HOUSE BILL NO. 5683

March 17, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Kuppa, Elder, Tyrone Carter, Haadsma, Peterson, Cambensy, Hammoud, Kennedy, Cynthia Johnson, Garza, Shannon, Stone, Pohutsky, Sowerby, Koleszar, Bolden, Hoadley, Hood, Ellison, Brixie, Hertel, Sabo, Chirkun, Cherry, Warren, Lasinski, Rabhi, Tate and Anthony and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

by amending section 18 (MCL 388.1618), as amended by 2019 PA 58.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1

Sec. 18. (1) Except as provided in another section of this 2 article, each district or other entity shall apply the money received by the district or entity under this article to salaries 3 and other compensation of teachers and other employees, tuition, 4





transportation, lighting, heating, ventilation, water service, the 1 purchase of textbooks, other supplies, and any other school 2 operating expenditures defined in section 7. However, not more than 3 20% of the total amount received by a district under sections 22a 4 and 22b or received by an intermediate district under section 81 5 6 may be transferred by the board to either the capital projects fund 7 or to the debt retirement fund for debt service. A district or 8 other entity shall not apply or take the money for a purpose other 9 than as provided in this section. The department shall determine 10 the reasonableness of expenditures and may withhold from a 11 recipient of funds under this article the apportionment otherwise 12 due upon a violation by the recipient.

13 (2) A district or intermediate district shall adopt an annual 14 budget in a manner that complies with the uniform budgeting and 15 accounting act, 1968 PA 2, MCL 141.421 to 141.440a. Within 15 days 16 after a district board adopts its annual operating budget for the following school fiscal year, or after a district board adopts a 17 18 subsequent revision to that budget, the district shall make all of the following available through a link on its website homepage, or 19 20 may make the information available through a link on its intermediate district's website homepage, in a form and manner 21 22 prescribed by the department:

23 (a) The annual operating budget and subsequent budget24 revisions.

(b) Using data that have already been collected and submitted to the department, a summary of district expenditures for the most recent fiscal year for which they are available, expressed in the following 2 visual displays:

(i) A chart of personnel expenditures, broken into the

2 (A) Salaries and wages.

3 (B) Employee benefit costs, including, but not limited to,
4 medical, dental, vision, life, disability, and long-term care
5 benefits.

6 (C) Retirement benefit costs.

(D) All other personnel costs.

8 (ii) A chart of all district expenditures, broken into the9 following subcategories:

10 (A) Instruction.

11 (B) Support services.

12 (C) Business and administration.

13 (D) Operations and maintenance.

14 (c) Links to all of the following:

15 (i) The current collective bargaining agreement for each16 bargaining unit.

17 (*ii*) Each health care benefits plan, including, but not limited
18 to, medical, dental, vision, disability, long-term care, or any
19 other type of benefits that would constitute health care services,
20 offered to any bargaining unit or employee in the district.

(*iii*) Each contract entered into between the district and an
educational management organization, as applicable. As used in this
subparagraph, "educational management organization" means that term
as defined in section 503c, 523c, or 553c of the revised school
code, MCL 380.503c, 380.523c, or 380.553c.

26 (*iv*) (*iii*) The audit report of the audit conducted under
27 subsection (4) for the most recent fiscal year for which it is
28 available.

(v) (iv) The bids required under section 5 of the public

(vi) (v)—The district's written policy governing procurement of
supplies, materials, and equipment.

4 (vii) (vi) The district's written policy establishing specific
5 categories of reimbursable expenses, as described in section
6 1254(2) of the revised school code, MCL 380.1254.

7 (viii) (vii) Either the district's accounts payable check
8 register for the most recent school fiscal year or a statement of
9 the total amount of expenses incurred by board members or employees
10 of the district that were reimbursed by the district for the most
11 recent school fiscal year.

(d) The total salary and a description and cost of each fringe benefit included in the compensation package for the superintendent of the district and for each employee of the district whose salary exceeds \$100,000.00.

