PART 2

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

28 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
29 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under



1 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021 is \$0.00 and
2 total state spending from state sources to be paid to local units
3 of government is \$0.00.

4 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
5 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,
6 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made
7 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget
8 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

9 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under
10 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount
11 appropriated under this act, the legislature may, by a concurrent
12 resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and
13 serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within this act for the
14 particular department, board, commission, office, or institution.

15 Sec. 204. Funds appropriated in part 1 are subject to
16 applicable federal audit and reporting requirements. Prompt action
17 shall be taken if instances of noncompliance are identified,
18 including noncompliance identified in an audit finding. If any
19 instance of noncompliance is identified, including noncompliance
20 identified in an audit finding, the state budget director shall
21 take necessary and immediate action to rectify it. The state budget
22 director shall notify the senate and house appropriations
23 committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies when an
24 instance of noncompliance is identified.

25 Sec. 205. The state budget director shall report on the status
26 of funds appropriated in part 1, and all funds appropriated related
27 to the coronavirus relief effort, to the senate and house
28 appropriations committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies
29 on a monthly basis until all funds are exhausted.



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2 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

3 Sec. 301. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
 4 federal COVID epidemiology and laboratory capacity grant, not more
 5 than \$20,000,000.00 may be allocated for Michigan department of
 6 corrections testing.

7 (2) From the funds appropriated in Part 1 for federal COVID
 8 epidemiology and laboratory capacity grant, not less than \$100.00
 9 shall be allocated to schools to provide testing, or other
 10 qualifying services, equipment, or materials, so that students can
 11 participate in qualified sporting events.

12 (3)As used in this section:

13 (a) "Qualified sporting event" means 1 or more of the
 14 following:

15 (i) A sporting event carried on between 2 or more schools.

16 (ii) A collegiate sporting event sanctioned by a nationally
 17 recognized body.

18 (iii) A sporting event recognized by a local organization that
 19 is engaged in the development and active promotion of an athletic
 20 activity.

21 (iv) A practice held to prepare for a sporting event described
 22 in subparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii).

23 (c) "School" means a public school or nonpublic school as
 24 those terms are defined in section 5 of the revised school code,
 25 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.

26 Sec. 302. The funds appropriated in part 1 for federal COVID
 27 immunization and vaccine grant shall not be used to vaccinate an
 28 individual for the COVID-19 virus under a mandatory vaccination
 29 program of his or her employer or of state government.



1 Sec. 303. A recipient of a COVID-19 vaccine administered from
2 the funds appropriated in part 1 for federal COVID immunization and
3 vaccine grant shall be provided with information or informed if and
4 in what manner the development of the vaccine utilized aborted
5 fetal tissue or human embryonic stem cell derivation lines.

6 Sec. 304. (1) The department of health and human services
7 shall report on a weekly basis to the senate and house
8 appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
9 the senate and house policy offices, and the state budget office on
10 all of the following:

11 (a) The metrics used for calculating vaccine distribution to
12 local health departments and enrolled providers and an analysis by
13 county that shows how allocations were calculated.

14 (b) The number of vaccines distributed during the previous
15 week to each local health department and enrolled provider. The
16 number of vaccines distributed under this subdivision must be
17 listed for each local health department and for each enrolled
18 provider.

19 (c) The estimated number of vaccines to be distributed during
20 the current week to each local health department and enrolled
21 provider. The estimated number of vaccines to be distributed under
22 this subdivision must be listed for each local health department
23 and for each enrolled provider.

24 (d) The estimated number of vaccines to be distributed next
25 week to each local health department and enrolled provider. The
26 estimated number of vaccines to be distributed under this
27 subdivision must be listed for each local health department and for
28 each enrolled provider.

29 (e) The number and estimated percentage of individuals



1 vaccinated, categorized by each vaccination phase.

2 (f) The number and estimated percentage of individuals
3 residing or working in nursing homes that have been vaccinated.

4 (g) The number and estimated percentage of individuals 65
5 years of age and older that have been vaccinated.

6 (h) The total amount that has been expended from the funds
7 appropriated in part 1 for federal COVID immunization and vaccine
8 distribution and administration. The amount described in this
9 subdivision shall be broken down by state general funds and federal
10 funds.

11 (2) The reports required by this section must be made
12 accessible to the public by placing the reports on an internet
13 site.

