SUBSTITUTE FOR

SENATE BILL NO. 1259

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 2001, 2045, 74116, and 78119 (MCL 324.2001, 324.2045, 324.74116, and 324.78119), section 2001 as amended by 2010 PA 32, sections 2045 and 78119 as amended by 2013 PA 81, and section 74116 as amended by 2016 PA 1.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

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Sec. 2001. As used in this part:

2 (a) "Forest recreation account" means the forest recreation
3 account of the legacy fund provided for in section 2005.

4 (b) "Game and fish protection account" means the game and fish5 protection account of the legacy fund provided for in section 2010.

6 (c) "Legacy fund" means the Michigan conservation and7 recreation legacy fund established in section 40 of article IX of

1 the state constitution of 1963 and provided for in section 2002.

2 (d) "Off-road vehicle account" means the off-road vehicle3 account of the legacy fund provided for in section 2015.

4 (e) "Recreation improvement account" means the recreation
5 improvement account of the legacy fund provided for in section
6 2020.

7 (f) "Recreation passport fee" means a state park and state8 operated public boating access site recreation passport fee paid
9 under section 805 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
10 257.805, or under rules promulgated under section 74120(2).

(g) "Snowmobile account" means the snowmobile account of thelegacy fund provided for in section 2025.

13 (h) "State park improvement account" means the state park
14 improvement account of the legacy fund provided for in section
15 2030.

16 (i) "Waterways account" means the waterways account of the17 legacy fund provided for in section 2035.

18 Sec. 2045. (1) The department shall distribute recreation19 passport fee revenue as follows:

(a) First, for necessary expenses incurred by the secretary of
state each state fiscal year in administration and implementation
of section 805 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
257.805. Funds appropriated for necessary expenses shall be based
upon an established cost allocation methodology that reflects
actual costs. Appropriations under this subdivision in a state
fiscal year shall not exceed \$1,000,000.00.

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(b) The next \$10,700,000.00 received each fiscal year shall be

1 deposited in the state park improvement account.

2 (c) The next \$1,030,000.00 received each fiscal year shall be3 deposited in the waterways account.

4 (d) The remaining revenue shall be deposited as follows:

5 (i) 50%-75% in the state park improvement account to be used
6 for capital improvements, at state parks, including state
7 recreation areas.

8 (ii) 30% in the state park improvement account to be used for
9 operations, and maintenance at state parks, including state
10 recreation areas.

(ii) (iii) -2.75% in the state park improvement account to be
used for operations, maintenance, and capital improvements of state
park cultural and historic resources.

14 (iii) (iv) 0.25% in the state park improvement account to be
15 used to do all of the following:

16 (A) Promote, in concert with other state agencies, the use of 17 state parks, state-operated public boating access sites, state 18 forest campgrounds, and state forest nonmotorized trails and 19 pathways.

(B) Promote the use of the internet for state park camping
reservations and for payment of the recreation passport fee in
conjunction with motor vehicle registration.

(iv) (v) 10% 15% in the local public recreation facilities
fund created in section 1911, to be used for development of public
recreation facilities for local units of government.

26 (v) (vi) 7% in the forest recreation account to be used for 27 operating, maintaining, and making capital improvements to state

forest campgrounds and the state forest system of pathways and
 nonmotorized trails, including, but not limited to, equestrian
 trails.

4 (2) For each state fiscal year, beginning with the 2011-2012 5 state fiscal year, the state treasurer shall adjust the amounts set forth in subsection (1)(b) and (c) by an amount determined by the 6 state treasurer to reflect the cumulative percentage change in the 7 consumer price index CONSUMER PRICE INDEX for the most recent 1-8 9 year period for which data are available. As used in this subsection, "consumer price index" "CONSUMER PRICE INDEX" means the 10 11 most comprehensive index of consumer prices available for this 12 state from the bureau of labor statistics BUREAU OF LABOR 13 STATISTICS of the United States department of labor.DEPARTMENT OF LABOR. 14

15 (3) By January 15 of each year, the department, in consultation with the department of state, shall estimate the 16 amount of additional RECREATION PASSPORT FEE revenue that would 17 18 have been collected as recreation passport fees during the 19 immediately preceding state fiscal year if owners of resident motor 20 vehicles described in sections 74116(4)(c) and 78119(4)(b) were not 21 exempt under those provisions from paying the recreation passport 22 fee. The department shall estimate the amount as follows:

(a) Determine the total number of resident motor vehicles
described in sections 74116(4)(c) and 78119(4)(b).

