A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

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by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 2020 PA 302.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759. (1) Subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before a primary or special primary, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of a primary or special primary, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township or city in which the elector is registered. In addition, an elector may apply using the

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online absent voter ballot application maintained by the secretary

of state. The clerk of a city or township shall not send by first-2 class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the 3 Friday immediately before the election. Except as otherwise 4 5 provided in section 761(2), the clerk of a city or township shall 6 not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that 7 city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election. An application received before a primary or special primary may be for 8 either that primary only, or for that primary and the election that 9 10 follows. An individual may submit a voter registration application 11 and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in 12 which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her the 13 14 individual's voter registration application and absent voter ballot 15 application are approved by the clerk or deputy clerk, the 16 individual may, subject to the identification requirement in 17 section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office. 18 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) and subject 19 20 to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an election, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of an election, an 21 elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall 22 23 apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township, city, or 24 village in which the voter is registered. In addition, an elector 25 may apply using the online absent voter ballot application

to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the 29 election. Except as otherwise provided in section 761(2), the clerk

township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot

maintained by the secretary of state. The clerk of a city or

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- of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her the individual's voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), 9 10 complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.
 - (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this section may be made in any of the following ways:
 - (a) By a written request signed by the voter.
 - (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the clerk of the city or township.
 - (c) On a federal postcard application.

(d) Using the online absent voter ballot application maintained by the secretary of state.

(4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the application. Subject to section 761(2), a clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A person-An individual shall not be in possession of a signed absent voter ballot application except for the applicant; a member of the applicant's immediate family; a person an individual residing in the applicant's household; a person an individual whose job normally includes the handling of mail, but only during the course of his or her the individual's employment; a registered elector requested by the applicant to return the application; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or

(6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent voter ballot must be included with each application furnished an applicant:

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and date the application in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the application or you may not receive an absent voter ballot.

- Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:
- (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common carrier.
- (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's office, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
- (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or grandchild or a person an individual residing in the voter's elector's household may mail or deliver the application to the

clerk for the applicant.

- (d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person-individual returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.
- (e) If the applicant applies using the online absent voter ballot application maintained by the secretary of state, send the application electronically through the qualified voter file to the appropriate city or township clerk for processing.
- (7) A person An individual who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
- (8) A person An individual who makes a false statement in an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person An individual who forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a felony. A person An individual who is not authorized in this act and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (9) The absent voter ballot application of an elector who is a program participant, as that term is defined in **section 3 of** the address confidentiality program act, **2020 PA 301, MCL 780.853**, is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
 - (10) The secretary of state shall maintain an online absent

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voter ballot application that allows a qualified and registered elector to request an absent voter ballot for an election occurring in that elector's city or township. The online absent voter ballot application must be in substantially the same form as the absent voter ballot application provided under subsection (5).

(11) The online absent voter ballot application maintained by the secretary of state under subsection (10) must provide an opportunity for an elector to use the elector's stored digital signature on file with the secretary of state on the online absent voter ballot application. In order to allow an elector to use the elector's stored digital signature, the online absent voter ballot application must verify the elector's identity and registration status by requesting the elector's name, complete driver license or state personal identification card number, full date of birth, last 4 digits of the elector's Social Security number, and eye color. A registered elector whose stored digital signature is on file with the secretary of state must sign the online absent voter ballot application with that stored digital signature. A registered elector without a stored digital signature on file with the secretary of state may provide a manual digital signature by uploading a photograph of the registered elector's physical handwritten signature to the online absent voter ballot application. A completed online absent voter ballot application, including digital signature, must be sent electronically through the qualified voter file to the appropriate city or township clerk for processing. An online absent voter ballot application signed using a stored digital signature or manual digital signature must be processed and treated identically as an absent voter ballot application signed with a physical handwritten signature. As used

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- (a) "Manual digital signature" means a digitally captured image of an elector's handwritten signature.
- (b) "Stored digital signature" means the image of a registered elector's signature captured by the department of state and maintained in the department of state's motor vehicle database.
