A resolution to declare June 2020 as Alzheimer's Awareness
 Month in the state of Michigan.

Whereas, Alzheimer's disease, a progressive neurodegenerative
brain disorder, tragically robs individuals of their memories and
leads to progressive mental and physical impairments; and
Whereas, There are no known treatments to prevent, cure, or
even delay the onset or slow the progression of Alzheimer's
disease; and

Whereas, An estimated 5.6 million people aged 65 and over have
 Alzheimer's disease and another 200,000 people under age 65 have
 younger-onset Alzheimer's disease; and

Whereas, In Michigan, there are an estimated 190,000 people
aged 65 and over currently living with Alzheimer's; and

7 Whereas, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of
8 death in the United States and the fifth leading cause among the
9 elderly; and

10 Whereas, According to the Alzheimer's Association's Facts and 11 Figures report, the direct costs of caring for those with Alzheimer's to American society is valued at \$290 billion and more 12 than 16 million caregivers provided over 18 billion hours of unpaid 13 14 care for those with Alzheimer's and other dementias last year. In 15 Michigan, 517,000 family members and friends cared for people with Alzheimer's and other dementias, providing 589 million hours of 16 unpaid care, with the annual value of this caregiving totaling 17 18 \$7,444,000,000; and

19 Whereas, The state of Michigan recognizes the efforts of the 20 Alzheimer's Association to raise funds and promote awareness to 21 fight Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, thereby improving 22 the quality of human life for those living with Alzheimer's disease 23 and their caregivers; and

24 Whereas, The month of June 2020 has been declared Alzheimer's 25 Awareness Month to help spread awareness and educate the public on 26 this debilitating disease and the need to increase efforts to 27 combat its human and economic costs; now, therefore, be it 28 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of

29 this legislative body declare June 2020 as Alzheimer's Awareness

Month in the state of Michigan.
