HOUSE BILL No. 6063

November 29, 2016, Introduced by Rep. Faris and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 5478b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 5478B. (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (A) STUDY ENVIRONMENTAL THREATS OF LEAD POISONING TO
- 3 CHILDREN'S HEALTH.
- 4 (B) REVIEW THE LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM ESTABLISHED
- 5 UNDER SECTION 5474 AND EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAM,
- 6 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE ABILITY OF THE PROGRAM TO
- 7 SATISFY FEDERAL LAW REQUIREMENTS THAT 100% OF ALL YOUNG CHILDREN
- 8 ENROLLED IN MEDICAID ARE SCREENED WITH A BLOOD LEAD TEST.
- 9 (C) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE LEAD
- 10 POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER SECTION 5474.
- 11 (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER ALL INFORMATION RECEIVED

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- 1 FROM ITS PUBLIC HEARINGS, REVIEW INFORMATION FROM OTHER SOURCES,
- 2 AND STUDY THE EXPERIENCES OF OTHER STATES. THE COMMISSION SHALL
- 3 DEVELOP SHORT- AND LONG-RANGE STRATEGIC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR
- 4 CHILDHOOD LEAD POISONING PREVENTION AND CONTROL IN THIS STATE. THE
- 5 RECOMMENDATIONS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, STRATEGIES
- 6 TO DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 7 (A) ENHANCE PUBLIC AND PROFESSIONAL AWARENESS OF LEAD
- 8 POISONING AS A CHILD HEALTH EMERGENCY.
- 9 (B) SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE BLOOD LEAD TESTING RATES FOR YOUNG
- 10 CHILDREN.
- 11 (C) ELIMINATE OR MANAGE THE SOURCES OF LEAD POISONING,
- 12 ESPECIALLY FOCUSING ON LEAD-BASED PAINT IN AGED HOUSING.
- 13 (D) ENSURE STATE INTERAGENCY AS WELL AS PUBLIC AND PRIVATE
- 14 COOPERATION AND COMMUNICATION REGARDING RESOLUTION OF THIS COMPLEX
- 15 ENVIRONMENTAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH PROBLEM.
- 16 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A WRITTEN REPORT OF ITS
- 17 FINDINGS, INCLUDING THE RECOMMENDATIONS UNDER SUBSECTION (2), TO
- 18 THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE BY MARCH 31, 2018 AND ANNUALLY
- 19 AFTER THAT BY MARCH 31 OF EACH YEAR. A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE
- 20 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES SHALL PROVIDE TESTIMONY
- 21 SUMMARIZING THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMISSION TO
- 22 THE STANDING COMMITTEES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
- 23 WITH JURISDICTION OVER ISSUES PERTAINING TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND
- 24 CHILDREN.
- 25 (4) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "COMMISSION" MEANS THE COMMISSION
- 26 ESTABLISHED AND APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 5478A.
- 27 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days

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- 1 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 2 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 3 unless Senate Bill No. ____ or House Bill No. 6064 (request no.
- 4 06622'16) of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.