16 (e) The annual amount spent on dues paid to associations.
17 (f) The annual amount spent on lobbying or lobbying services.
18 As used in this subdivision, "lobbying" means that term as defined
19 in section 5 of 1978 PA 472, MCL 4.415.

(g) Any deficit elimination plan or enhanced deficit
elimination plan the district was required to submit under the
revised school code.

(h) Identification of all credit cards maintained by the district as district credit cards, the identity of all individuals authorized to use each of those credit cards, the credit limit on each credit card, and the dollar limit, if any, for each individual's authorized use of the credit card.

(i) Costs incurred for each instance of out-of-state travel bythe school administrator of the district that is fully or partially

paid for by the district and the details of each of those instances
 of out-of-state travel, including at least identification of each
 individual on the trip, destination, and purpose.

4 (3) For the information required under subsection (2)(a),
5 (2)(b)(i), and (2)(c), an intermediate district shall provide the
6 same information in the same manner as required for a district
7 under subsection (2).

8 (4) For the purposes of determining the reasonableness of
9 expenditures, whether a district or intermediate district has
10 received the proper amount of funds under this article, and whether
11 a violation of this article has occurred, all of the following
12 apply:

13 (a) The department shall require that each district and 14 intermediate district have an audit of the district's or 15 intermediate district's financial and pupil accounting records 16 conducted at least annually, and at such other times as determined 17 by the department, at the expense of the district or intermediate 18 district, as applicable. The audits must be performed by a 19 certified public accountant or by the intermediate district 20 superintendent, as may be required by the department, or in the 21 case of a district of the first class by a certified public 22 accountant, the intermediate superintendent, or the auditor general 23 of the city. A district or intermediate district shall retain these records for the current fiscal year and from at least the 3 24 25 immediately preceding fiscal years.

(b) If a district operates in a single building with fewer
than 700 full-time equated pupils, if the district has stable
membership, and if the error rate of the immediately preceding 2
pupil accounting field audits of the district is less than 2%, the

district may have a pupil accounting field audit conducted
biennially but must continue to have desk audits for each pupil
count. The auditor must document compliance with the audit cycle in
the pupil auditing manual. As used in this subdivision, "stable
membership" means that the district's membership for the current
fiscal year varies from the district's membership for the
immediately preceding fiscal year by less than 5%.

8 (c) A district's or intermediate district's annual financial
9 audit must include an analysis of the financial and pupil
10 accounting data used as the basis for distribution of state school
11 aid.

(d) The pupil and financial accounting records and reports,
audits, and management letters are subject to requirements
established in the auditing and accounting manuals approved and
published by the department.

16 (e) All of the following shall must be done not later than
17 November 1 each year for reporting the prior fiscal year data:
18 (i) A district shall file the annual financial audit reports

19 with the intermediate district and the department.

20 (*ii*) The intermediate district shall file the annual financial21 audit reports for the intermediate district with the department.

(iii) The intermediate district shall enter the pupil membership audit reports for its constituent districts and for the intermediate district, for the pupil membership count day and supplemental count day, in the Michigan student data system.

(f) The annual financial audit reports and pupil accounting
procedures reports must be available to the public in compliance
with the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to
15.246.

(g) Not later than January 31 of each year, the department
 shall notify the state budget director and the legislative
 appropriations subcommittees responsible for review of the school
 aid budget of districts and intermediate districts that have not
 filed an annual financial audit and pupil accounting procedures
 report required under this section for the school year ending in
 the immediately preceding fiscal year.

8 (5) By November 1 each fiscal year, each district and 9 intermediate district shall submit to the center, in a manner 10 prescribed by the center, annual comprehensive financial data 11 consistent with the district's or intermediate district's audited financial statements and consistent with accounting manuals and 12 13 charts of accounts approved and published by the department. For an 14 intermediate district, the report must also contain the website 15 address where the department can access the report required under 16 section 620 of the revised school code, MCL 380.620. The department shall ensure that the prescribed Michigan public school accounting 17 18 manual chart of accounts includes standard conventions to 19 distinguish expenditures by allowable fund function and object. The 20 functions must include at minimum categories for instruction, pupil support, instructional staff support, general administration, 21 22 school administration, business administration, transportation, 23 facilities operation and maintenance, facilities acquisition, and 24 debt service; and must include object classifications of salary, 25 benefits, including categories for active employee health expenditures, purchased services, supplies, capital outlay, and 26 other. A district shall report the required level of detail 27 28 consistent with the manual as part of the comprehensive annual 29 financial report.

(6) By September 30 of each year, each district and
 intermediate district shall file with the center the special
 education actual cost report, known as "SE-4096", on a form and in
 the manner prescribed by the center. An intermediate district shall
 certify the audit of a district's report.

6 (7) By October 7 of each year, each district and intermediate
7 district shall file with the center the audited transportation
8 expenditure report, known as "SE-4094", on a form and in the manner
9 prescribed by the center. An intermediate district shall certify
10 the audit of a district's report.

11 (8) The department shall review its pupil accounting and pupil
12 auditing manuals at least annually and shall periodically update
13 those manuals to reflect changes in this article.

14 (9) If a district that is a public school academy purchases 15 property using money received under this article, the public school 16 academy shall retain retains ownership of the property unless the 17 public school academy sells the property at fair market value.

(10) If a district or intermediate district does not comply 18 with subsections (4), (5), (6), (7), and (12), or if the department 19 20 determines that the financial data required under subsection (5) are not consistent with audited financial statements, the 21 department shall withhold all state school aid due to the district 22 23 or intermediate district under this article, beginning with the 24 next payment due to the district or intermediate district, until 25 the district or intermediate district complies with subsections (4), (5), (6), (7), and (12). If the district or intermediate 26 27 district does not comply with subsections (4), (5), (6), (7), and (12) by the end of the fiscal year, the district or intermediate 28 district forfeits the amount withheld. 29



(11) If a district or intermediate district does not comply 1 with subsection (2), the department may withhold up to 10% of the 2 total state school aid due to the district or intermediate district 3 under this article, beginning with the next payment due to the 4 district or intermediate district, until the district or 5 6 intermediate district complies with subsection (2). If the district 7 or intermediate district does not comply with subsection (2) by the 8 end of the fiscal year, the district or intermediate district 9 forfeits the amount withheld.

10 (12) By November 1 of each year, if a district or intermediate 11 district offers virtual learning under section 21f, or for a school of excellence that is a cyber school, as defined in section 551 of 12 the revised school code, MCL 380.551, the district or intermediate 13 14 district shall submit to the department a report that details the 15 per-pupil costs of operating the virtual learning by vendor type and virtual learning model. The report must include information 16 concerning the operation of virtual learning for the immediately 17 18 preceding school fiscal year, including information concerning 19 summer programming. Information must be collected in a form and 20 manner determined by the department and must be collected in the 21 most efficient manner possible to reduce the administrative burden 22 on reporting entities.

(13) By March 31 of each year, the department shall submit to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on state school aid, the state budget director, and the house and senate fiscal agencies a report summarizing the per-pupil costs by vendor type of virtual courses available under section 21f and virtual courses provided by a school of excellence that is a cyber school, as defined in section 551 of the revised school code, MCL 380.551.

1 (14) As used in subsections (12) and (13), "vendor type" means 2 the following:

3 (a) Virtual courses provided by the Michigan Virtual4 University.

5 (b) Virtual courses provided by a school of excellence that is
6 a cyber school, as defined in section 551 of the revised school
7 code, MCL 380.551.

8 (c) Virtual courses provided by third party vendors not9 affiliated with a Michigan public school.

10 (d) Virtual courses created and offered by a district or 11 intermediate district.

12 (15) An allocation to a district or another entity under this 13 article is contingent upon the district's or entity's compliance 14 with this section.
