THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- escapes from a facility or residence in which he or she has been placed, other than his or her own home or the home of his or her parent or guardian, the individual at that facility or residence responsible for maintaining custody of the public ward at the time of the escape shall immediately notify 1 of the following of the escape or cause 1 of the following to be immediately notified of
 - (a) If the escape occurs in a city, village, or township that has a police department, that police department.
 - (b) If subdivision (a) does not apply, 1 of the following:
