SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 719

A bill to allow an elected official to place constituent services information in certain state or local government offices; to prohibit a person from denying access to certain state or local government offices under certain circumstances; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Constituent informational meeting" means any meeting with3 the purpose of disseminating nonpolitical information to
- 4 constituents.
- 5 (b) "Constituent services information" means nonpolitical6 information from an elected official that includes, but is not





1 limited to, booklets, coffee hour notices, and event schedules.

- (c) "Elected official" means an individual who holds anelective office in this state or a local government in this state.
- 4 (d) "Local government" means a county, city, township, or5 village of this state.
- - Sec. 3. Subject to available space, an elected official may place his or her constituent services information in any state or local government office that is publicly accessible and located within the district that the elected official represents.
- Sec. 5. A person shall not deny access to an elected official to hold a constituent informational meeting at a state or local government office that is otherwise publicly accessible and located within the district that the elected official represents. The elected official must prearrange with the person a date and time for the meeting.
