicle which 14 has been offered for sale at the auction. The registration plate shall be used only to move vehicles as provided in this subsection. 15 16 Auto auctions that make application for a registration plate under 17 this subsection shall furnish a surety bond as required by the secretary of state. 18

19 Sec. 226b. (1) A-THE SECRETARY OF STATE MAY ISSUE A temporary 20 registration may be issued to an owner of a vehicle. The 21 registration shall be valid for either 30 days or 60 days from date 22 of issue, at the discretion of the owner, and shall be in a form as 23 determined by the secretary of state. A-THE SECRETARY OF STATE 24 SHALL COLLECT A fee shall be collected for each temporary 25 registration as provided in section 802.

26 (2) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ISSUE A TEMPORARY
27 REGISTRATION VALID FOR 30 DAYS FROM DATE OF ISSUE TO AN OWNER OF A

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VEHICLE IF THE VEHICLE INSURANCE REQUIRED UNDER THIS ACT FOR THAT
 VEHICLE HAS A TERM OF 30 DAYS.

3 (3) (2) A vehicle which THAT has a temporary registration
4 ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) shall not be used for the
5 transportation of passengers for hire or for the transportation of
6 goods, wares, or merchandise or draw other vehicles transporting
7 goods, wares, or merchandise.

8 Sec. 227. (1) Application for renewal of a vehicle
9 registration shall be made by the owner upon proper application and
10 by payment of the registration fee for the vehicle, as provided by
11 law.

12 (2) Every application shall be accompanied by the certificate 13 of title pertaining to the vehicle, showing ownership in the person 14 applying for registration at the time of the application. The 15 secretary of state may waive the presentation of the certificate of 16 title.

17 (3) Every application for renewal of a motor vehicle
18 registration shall be accompanied by proof of vehicle insurance
19 THAT HAS A TERM OF AT LEAST 30 DAYS in a form determined by the
20 secretary of state.

(4) Notwithstanding subsection (3), the secretary of state shall accept as proof of vehicle insurance a transmission of the applicant's vehicle policy information for an insured vehicle for which vehicle registration is sought. The secretary of state may determine in what format and on what timeline the secretary of state will receive vehicle policy information, which shall not be required more frequently than every 14 days. In determining the

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1 format under this subsection, the secretary of state shall consult 2 with insurers. The transmission to the secretary of state of the vehicle policy information is proof of insurance to the secretary 3 4 of state for motor vehicle registration purposes only and is not 5 evidence that a policy of insurance actually exists between an insurer and an individual. Vehicle policy information submitted by 6 an insurer and received by the secretary of state under this 7 subsection is confidential, is not subject to the freedom of 8 9 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246, and shall not 10 be disclosed to any person except the department of community 11 health for purposes of 2006 PA 593, MCL 550.281 to 550.289, or 12 under an order by a court of competent jurisdiction in connection 13 with a claim or fraud investigation or prosecution.

14 (5) (6) As used in this section, "policy information" means
15 the information an automobile insurer is required to supply to the
16 secretary of state under section 3101a of the insurance code of
17 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3101a.

18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days19 after the date it is enacted into law.
