

# HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 321

Rep. Carra offered the following resolution:

1           A resolution to declare January 6, 2022, as Remembrance Day in  
2 the state of Michigan.

3           Whereas, The erosion of our constitutional republic has been  
4 drastic in the past two years culminating on January 6th, 2021; and

5           Whereas, A man-made virus outbreak ravaged humanity around the  
6 globe; and

7           Whereas, Racism was on life support until it was revived by  
8 the Marxist Black Lives Matter movement that burned down cities  
9 around our nation; and

10          Whereas, Unconstitutional mandates, government intrusion, and  
11 power grabs by political elitists subverted freedom and replaced  
12 familial and faith-based guidance with mandated obedience to a

1 secular government; and

2       Whereas, Parents were intimidated and prevented from  
3 participating in their children's education as critical race  
4 theory, sexual perversion, and social justice indoctrination  
5 infiltrated our public schools; and

6       Whereas, The people of Michigan are growing intolerant with a  
7 scheme that redistributes wealth from the working class in our  
8 country (and other countries-frequently with minorities working for  
9 inhumane wages) to the politically connected and able-bodied people  
10 through corporate and individual welfare; and

11       Whereas, The FBI was found responsible for orchestrating and  
12 entrapping individuals in a plot to kidnap the Governor of  
13 Michigan; and

14       Whereas, The FBI improperly raided gubernatorial candidate  
15 Ryan Kelley's house over 500 days after January 6th on misdemeanor  
16 charges; and

17       Whereas, Congresswoman Maxine Waters encouraged the  
18 intimidation and mistreatment of certain individuals over political  
19 differences and incited violence in our streets; and

20       Whereas, The January 6th committee couldn't be bothered to  
21 investigate Ray Epps and John Sullivan as well as their motives for  
22 inciting violence; and

23       Whereas, U.S. citizens are being indefinitely detained without  
24 due process of law while Ray Epps remains free and unquestioned;

26       Whereas, Blame for inciting violence has consistently been  
27 placed on Donald Trump by mainstream media and others based on  
28 unsubstantiated claims; and

29       Whereas, Nancy Pelosi was content to have our National Guard

1 present for Joe Biden's inauguration and subsequent weeks under  
2 inhumane conditions with rotten food but could not be bothered to  
3 have the National Guard present when a crowd of hundreds of  
4 thousands of people converged in Washington DC; now, therefore, be  
5 it

6 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of  
7 this legislative body declare January 6, 2022, as Remembrance Day

16 tyrannical actions levied on society by an unhinged and politically  
17 motivated ruling elite seeking compliance and subversion from the  
18 American people; and be it further

19 Resolved, That all elected officials wittingly complicit in  
20 the misinformation scheme resign and apologize for the disgrace  
21 they have been to our country; and be it further

22 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be sent to the  
23 Governor of Michigan, the Attorney General of Michigan, the  
24 Secretary of State of Michigan, Congresswoman Maxine Waters, The  
25 Biden Administration, and each state and federal department head in  
26 Michigan and Washington DC.