14 Sec. 305. By March 1, 2021, the department of health and human
15 services shall report to the senate and house appropriations
16 committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and
17 house policy offices, and the state budget office on an analysis on
18 efficiencies of primary care physicians and independent pharmacists
19 being more involved in the distribution process.

20 Sec. 306. The Michigan vaccination phase 1b shall have not
21 more than 2 priority groups in order to ensure efficiency,
22 effectiveness, and equity of the vaccine implementation schedule.

23 Sec. 307. (1) By March 1, 2021, the department of health and
24 human services shall report to the senate and house appropriations
25 committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and
26 house policy offices, and the state budget office on the formula,
27 or other detailed methodology, used to distribute vaccines to each
28 local health department and each enrolled provider. The report must
29 also include an example of how the formula, or other detailed



1 methodology, would distribute a statewide total of 100,000 vaccines
2 to each local health department and each enrolled provider.

3 (2) Within 1 business day of any changes made by the
4 department of health and human services to the formula, or other
5 detailed methodology, used to distribute vaccines to each local
6 health department and each enrolled provider, the department of
7 health and human services shall report to the senate and house
8 appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
9 the senate and house policy offices, and the state budget office on
10 the changes made to the formula, or other detailed methodology,
11 used to distribute vaccines to each local health department and
12 each enrolled provider, the rationale for the change to the
13 formula, or other detailed methodology, used to distribute vaccines
14 to each local health department and each enrolled provider, and an
15 example of how the revised formula, or other detailed methodology,
16 would distribute a statewide total of 100,000 vaccines to each
17 local health department and each enrolled provider.

18 (3) By March 1, 2021, the department of health and human
19 services shall report to the senate and house appropriations
20 committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and
21 house policy offices, and the state budget office on the advantages
22 and disadvantages of incorporating a specific minimum, or baseline,
23 number of vaccines to be distributed on a weekly basis for each
24 specific local health department and enrolled provider.

25 (4) The reports required by this section must be made
26 accessible to the public by placing the reports on an internet
27 site.

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29 **DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY**



1 Sec. 401. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
 2 emergency rental and utility assistance, the department of labor
 3 and economic opportunity shall collaborate with the department of
 4 health and human services, the judiciary, local community action
 5 agencies, local nonprofit agencies, and legal aid organizations to
 6 create a rental and utility assistance program.

7 (2) Not more than \$4,000,000.00 shall be distributed in grants
 8 to legal aid organizations for legal services provided as part of
 9 the program.

10 (3) Not more than \$4,000,000.00 shall be distributed to local
 11 community action agencies for program case management staff and
 12 related costs.

13 (4) Not more than \$2,000,000.00 shall be allocated to the
 14 department of labor and economic opportunity for administrative
 15 costs and to support a public awareness campaign.

16 (5) Remaining funds appropriated under this section shall be
 17 used to pay for rent arrearages, utility arrearages, and rent
 18 subsidies to minimize evictions due to economic hardship due to
 19 COVID-19 in a rental and utility assistance program that does all
 20 of the following:

21 (a) Offers voluntary participation on the part of landlords.

22 (b) Works within the procedures created by the Michigan
 23 supreme court and state court administrative office to assist in
 24 preventing evictions.

25 (c) Creates a structured payment program for COVID-19 rent
 26 debt under which landlords would agree to all the following:

27 (i) To receive partial payment in exchange for direct payment.

28 (ii) Not to evict a resident who is successfully making
 29 payments under the payment plan.



1 (iii) To waive fees and penalties.

2 (iv) Not to initiate any action that would affect the credit
3 report of the renter or to pursue collections for the period
4 covered under the payment program.

5 (6) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for emergency
6 rental and utility assistance are designated as a work project
7 appropriation. Any unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse
8 at the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for
9 expenditures for projects under this section until the projects
10 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section
11 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
12 18.1451a:

13 (a) The purpose of the work project is to create an emergency
14 rental and utility assistance program, which includes rental and
15 utility assistance payments, housing stability services, and case
16 management to eligible renter households impacted by COVID-19.

17 (b) The projects will be accomplished by utilizing state
18 employees or by contracts.

19 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is
20 \$165,226,700.00.

21 (d) The tentative completion date is March 31, 2022.
