SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 382

A bill to create a financial aid program for certain residents of this state who attend certain postsecondary educational institutions in this state; to provide for the administration of the financial aid program; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) This act may be cited as the "Michigan achievement scholarship act".
 - (2) The Michigan achievement scholarship is created in this act and, subject to appropriation, is funded in article III of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836 to 388.1891, to provide last-dollar scholarship assistance to certain residents

- 14 costs; federal student loan fees; miscellaneous costs, including a
- 15 reasonable amount for the documented cost of a personal computer,
- 16 allowance for child care, or allowance for other dependent care;
- 17 costs related to a disability; costs of obtaining a license,
- 18 certification, or first professional credential; and reasonable
- 19 costs for study abroad programs.
- 20 (b) "Department" means the department of lifelong education,
- 21 advancement, and potential.
- (c) "Eligible institution" means a public university that
- 23 receives an appropriation in section 236 of the state school aid
- 24 act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836, a community college that
- 25 receives an appropriation in section 201 of the state school aid
- 26 act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1801, a federally recognized
- 27 tribal college in this state, or an independent nonprofit college
- 28 or university in this state as described in section 1 of 1966 PA
- 29 313, MCL 390.991.

- 1 (d) "Gift aid" includes federal Pell grants under 20 USC
- 2 1070a, tuition incentive program benefits under section 256 of the
- 3 state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1856, state
- 4 tuition grants under section 252 of the state school aid act of
- 5 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1852, amounts received for minimum
- 6 payments awarded under section 248 of the state school aid act of
- 7 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1848, higher education expenses paid
- 8 under the Michigan promise zone authority act, 2008 PA 549, MCL
- 9 390.1661 to 390.1679, and all other federal, state, local, or
- 10 institutional aid in the form of grants, scholarships, or discounts
- 11 applied only toward tuition and mandatory fees. Gift aid does not
- 12 include student loans, work-study awards, qualified withdrawals

- 19 (e) "High school equivalency certificate" means that term as
- 20 defined in section 4 of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA
- 21 94, MCL 388.1604.
- 22 (f) "Last-dollar" means 1 of the following:
- 23 (i) For a student attending a community college or federally
- 24 recognized tribal college, an amount equal to the student's
- 25 tuition, mandatory fees, and contact hours for the student's actual
- 26 program of study, minus all gift aid received by the student.
- 27 (ii) For a student attending a public university or an
- 28 independent nonprofit college or university, or for a student
- 29 enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program described in section 121

- 1 of the community college act of 1966, 1966 PA 331, MCL 389.121, an
- 2 amount equal to the student's individual cost of attendance, minus
- 3 all gift aid received by the student.
- 4 (q) "SAI eligible student" means a student who has completed
- 5 the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and meets at least 1
- 6 of the following:
- 7 (i) Received the Michigan achievement scholarship in academic
- 8 year 2023-2024, was determined to have an expected family
- 9 contribution of \$25,000.00 or less in academic year 2023-2024, and
- 10 has completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the
- 11 subsequent award cycles.
- (ii) For awards made during academic year 2024-2025 or a
- 13 subsequent academic year, has a student aid index number of 30,000
- 14 or less. If the federal government replaces the student aid index
- 15 number with a new metric, the department shall collaborate with the
- 16 state budget office and the house and senate fiscal agencies to
- 17 adopt a new eligibility metric equivalent to a student aid index
- 18 number of 30,000 or less.
- 19 Sec. 5. (1) The department shall administer the Michigan
- 20 achievement scholarship pursuant to this act, the Michigan
- 21 achievement skills scholarship act, article III of the state school
- 22 aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836 to 388.1891, and the
- 23 administrative procedures of the department.
- 24 (2) Payments for Michigan achievement scholarships are subject
- 25 to appropriation under article III of the state school aid act of
- 26 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836 to 388.1891.
- 27 Sec. 7. Subject to section 9(2), an individual must meet all
- 28 of the following criteria each year to be eligible for a Michigan
- 29 achievement scholarship awarded under this act:

- 1 (a) Maintain residency in this state, as determined for 2 purposes of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
- 3 (b) Have graduated with a high school diploma or certificate 4 of completion or achieved a high school equivalency certificate in 5 2023 or after.
- 6 (c) Be enrolled in an eligible institution as a full-time 7 undergraduate student, as defined by the eligible institution, for 8 the semester the award is received.
- 9 (d) Have enrolled for the first time in an eligible institution during the 2023-2024 academic year, or a subsequent 10 11 academic year, within 15 months after high school graduation or attainment of a high school equivalency certificate or have 12 received a Michigan achievement scholarship or Michigan achievement 13 skills scholarship in a previous academic year. For the purposes of 14 15 this subdivision, participation in a dual enrollment, early college, or other similar program while attending high school does 16 not disqualify a student from being considered a first-time 17 enrollee. 18
- 19 (e) Maintain satisfactory academic progress, as defined by the 20 eligible institution in which the student is enrolled.
 - (f) Not be in default on a federal student loan.
 - (g) Apply for and accept all available gift aid for each academic year in which the individual applies for a Michigan achievement scholarship.
 - (h) For an individual who is enrolled at an eligible institution that is a public university or an independent nonprofit college or university, or who is enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program described in section 121 of the community college act of 1966, 1966 PA 331, MCL 389.121, at an eligible institution, be an