(b) Multiply the number under subdivision (a) by the
percentage of resident motor vehicles with single-year
registrations for which a recreation passport fee was paid during

1 the preceding state fiscal year.

2 (c) Subtract from the result under subdivision (b) the number
3 of resident motor vehicles described in sections 74116(4)(c) and
4 78119(4)(b) for which a recreation passport fee was paid during the
5 preceding state fiscal year under rules promulgated under section
6 74120(3).

7 (d) Multiply the result under subdivision (c) by the current
8 amount of the recreation passport fee during the preceding state
9 fiscal year.

(4) The legislature shall annually appropriate from the
general fund a sum equal to the amount estimated under subsection
(3). The sum appropriated shall be distributed as provided in
subsection (1)(d).

14 (5) The department shall submit a report to the standing 15 committees and appropriations subcommittees of the legislature with 16 jurisdiction over issues pertaining to natural resources and the 17 environment by February 1 each year. The report shall provide 18 information on all of the following for the preceding state fiscal 19 year:

20 (a) The total amount of recreation passport fee revenue
21 received by the department and the amounts allocated under
22 subsection (1).

(b) The total amount of annual and daily state park motor
vehicle permit fee revenue received by the department under section
74117.

26 (c) The total amount of seasonal or daily state-operated27 public boating access site revenue received by the department under

1 section 78105(3).

2 (d) Details on the specific uses of the revenue described in
3 subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) and the amounts expended for each
4 specific use.

5 (e) The amount of revenue received during the preceding state6 fiscal year under subsection (4).

7 (f) The adequacy of the revenue described in subdivisions (a)
8 and (e) for each of the purposes for which it is allocated under
9 subsection (1).

(g) The impact of the state park revenue stream described in
subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) on the Michigan state parks
endowment fund created in section 35a of article IX of the state
constitution of 1963 and provided for in section 74119.

14 (h) Other relevant issues that affect funding needs for the15 state park system.

(6) By February 1, 2012 and every 2 years thereafter, the 16 17 department shall submit a report to the standing committees and appropriations subcommittees of the legislature with jurisdiction 18 19 over issues pertaining to natural resources and the environment. 20 The report shall provide information on how frequently motor 21 vehicles for which the registrant declined to pay the recreation 22 passport fee entered state parks and state-operated public boating 23 access sites designated under section 78105 during the registration 24 period. The information shall be based on random audits conducted 25 by the department. A report under this subsection may be combined 26 with a report required under subsection (5).

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(7) The department may prepare a list of frequently asked

questions and answers concerning the recreation passport fee. The department and the department of state may post the information on their websites. The department of state may provide the information with any applications for registration of motor vehicles that are mailed by the department of state.

6 Sec. 74116. (1) Subject to subsection (4), the operator of a nonresident motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle shall not 7 enter any state park with that motor vehicle unless a valid motor 8 9 vehicle park permit issued under section 74117 is affixed to the lower right-hand corner of the windshield. An annual motor vehicle 10 11 park permit for a nonresident motor vehicle shall be affixed 12 permanently for that year. The department shall post signs at parks 13 that state that a motor vehicle park permit is required for entry 14 by a nonresident motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle.

(2) Subject to subsection (4), the operator of a resident motor vehicle shall not enter a state park with the resident motor vehicle unless the recreation passport fee has been paid for that motor vehicle. Payment of the recreation passport fee authorizes entry into all state parks and recreation areas and designated state-operated public boating access sites until expiration of the motor vehicle registration.

