



SENATE BILL No. 15

January 13, 1993, Introduced by Senator DI NELLO and referred to the Committee on State Affairs and Military/Veteran Affairs.

A bill to amend sections 1 and 2 of Act No. 222 of the Public Acts of 1972, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to provide for certain duties of the secretary of state; and to prescribe certain penalties for violations,"

section 2 as amended by Act No. 125 of the Public Acts of 1989, being sections 28.291 and 28.292 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of Act No. 222 of the Public
2 Acts of 1972, section 2 as amended by Act No. 125 of the Public
3 Acts of 1989, being sections 28.291 and 28.292 of the Michigan
4 Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:

5 Sec. 1. A person who is a resident of this state may apply
6 to the department of state for an official state personal
7 identification card. Upon application the applicant shall supply

1 HIS OR HER SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AND a birth certificate
2 attesting to his OR HER age or other sufficient documents or
3 identification as the secretary of state may require.

4 Sec. 2. (1) The official state personal identification card
5 shall contain an identification number permanently assigned to
6 the person and the name, date of birth, sex, SOCIAL SECURITY
7 NUMBER, residential address, height, weight, eye color, an
8 imprinted photograph, and the signature of the person to whom the
9 identification card is issued and shall be in a form prescribed
10 by the secretary of state. An official state personal identifi-
11 cation card shall be issued only upon authorization of the secre-
12 tary of state, and shall be manufactured in a manner to prohibit
13 as nearly as possible the ability to reproduce, alter, counter-
14 feit, forge, or duplicate the identification card without ready
15 detection. An official state personal identification card shall
16 not be issued to a person who holds an operator's or chauffeur's
17 license issued pursuant to the Michigan vehicle code, Act No. 300
18 of the Public Acts of 1949, being sections 257.1 to 257.923 of
19 the Michigan Compiled Laws, unless the license has been sus-
20 pended, revoked, or restricted. A fee of \$6.00 shall be paid to
21 the secretary of state by the applicant for each original or
22 replacement identification card issued. If an identification
23 card issued under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or
24 becomes illegible, the person to whom the identification card was
25 issued may obtain a replacement identification card. Except as
26 provided in subsection (7), an official state personal
27 identification card shall expire on the birthday of the person to

1 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of
2 issuance and shall not be issued for a period greater than 4
3 years. An official state personal identification card may be
4 renewed within 45 days before the expiration of the card upon
5 application and payment of a \$6.00 fee. However, the secretary
6 of state, for good cause shown, may accept an application and fee
7 for renewal up to 6 months before the expiration of the card. A
8 fee under this section is not required if the applicant is a
9 person 65 years of age or older, is a person who has had his or
10 her operator's or chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or
11 denied under Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949 because of a
12 mental or physical infirmity or disability, or is a person who
13 presents evidence of blindness as provided in Act No. 260 of the
14 Public Acts of 1978, being sections 393.351 to 393.368 of the
15 Michigan Compiled Laws. The fees received and collected under
16 this act shall be deposited by the secretary of state in the
17 state treasury to the credit of the general fund. The legisla-
18 ture shall appropriate money for the administration of this act.

19 (2) If the person identified by an official state personal
20 identification card presents evidence of blindness as provided in
21 Act No. 260 of the Public Acts of 1978, the secretary of state
22 shall mark the person's card in a manner which clearly indicates
23 that the cardholder is legally blind.

24 (3) A person who has been issued an official state personal
25 identification card shall apply for a new official state personal
26 identification card if the person changes his or her name. A fee

1 of \$6.00 shall be paid to the secretary of state by the applicant
2 for an identification card under this subsection.

3 (4) A person who has been issued an official state personal
4 identification card shall apply for a corrected identification
5 card if he or she changes his or her residential address. The
6 secretary of state shall correct the address on an identification
7 card by affixing a label containing the correct address on the
8 back of the card. A fee shall not be charged for a change of
9 residential address.

10 (5) Except as provided under subsections (3) and (4), a
11 person who has been issued an official state personal identifica-
12 tion card may apply for a new official state personal identifica-
13 tion card for the purpose of changing any information on the
14 card. A fee of \$6.00 shall be paid to the secretary of state by
15 the applicant for an identification card under this subsection.

16 (6) The secretary of state shall establish and maintain a
17 computerized central file of the information contained on appli-
18 cation forms received under this act. The computerized central
19 file shall be interfaced with the law enforcement information
20 network as provided in the L.E.I.N. policy council act of 1974,
21 Act No. 163 of the Public Acts of 1974, being sections 28.211 to
22 28.216 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

23 (7) An official state personal identification card issued
24 before October 1, 1985 shall expire on the cardholder's birthday
25 in 1987.

26 (8) The secretary of state, when issuing an official state
27 personal identification card to a person who at the time of

1 application is less than 20-1/2 years of age, shall code the card
2 in a manner which clearly identifies the cardholder as being less
3 than 21 years of age.
