The primary mission of the **Department of Consumer and Industry Services** is to support the health, safety, and economic and cultural well-being of the public through services to and regulation of the activities of organizations and individuals. The department was created by Executive Order No. 1996-2, effective May 15, 1996, resulting from merger of the Departments of Commerce and Labor and other licensing and regulatory agencies from the former Departments of Mental Health, Public Health, and Social Services. The department director is appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

The **Office of the Director** provides overall guidance and policy direction for the department and directly for the agencies described below.

The Director is assisted by two deputy directors: Deputy Director Dennis Sykes who manages the Bureau of Employment Relations, Media and Public Relations, Bureau of Health Systems, Bureau of Health Services, Internal Audit, Liquor Control Commission, Technology and Media, Bureau of Construction Codes and Fire Safety, MSHDA, and Broadband. The second Deputy Director, Robert Swanson, manages the Office of Finance and Insurance Services, Bureau of Commercial Services, Office of Finance and Administrative Services, Policy and Legislation, Public Service Commission, Tax Tribunal, Safety and Regulation, Human Resources, Bureau of Hearings, and Appellate Commission.

The following Department of Consumer and Industry Services' offices serve as the internal support to the many diverse agencies within the department:

The *Office of Contract and Grant Administration* ensures that contracts are administered in a fair and professional manner. The office provides the best methods for contracting and guides the many department agencies through the contracting process.

The *Affirmative Action/Equal Opportunity Office* provides leadership and direction on matters relating to affirmative action, equal employment opportunity, freedom of information, sexual harassment investigations, civil rights complaints, and the Americans with Disabilities Act and reasonable accommodations.

The *Office of Media Relations and Communications* serves as the communication funnel for the department to guarantee that key information gets communicated to both the department's internal and external customers.

The *Finance and Administrative Services Bureau* is the central administration unit and is responsible for balancing the department's annual budget.

The *Office of Policy and Legislative Affairs* follows legislation affecting the department and its agencies and serves as liaison between the Governor's Office of Regulatory Reform and CIS agencies on rulemaking issues.

The *Office of Human Resources* is the primary contact for human resource development, position classification and employee selection, and provides guidance on labor relations issues and union contract negotiations.

Internal Audit conducts audits to determine if the department is acquiring, protecting, and using its resources economically and efficiently and to ensure internal controls are sufficient to protect departmental assets.

The **Michigan Liquor Control Commission** is responsible for the licensing of the manufacture, distribution, and retail sale of all beer, wine, distilled spirits, and mixed spirit drinks in Michigan, processing more than 40,000 applications each year; the enforcement of the state's liquor laws and the rules of the commission; the collection of excise and specific taxes on beer, wine, distilled spirits, and mixed spirit drinks; and the purchasing and wholesaling of all spirits in Michigan.

The 5 members of the commission, no more than 3 of whom may be members of the same political party, are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 4-year terms. Two members serve as hearing commissioners, responsible for hearing, deciding, and ordering penalties in cases involving liquor law violations by licensees. The other 3 members serve as administrative commissioners and are responsible for all licensing, enforcement, and liquor purchasing activities. The administrative commissioners also serve as an appeal board for licensees aggrieved by decisions of the hearing commissioners.

The **State Boundary Commission** was created by Act 191 of 1968 and has the authority for annexation, incorporation, and consolidation processes involving local units of government.

The commission members are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve for 3-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.

The **Michigan Public Service Commission** was created by Act 3 of 1939. The commission regulates investor-owned natural gas, electric, and telecommunications utilities, rural electric cooperatives, and intrastate motor carriers. This includes establishing safety standards and setting specific rates for services provided by the state's public utilities. The commission is also responsible for developing state energy policy. One of the commission's primary regulatory functions is to ensure an adequate supply of regulated utility services of dependable quality, at reasonable rates, to meet the public need, and to maintain a healthy economy.

The 3 commission members are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve staggered 6-year terms. Not more than 2 commissioners may represent a single political party. Upon expiration of a term, a commissioner may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.

The **Michigan State Housing Development Authority** was created by Act 346 of 1966, as amended, to finance safe and sanitary housing for low-income and moderate-income families, senior citizens, and the handicapped. The authority finances housing primarily through the sale of both taxable and tax exempt notes and bonds, the proceeds of which are loaned for home improvement, the acquisition of new or existing single-family residences, and the financing of multi-family rental housing developments. The authority makes grants to nonprofit organizations for a variety of activities, including home rehabilitation and lease purchase programs. The authority also administers various federal housing programs.

Four of the 7 members of the authority are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 4-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed. Three of the members serve on the authority by virtue of their positions in state government.