- 3 this act subject to the availability of funds appropriated for the

- 25 canceled due to a student's failure to maintain full-time status as

- 27 (vii) The average Michigan achievement scholarship award per

- 29 (viii) As applicable, a delineation of each measure described in

- 1 subparagraphs (i) to (vii) by sector, including community colleges,
- 2 tribal colleges, public universities, and independent colleges and
- 3 universities.
- 4 (e) By September 30 of each year, starting with the fiscal
- 5 year ending September 30, 2027 and in partnership with the Center
- 6 for Education Performance and Information, create and maintain a
- 7 publicly available online dashboard that includes all of the
- 8 following student success information for the previous academic
- 9 year:
- 10 (i) The number of students who received a Michigan achievement
- 11 scholarship and completed a degree or credential by eligible
- 12 institution.
- 13 (ii) Type of credentials, including a breakdown of bachelor's
- 14 and associate degrees, earned by students who received a Michigan
- 15 achievement scholarship by eligible institution.
- 16 (iii) The percentage of students who received a Michigan
- 17 achievement scholarship and were eligible for federal Pell grants
- 18 under 20 USC 1070a.
- 19 (iv) The average completion rate for students who received a
- 20 Michigan achievement scholarship by eliqible institution as defined
- 21 by the department.
- (v) The average persistence rate and credits earned for
- 23 students who received a Michigan achievement scholarship by
- 24 eligible institution as defined by the department.
- (vi) As applicable, a delineation of each measure described in
- 26 subparagraphs (i) to (v) by sector, including community colleges,
- 27 tribal colleges, public universities, and independent colleges and
- 28 universities.
- 29 (2) Each eligible institution whose students receive awards

- 1 under this act shall cooperate with the department in a timely
- 2 manner to facilitate the creation of the reports under subsection
- 3 (1)(d) and (e).
- 4 Sec. 13. (1) An eligible institution for the Michigan
- 5 achievement scholarship shall do all of the following:
- 6 (a) By April 1 of each year, submit a report to the
- 7 department, the state budget office, and the house and senate
- 8 fiscal agencies providing information as to the average amount of
- 9 institutional grant aid awarded to full-time first-time
- 10 undergraduate students for the immediately preceding 2
- 11 institutional fiscal years. If the average amount of institutional
- 12 grant aid awarded to full-time first-time undergraduate students in
- 13 the immediately preceding institutional fiscal year is less than
- 14 the average amount of institutional grant aid awarded to full-time
- 15 first-time undergraduate students in the year preceding the
- 16 immediately preceding institutional fiscal year, the institution
- 17 must include in the report a description of any changes to the
- 18 institutional financial aid during the 2 immediately preceding
- 19 institutional fiscal years. An institution's report of the average
- 20 amount of institutional grant aid awarded to full-time first-time
- 21 undergraduate students pursuant to this subdivision must be
- 22 consistent with data most recently reported to the Integrated
- 23 Postsecondary Education Data System.
- 24 (b) For each state fiscal year, maintain and report its
- 25 compliance with the following tuition and fee restraint rates, as
- 26 applicable:
- (i) For an eligible institution that is a community college or
- 28 a federally recognized tribal college in this state, the tuition
- 29 and fee restraint rate described in article II of the state school

- 1 aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1801 to 388.1830.
- 2 (ii) For an eligible institution that is a public university or 3 independent nonprofit college or university, the tuition and fee restraint rate described in article III of the state school aid act 4 5 of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836 to 388.1891. The report of an eligible institution that is an independent nonprofit college or 6 university must include the actual tuition and mandatory fee rates 7 adopted by the institution's governing board for each academic year 8 9 as described in tuition and fee restraint provisions of article III 10 of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1836 to
 - (2) The state budget director shall implement reporting requirements to ensure that an eligible institution has satisfied the tuition and fee restraint requirements of this section. The state budget director has the sole authority to determine if an eligible institution has met the requirements of this section.
 - (3) If an eligible institution exceeds the applicable tuition and fee restraint rate for 2 consecutive years, the state budget director may consider the institution ineligible to receive money appropriated for Michigan achievement scholarships in the subsequent academic year.
 - (4) If an institution is considered ineligible to receive money appropriated for Michigan achievement scholarships under this section, the state budget director must reevaluate the status of the ineligible institution annually.
 - (5) It is the intent of the legislature that an eligible institution will not make reductive changes to institutional grant aid offered by that eligible institution that has the goal or net effect of shifting the cost burden of those programs to the program