(3) Subject to subsection (4), if the secretary of state
issues registration tabs or stickers as described in section 805 of
the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.805, the operator
of a resident motor vehicle shall not enter a state park with the
resident motor vehicle unless the resident motor vehicle has a
registration tab or sticker marked as provided under that section

to show that the recreation passport fee has been paid FOR THAT
 MOTOR VEHICLE.

3 (4) Subsections (1) to (3) do not apply under any of the4 following circumstances:

5 (a) While the motor vehicle is being driven or parked within
6 an established federal - OR state - or county highway OR COUNTY
7 ROAD within a state park.

8 (b) If the motor vehicle is used in the operation or
9 maintenance of a state park, is an emergency motor vehicle, is a
10 state owned or law enforcement motor vehicle, or is a private motor
11 vehicle being operated on official state business.

(c) If the motor vehicle is registered under section 803e(1)
of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.803e, and is
exempt under section 803e(6) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
300, MCL 257.803e, from the registration tax, or if the motor
vehicle is registered under AS DESCRIBED IN section 217d or 803f of
the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.217d and 257.803f.

(d) At a state-operated public boating access site or a state park where there is an opportunity to fish on a day that the department has designated as a free winter fishing day or a free fishing day under section 43534.

(e) If and to the extent that the department waives the
requirements for department-sponsored events or other circumstances
as determined by the director or the director's designee.

25 Sec. 78119. (1) Subject to subsection (4), a person shall not
26 enter, in a nonresident motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle,
27 a state-operated public boating access site designated under

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section 78105(2) without a valid pass affixed to the lower right hand corner of the windshield. A seasonal pass shall be affixed
 permanently for the season.

4 (2) Subject to subsection (4), the operator of a resident 5 motor vehicle shall not enter a state-operated public boating access site designated under section 78105(2) with the resident 6 motor vehicle unless the recreation passport fee has been paid for 7 that motor vehicle. Payment of the recreation passport fee 8 9 authorizes entry into all state parks and recreation areas and 10 designated state-operated public boating access sites until 11 expiration of the motor vehicle registration.

12 (3) Subject to subsection (4), if the secretary of state issues registration tabs or stickers as described in section 805 of 13 14 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.805, the operator of a resident motor vehicle shall not enter a designated state-15 operated public boating access site with the resident motor vehicle 16 17 unless the resident motor vehicle has a registration tab or sticker marked as provided under that section to show that the recreation 18 19 passport fee has been paid FOR THAT MOTOR VEHICLE.

20 (4) Subsections (1) to (3) do not apply under any of the21 following circumstances:

(a) If the motor vehicle is used in the operation or
maintenance of the public boating access site, is an emergency
motor vehicle, is a state-owned or law enforcement motor vehicle,
or is a private motor vehicle being operated on official state
business.

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(b) If the motor vehicle is registered under section 803e(1)

of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.803e, and is
 exempt under section 803e(6) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
 300, MCL 257.803e, from the registration tax, or if the motor
 vehicle is registered under AS DESCRIBED IN section 217d or 803f of
 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.217d and 257.803f.

6 (c) If and to the extent the department waives the
7 requirements for department-sponsored events or other circumstances
8 as determined by the director or the director's designee.

9 (5) A person who violates subsection (1), (2), or (3) is
10 responsible for a state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay
11 a civil fine of not more than \$100.00. A person shall not be cited
12 for a violation of both subsections (2) and (3) for the same
13 incident.

14 (6) In any proceeding for the violation of this part or a rule 15 promulgated under this part, if a motor vehicle is found parked in 16 a designated state-operated public boating access site, the 17 registration plate displayed on the motor vehicle constitutes prima 18 facie evidence that the owner of the motor vehicle was the person 19 who parked or placed it at the location where it was found.

20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect February21 19, 2019.

22 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
23 unless Senate Bill No. 1258 of the 99th Legislature is enacted into
24 law.