The **Michigan Tax Tribunal** was created by Act 186 of 1973. The tribunal hears appeals from taxpayers who are aggrieved by ad valorem property tax assessments, special assessments, equalization, allocation, and apportionment under the general property tax laws. The tribunal also has jurisdiction over determinations issued by the department of treasury concerning income tax; sales, use, and withholding taxes; single business tax; motor fuel tax; and intangible and inheritance taxes.

The 7-member tribunal is appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, for 4-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.



Bureau of Worker's and Unemployment Compensation

The **Bureau of Worker's and Unemployment Compensation** was created as a Type I agency within the Department of Consumer and Industry Services by Executive Reorganization Order No. 2002-1, effective April 2002, to administer state programs to compensate workers for joblessness and for work-related injuries.

The executive order transferred all of the statutory authority, powers, functions, duties, and responsibilities of the Bureau of Worker's Compensation, the Unemployment Agency, the Worker's Compensation Board of Magistrates, and the Wage and Hour Division in the department to the new bureau, and then abolished the Bureau of Worker's Compensation, the Unemployment Agency, and the positions of Director of the Bureau of Worker's Compensation and Director of the Unemployment Agency. The acting director of the Bureau of Worker's and Unemployment Compensation is David Plawewski, General Office Building, 1st Floor, 7150 Harris Drive, P.O. Box 30016, Lansing, MI 48909.

The **Worker's Compensation Appellate Commission** serves Michigan's employees and employers by addressing and resolving worker's compensation appeals expeditiously, impartially, and in a judicious manner. Created by Act 103 of 1985, the commission receives its caseload when decisions issued by the Bureau of Worker's and Unemployment Compensation and the Board of Magistrates are disputed and appealed. It is staffed with seven attorneys, who are appointed by the governor to serve 4-year terms (3-term limit). One commissioner is designated as chairperson by the governor.

The primary legal basis for the Commission is found in Act 317 of 1969, known as the Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969, which sets forth general policies for administration, gives the chairperson appointing and work assignment authority, grants rule-making authority to the Commission as a body, describes the scope of review, and provides procedures for employers, insurance carriers, attorneys, and employees seeking review.

The **Michigan Employment Security Board of Review** was created by Act 52 of 1977. The board hears and decides appeals of the Bureau of Hearings referee decisions or orders connected with claims for unemployment compensation for federal workers, state employees, veterans, and industrial and commercial workers. The board also hears and decides appeals concerning the tax liability and assessment of employers under the Michigan Employment Security Act.

The 5 board members are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 4-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.



Office of Financial and Insurance Services

The **Office of Financial and Insurance Services** was created as a Type I agency within the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services by Executive Reorganization Order No. 2000-4, effective April 3, 2000. The office is headed by the Commissioner of Financial and Insurance Services, who is appointed by the governor.

The Office of Financial and Insurance Services is organized into two offices: the Office of Financial Evaluation and the Office of Policy, Conduct, and Consumer Assistance.

The *Office of Financial Evaluation (OFE)* is responsible for chartering, regulation, examination, and supervision of state banks, state agencies of foreign banks, credit unions, and savings and loan associations. The OFE closely monitors the solvency of insurance companies and Health Maintenance Organizations and their compliance with statutory requirements regarding reserves and other financial criteria. This office also coordinates the review of financial service enterprises, oversees troubled entities, and evaluates risk assessment. Additional responsibilities include licensing and supervising the activities of Business and Industrial Development Companies.

The *Office of Policy, Conduct, and Consumer Assistance (OPCCA)* is responsible for the registration of securities, broker-dealers, and investment advisers and agents to ensure the compliance with the Michigan Uniform Securities Act. OPCCA licenses and supervises the activities of insurance agents and agencies, mortgage brokers and lenders, motor vehicle installment sellers, and nondepository credit card companies. The office reviews securities offerings, insurance rate and forms filings, and market conduct, as well as investigates alleged violations of the Insurance Code, Securities Act, and consumer finance statutes. The office also coordinates communication and consumer assistance activities; regulates health maintenance organizations and nonprofit health care corporations, including rate review and appeal programs; and completes all policy work.

The **Bureau of Employment Relations** is responsible for resolving labor disputes between public and private sector employers and employees by: mediating collective bargaining disputes; conducting elections and resolving unit clarification issues; appointing fact finders and arbitrators to resolve bargaining impasses and other labor disputes; enforcing statutes which protect bargaining rights of public employees; and fostering cooperative programs between public and private sector labor and management.

