## **SENATE BILL No. 687**

January 13, 2016, Introduced by Senators ROCCA and BRANDENBURG and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 40, entitled
"The drain code of 1956,"
by amending sections 514, 517, and 521 (MCL 280.514, 280.517, and 280.521), section 514 as amended by 2006 PA 16.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 514. (1) A drainage board is created for each project

petitioned for under this chapter. SECTION 513. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), (4), the drainage board shall consist CONSISTS of the director of the department of agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT and the drain commissioner of each county involved in the project.

(2) The director of the department of agriculture shall be AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT IS the chairperson of the drainage board. The drainage board shall select 1 of its members as secretary.

- 1 (3) A MEMBER OF THE DRAINAGE BOARD SHALL SERVE AS SECRETARY.
- 2 THE SECRETARY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PERFORMING ALL ADMINISTRATIVE
- 3 DUTIES OF THE DRAINAGE BOARD. SUBJECT TO SECTION 521, THE SECRETARY
- 4 SHALL BE SELECTED BY THE DRAINAGE BOARD.
- 5 (4) (3) If EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (5), IF a project
- 6 involves a county with an appointed rather than an elected drain
- 7 commissioner and a population of more than 1,000,000, the drainage
- 8 board shall consist of the director of the department of
- 9 agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT, the drain commissioner of each
- 10 county involved in the project, and an individual appointed by each
- 11 drain commissioner of each county involved in the project,
- 12 including a county with an elected drain commissioner. The
- 13 appointee shall be an elected official, or his or her designee, of
- 14 a city, village, or township subject to assessment for the project.
- 15 The appointee shall serve for a 2-year term and shall not be
- 16 appointed for successive terms unless the city, village, or
- 17 township MUNICIPALITY that he or she represents is the only
- 18 municipality in the county subject to assessment. Following the
- 19 completion of the 2-year term, the drain commissioner shall, if
- 20 possible, appoint an elected official, or his or her designee, from
- 21 a different city, village, or township MUNICIPALITY subject to
- 22 assessment for the project. If an appointee fails or refuses to
- 23 serve or is disqualified, the drain commissioner shall appoint a
- 24 successor to complete the remainder of his or her term.
- 25 (5)  $\frac{(4)}{}$  Subsection  $\frac{(3)}{}$  (4) does not apply to a project that
- 26 involves a county with a population of more than 1,000,000 which
- 27 was THAT IS organized pursuant to 1973 PA 139, MCL 45.551 to

- 2 Sec. 517. (1) Upon receipt of a petition as hereinbefore
- 3 provided, UNDER SECTION 513, the director of agriculture AND RURAL
- 4 DEVELOPMENT shall make a preliminary finding of the counties which,
- 5 in his OR HER opinion, include public corporations that should be
- 6 assessed under the provisions of this chapter for the cost of the
- 7 proposed drain.
- 8 (2) Upon the making of such THE preliminary finding UNDER
- 9 SUBSECTION (1), the director of agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT
- 10 shall, give BY REGISTERED MAIL, SEND A COPY OF THE PRELIMINARY
- 11 FINDING AND notice of the time and place of the first meeting of
- 12 the drainage board and of the first meeting of the augmented
- 13 drainage board , by sending a copy of such notice and of such
- 14 preliminary finding by registered mail to each member thereof , and
- 15 to each highway agency having jurisdiction over any highway, road,
- 16 and OR street in said THE district. , which THE notice and finding
- 17 shall be mailed not less than 10 days prior to the time of the
- 18 meeting. In the event there be no IF A COUNTY DOES NOT HAVE A board
- 19 of county auditors or finance committee, in any county involved,
- 20 then notice to the chairman CHAIRPERSON of the COUNTY board of
- 21 supervisors of such COMMISSIONERS OF THE county shall be deemed
- 22 CONSIDERED to be notice to the member of the COUNTY board of
- 23 supervisors COMMISSIONERS to be selected by him. THE CHAIRPERSON AS
- 24 A MEMBER OF THE AUGMENTED DRAINAGE BOARD UNDER SECTION 515.
- 25 (3) The drainage board shall FIRST meet first, for the purpose
- 26 of selecting a secretary. Upon the selection of a secretary, the
- 27 director of agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT shall turn over to

- 1 such THAT secretary the original petition and any other records in
- 2 his OR HER office pertaining to the proposed drain. THE SECRETARY
- 3 SHALL SERVE UNTIL THE DRAINAGE BOARD APPROVES A FINAL ORDER OF
- 4 APPORTIONMENT UNDER SECTION 521.
- 5 Sec. 521. (1) After MAKING the tentative apportionments of
- 6 cost have been made, UNDER SECTION 520, the drainage board shall
- 7 set a time, date, and place it will meet and hear objections to the
- 8 apportionments. Notice IN EACH COUNTY INVOLVED, NOTICE of the
- 9 hearing shall be published twice in each county involved by
- 10 inserting the notice in at least 1 newspaper published in the
- 11 county AND designated by the drainage board. The first
- 12 publication is to MUST be not less than 20 days before the time of
- 13 hearing. The notice shall also be sent by registered mail to the
- 14 clerk or secretary of each public corporation proposed to be
- 15 assessed, except that a notice to the THIS state shall be sent to
- 16 the state highway director OF THE STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT
- 17 and a notice to a county shall be sent both to the county clerk and
- 18 the county road commission. The mailing shall be made not less than
- 19 20 days before the time of hearing. The notice shall be signed by
- 20 the secretary and proof of the publication and mailing of the
- 21 notice shall be filed with the secretary. The drainage board may
- 22 provide a form to be substantially followed in the giving of the
- 23 notice. The notice shall include tentative apportionments to the
- 24 several public corporations.
- 25 (2) After the hearing, the drainage board may confirm the
- 26 apportionments as tentatively made, or, if it considers the
- 27 apportionments to be inequitable, it shall readjust the

- 1 apportionments. Before readjusted apportionments are confirmed, the
- 2 drainage board shall set a time, date, and place for a rehearing
- 3 and shall give notice of the hearing IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN
- 4 SUBSECTION (1). The notice shall also set forth the apportionments
- 5 as readjusted. It shall then
- 6 (3) AFTER THE HEARING OR REHEARING, THE BOARD SHALL issue its
- 7 order setting forth the several apportionments as confirmed. The
- 8 order shall be known as the final order of apportionment.
- 9 (4) UPON ISSUANCE OF THE FINAL ORDER OF APPORTIONMENT AND EACH
- 10 YEAR THEREAFTER, THE DRAIN COMMISSIONER FOR THE COUNTY WITH THE
- 11 HIGHEST AGGREGATE APPORTIONMENTS MAY OPT TO BECOME THE SECRETARY OF
- 12 THE DRAINAGE BOARD. IF THAT DRAIN COMMISSIONER DECLINES TO SERVE AS
- 13 SECRETARY, THE DRAINAGE BOARD SHALL ELECT ANOTHER OF ITS MEMBERS TO
- 14 THAT POSITION.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 16 after the date it is enacted into law.
