SENATE BILL No. 259

April 14, 2015, Introduced by Senators HERTEL, YOUNG, MARLEAU, KNEZEK, SMITH, BIEDA, GREGORY, JONES and SHIRKEY and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

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by amending section 1177 (MCL 380.1177), as amended by 2013 PA 121.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1177. (1) A child enrolling in a public or nonpublic school for the first time or , beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, enrolling in grade 7 for the first time shall submit 1 of the following:
 - (a) A statement signed by a physician that the child has been tested for and immunized or protected against diseases specified by the director of the department of community health.
 - (b) A statement signed by a parent or guardian to the effect that the child has not been immunized because of religious convictions or other objection to immunization.
 - (c) A statement signed by a physician that certifies that the

- 1 child is in the process of complying with all immunization

- 3 (2) In addition, the parent or guardian of each child
- 4 enrolling in kindergarten for the first time shall submit a
- 5 statement signed by a district, county, or city health department
- 6 director stating that the child has been administered the
- 7 department of community health preschool vision screening test, or
- 8 signed by a licensed medical or osteopathic physician or a licensed
- 9 optometrist stating that the child's eyes have been examined during
- 10 the preschool years after age 3 and before initial entrance. A
- 11 vision test is not required if there is a statement signed by a
- 12 parent or guardian to the effect that the child cannot be submitted
- 13 to the test because of religious convictions.
- 14 (3) Not later than November 1 of each year, the administrator
- 15 of each school shall provide the director of the department of
- 16 community health with the immunization status of each pupil in
- 17 grades K through 12 who enrolled in the school for the first time,
- 18 or , beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, enrolled in grade 7 in
- 19 the school for the first time, between the immediately preceding
- 20 January 1 and the immediately preceding September 30, as well as a
- 21 vision report of each child entering kindergarten during that time
- 22 period. THE INFORMATION CONCERNING IMMUNIZATION STATUS SHALL
- 23 SPECIFY IMMUNIZATION STATUS SEPARATELY FOR EACH OF THE
- 24 IMMUNIZATIONS SPECIFIED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 25 COMMUNITY HEALTH AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) (A). This
- 26 information shall be transmitted through the approved local full-
- 27 time health department, if available, and shall be on forms

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- 1 provided by the director of community health or otherwise reported
- 2 in a manner approved by the director of the department of community
- 3 health. Not later than February 1 of each year, the administrator
- 4 of each school shall provide an update to the report due the
- 5 previous November 1 to show the immunization status of each pupil
- 6 in grades K through 12 who enrolled in the school for the first
- 7 time, or , beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, enrolled in
- 8 grade 7 in the school for the first time, during the calendar year
- 9 ending the immediately preceding December 31. THE INFORMATION
- 10 CONCERNING IMMUNIZATION STATUS SHALL SPECIFY IMMUNIZATION STATUS
- 11 SEPARATELY FOR EACH OF THE IMMUNIZATIONS SPECIFIED BY THE DIRECTOR
- 12 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION
- 13 (1)(A). This information shall be transmitted in the same manner as
- 14 the report due the previous November 1.
- 15 (4) IN ADDITION TO THE REPORTING REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 16 (3), THE GOVERNING BODY OF A PUBLIC OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL
- 17 ENSURE THAT THE INFORMATION REPORTED UNDER SUBSECTION (3) IS POSTED
- 18 ON THE PUBLICLY AVAILABLE WEBSITE FOR THE SCHOOL OR, IF THE SCHOOL
- 19 DOES NOT HAVE A PUBLICLY AVAILABLE WEBSITE, IS POSTED IN ANOTHER
- 20 PUBLIC MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH.
- 21 (5) (4) The department of community health shall promulgate
- 22 rules, including rules identifying the diseases specified under
- 23 subsection (1)(a), for the implementation of this section.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 25 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 26 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 27 unless Senate Bill No. 260