Created by Act 17 of 1976, amending Act 176 of 1939, the **Michigan Employment Relations Commission** is charged with administering the Michigan Labor Relations and Mediation Act, Act 176 of 1947, the Public Employment Relations Act, Act 336 of 1947, and the Police-Fire Compulsory Arbitration Act, Act 312 of 1969. The primary functions of the commission are:

- to aid management and labor in reaching amicable settlements of labor disputes by providing labor mediation services to employers and labor organizations in private industry and in the public sector;
- to determine appropriate bargaining units; to provide elections for selection of bargaining representatives; to certify collective bargaining representatives; and to administer the law prohibiting unfair labor practices by employers and labor organizations in the public sector; and
- to provide fact-finding procedures in public employee disputes; to conduct elections on employer last offers in the private sector; and to administer the binding arbitration procedures in police and fire department contract disputes.

The 3 commission members are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 3-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.



Bureau of Health Systems

The mission of the **Bureau of Health Systems** is to protect and improve the health status of Michigan's population through the development, maintenance, and assurance of safe, effective, efficient, and accessible health care services delivered through health care facilities, organizations, and systems; to promote the development of appropriate regulatory policies to achieve a safe, efficient, and effective health care delivery system. The director of the Bureau of Health Systems is Walter S. Wheeler, III, G. Mennen Williams Building, 5th Floor, P.O. Box 30664, Lansing 48909.



Bureau of Health Services

The **Bureau of Health Services** is comprised of the Administrative Division, Complaint and Allegation Division, Licensing Division, and the Regulatory Division.

The *Administrative Division* provides executive direction to the office and houses the Health Professional Recovery Committee.

The *Complaint and Allegation Division* is comprised of the Allegation Section and the Complaint Section. It receives and processes allegations against licensed health professionals and drafts administrative complaints.

The *Licensing Division* licenses and registers over 340,000 individuals in 32 health care occupations.

The *Regulatory Division* is comprised of the Investigation Section and the Pharmacy Section. It conducts investigations and is responsible for pharmacy inspections. The division administers the Official Prescription Program and staff support to the Controlled Substances Advisory Commission.

The **Health Professional Recovery Committee** was created by Act 80 of 1993 and became effective April 1, 1994. The committee is composed of 2 public members, appointed by the department director, both of whom have specialized training or experience, or both, in the treatment of individuals with addictive behavior and 1 professional member appointed by each board and the physician's assistants task force, all of whom have education, training, and clinical expertise in the treatment of individuals with addictive behavior or mental illness, or both. The term of office for all members is 2 years. The department director, or his or her designee, serves as an ex officio member without a vote.

The responsibilities of the committee include establishing the general components of a health recovery program and a mechanism for monitoring health professionals who may be impaired; developing and implementing criteria for the identification, assessment, and treatment of health professionals who may be impaired; developing and implementing mechanisms for the evaluation of continuing care or aftercare plans for health professionals who may be impaired; developing a mechanism and criteria for the referral of a health professional who may be impaired to a professional association, when appropriate, for the purpose of providing assistance to the health professional; and to provide each board with statistical information, on an annual basis, on the level of participation in the program of each health profession. The report may also include recommendations for changes in the program.

The **Controlled Substances Advisory Commission** was created by Act 80 of 1993. It is responsible for monitoring indicators of controlled substance abuse and diversion, and recommending a plan of action for overcoming such abuse and diversion.

The 13 commission members are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 2-year terms.



The **Licensing Division** is responsible for determining eligibility for examination and licensure, auditing licensees for compliance with continuing education requirements, and providing administrative support to the health profession boards, task forces, and the disciplinary subcommittees.

Fifteen boards and one task force are responsible for the licensure or registration of persons in the various health professions regulated by the Michigan Public Health Code. The **State Emergency Medical Services Coordination Committee** was created by Act 375 of 2001. Voting members are appointed by the Director of the Department of Consumer and Industry Services and serve for a term of 3 years. The Committee 1) provides for the coordination and exchange of information on EMS programs and services, 2) acts as liaison between organizations and individuals involved in the EMS system, 3) makes recommendations to the department in the development of a comprehensive statewide emergency medical services program, 4) advises the legislature and the department on a variety of matters relating to emergency medical services, 5) issues opinions on appeals of medical control authority decisions and makes recommendations based on those opinions to the department for the resolution of those appeals, and 6) appoints, with the advice and consent of the department, a statewide quality assurance task force to review and make recommendations to the department concerning approval of medical control authority applications and revisions concerning protocols and field studies, and conduct other quality assurance activities.



