HOUSE BILL No. 5861

September 13, 2016, Introduced by Reps. Hughes and Crawford and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 653b (MCL 257.653b), as added by 2008 PA 464.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 653b. (1) Upon approaching and passing a stationary solid
- 2 waste collection vehicle, a utility service vehicle, or a road
- 3 maintenance vehicle that is giving a visual signal by means of
- 4 flashing, rotating, or oscillating amber lights as permitted by
- 5 section 698, the driver of an approaching vehicle shall reduce to
- 6 and maintain a safe speed for weather, road conditions, and
- 7 vehicular or pedestrian traffic and proceed with due care and
- 8 caution.
- 9 (2) UPON APPROACHING AND PASSING A STATIONARY SOLID WASTE
- 10 COLLECTION VEHICLE THAT IS GIVING A VISUAL SIGNAL BY MEANS OF

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- 1 FLASHING, ROTATING, OR OSCILLATING AMBER LIGHTS AS PERMITTED BY
- 2 SECTION 698, THE DRIVER OF AN APPROACHING VEHICLE SHALL EXHIBIT DUE
- 3 CARE AND CAUTION, AS REQUIRED UNDER THE FOLLOWING:
- 4 (A) ON ANY PUBLIC ROADWAY WITH AT LEAST 2 ADJACENT LANES
- 5 PROCEEDING IN THE SAME DIRECTION OF THE STATIONARY SOLID WASTE
- 6 COLLECTION VEHICLE, THE DRIVER OF THE APPROACHING VEHICLE SHALL
- 7 PROCEED WITH CAUTION AND YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY BY MOVING INTO A
- 8 LANE AT LEAST 1 MOVING LANE OR 2 VEHICLE WIDTHS APART FROM THE
- 9 STATIONARY SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLE, UNLESS DIRECTED
- 10 OTHERWISE BY A POLICE OFFICER. IF MOVEMENT TO AN ADJACENT LANE OR 2
- 11 VEHICLE WIDTHS APART IS NOT POSSIBLE DUE TO WEATHER, ROAD
- 12 CONDITIONS, OR THE IMMEDIATE PRESENCE OF VEHICULAR OR PEDESTRIAN
- 13 TRAFFIC IN PARALLEL MOVING LANES, THE DRIVER OF THE APPROACHING
- 14 VEHICLE SHALL PROCEED AS REQUIRED IN SUBDIVISION (B).
- 15 (B) ON ANY PUBLIC ROADWAY THAT DOES NOT HAVE AT LEAST 2
- 16 ADJACENT LANES PROCEEDING IN THE SAME DIRECTION AS THE STATIONARY
- 17 SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLE, OR IF THE MOVEMENT BY THE DRIVER OF
- 18 THE VEHICLE INTO AN ADJACENT LANE OR 2 VEHICLE WIDTHS APART IS NOT
- 19 POSSIBLE AS DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A), THE APPROACHING VEHICLE
- 20 SHALL REDUCE AND MAINTAIN A SAFE SPEED FOR WEATHER, ROAD
- 21 CONDITIONS, AND VEHICULAR OR PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AND PROCEED WITH
- 22 DUE CARE AND CAUTION, OR AS DIRECTED BY A POLICE OFFICER.
- 23 (3) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ As used in this section:
- 24 (a) "Road maintenance authority" means any of the following:
- 25 (i) The state **TRANSPORTATION** department. of transportation.
- 26 (ii) A local authority.
- 27 (iii) An entity operating under contract with the state

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- 1 TRANSPORTATION department of transportation or a local authority to
- 2 provide road construction or road maintenance services.
- 3 (b) "Road maintenance vehicle" means a vehicle owned or
- 4 operated by a road maintenance authority.
- 5 (c) "Solid waste" means that term as defined in section 11506
- 6 of the natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA
- **7** 451, MCL 324.11506.
- 8 (d) "Solid waste collection vehicle" means a solid waste
- 9 transporting unit that is used for the curbside collection of
- municipal solid waste.
- 11 (e) "Solid waste hauler" means that term as defined in section
- 12 11506 of the natural resources and environmental protection act,
- 13 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.11506.
- 14 (f) "Solid waste transporting unit" means that term as defined
- 15 in section 11506 of the natural resources and environmental
- 16 protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.11506.
- 17 (g) "Utility provider" means an entity that does any of the
- 18 following and that is regulated as a utility under the laws of this
- 19 state or of the United States:
- (i) Generates or distributes electrical power to the public.
- 21 (ii) Generates or distributes natural gas to the public.
- 22 (iii) Provides sewage collection services to the public.
- (iv) Provides water distribution services to the public.
- 24 (v) Provides telephone services to the public.
- 25 (vi) Provides cable or video services to the public.
- 26 (h) "Utility service vehicle" means a vehicle owned or
- 27 operated by a utility provider.

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- 1 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 2 after the date it is enacted into law.