Bureau of Family Services

The **Bureau of Family Services** operates the department's complaint and licensing process for adult foster care facilities, child day care centers and homes, and child welfare with respect to children's foster homes, children's residential centers, adoptions, and children's camps. These programs are operated in accordance with applicable laws and the goals and policies of the Department of Consumer and Industry Services.

Bureau of Construction Codes and Fire Safety

The **Bureau of Construction Codes and Fire Safety** is responsible for the uniform, statewide administration of the state construction codes, state fire prevention code, and related legislation regulating the built environment. Its functions include the establishment of boiler, building, electrical, elevator, mechanical, and plumbing codes; and fire safety standards for adult foster care, and correctional and health care facilities. Rules governing the construction, alteration, demolition, occupancy, and use of buildings assure public safety and access for persons with disabilities. Energy efficiency in new building design is developed and implemented by the bureau.

In 2003, the Office of Fire Safety was merged with the Bureau of Construction Codes to provide for the review and inspection of school buildings, higher education, adult foster care, and correction and health care facilities.

The bureau is also charged with the responsibility to conduct annual inspections of certain occupancies to assure the ongoing safety of the building's occupants. This includes federally mandated inspections of health care facilities.

The bureau provides for the registration of individuals performing construction inspections; certification of fire inspectors, and fire alarm and suppression contractors; and licensure of persons, firms, and corporations that perform boiler, elevator, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing installations.

The bureau is served by the Construction Code Commission; the State Fire Safety Board; the Manufactured Housing Commission; and 6 boards, including the Barrier Free Design Board, Board of Boiler Rules, Electrical Administrative Board, Elevator Safety Board, Board of Mechanical Rules, and the State Plumbing Board.

The **State Survey and Remonumentation Commission** was created by Act 345 of 1990, effective January 1, 1991, with authority for the remonumentation of the corners of the public land survey and coordination of geographic/land information systems.



Bureau of Commercial Services

The **Bureau of Commercial Services** consists of the Licensing Division, the Enforcement Division, and the Corporation Division. The *Licensing Division* is responsible for determining eligibility for examination and licensure, monitoring licensees' compliance with continuing education requirements, and providing administrative support to the boards. The *Enforcement Division* receives and processes consumer complaints and makes determinations as to whether a violation of the licensing law can be proven. It also conducts field investigations and audits of various licensees to determine compliance with industry standards and laws and rules administered by the bureau.

Twenty-seven boards and programs license, certify, register, and regulate persons, businesses, agencies, and events providing commercial services in Michigan: Board of Accountancy; Board of Architects/Interior Designers; Athletic Board of Control; Board of Barber Examiners; Residential Builders' and Maintenance and Alteration Contractors' Board; Homeowner Construction Lien Recovery Fund; Carnival-Amusement Safety Board; Cemetery Regulation; Collection Practices Board; Community Planners; Board of Cosmetology; Board of Professional Engineers; Foresters; Prepaid Funeral Contract Regulation; Hearing Aid Dealers; Board of Landscape Architects; Board of Examiners in Mortuary Science; Ocularist Regulation; Personnel Agency Board; Board of Forensic Polygraph Examiners; Board of Real Estate Appraisers; Board of Real Estate; Ski Area Safety Board; and the Board of Professional Surveyors; Private Investigators; Security Alarm Contractors; and Security Guard Agencies.

The Occupational Health Standards are based upon, but not necessarily limited to, generally accepted nationwide occupational health controls and practices. Where possible, the standards are expressed in terms of objective criteria and the performance desired.

The MIOSHA Occupational Health Standards supersede any Occupational Health Standards promulgated pursuant to any other state law. Where another state agency has Occupational Health Standards applicable to public safety, they have concurrent applicability with the MIOSHA Occupational Health Standards.

The 9 members of the commission are appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, to serve 3-year terms. Upon expiration of a term, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.

The *Wage and Hour Division* in the **Bureau of Safety and Regulation** is responsible for the direct administration and enforcement of wage protection laws in Michigan: the Michigan Minimum Wage Act, Payment of Wages and Fringe Benefits Act, Youth Employment Standards Act, and the Prevailing Wages on State Projects Act.

The Wage and Hour Division investigates and attempts to resolve employee complaints alleging nonpayment of wages, fringe benefits, minimum wages, or overtime and equal pay for equal work. The division also conducts workplace inspections to ensure employer compliance with child labor standards. The division also educates employers and employees in the areas covered by these labor standards.

Under a 1996 executive order the Director of the Department of Consumer and Industry Services has the authority to set wage rates below the statutory minimum rate for individuals unable to meet normal production schedules because of a disability affecting their productive capacity.
