



HOUSE BILL No. 5248

October 12, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Bankes, Crissman, Cherry, Pitoniak, Freeman, McBryde, Gire, Byl, DeMars and Brater and referred to the Committee on Human Services.

A bill to provide for the suspension of occupational licenses under certain circumstances; and to provide for the related powers and duties of state agencies and officers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 "regulated occupation support enforcement act".

3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

4 (a) "License" means a certificate, registration, or license
5 issued by an occupational regulatory agency that allows an indi-
6 vidual to engage in a regulated occupation, profession, or voca-
7 tion or that allows an individual to use a specific title in the
8 practice of an occupation, profession, or vocation.

1 (b) "Occupational regulatory agency" means a department,
2 bureau, or agency of the state of Michigan that has regulatory
3 authority over a regulated occupation.

4 (c) "Office of the friend of the court" means the agency
5 created by section 3 of the friend of the court act, Act No. 294
6 of the Public Acts of 1982, being section 552.503 of the Michigan
7 Compiled Laws.

8 (d) "Regulated occupation" means an occupation, profession,
9 or vocation that requires a license as a predicate for the prac-
10 tice of the occupation, profession, or vocation or for the use of
11 a specific title in the practice of the occupation, profession,
12 or vocation.

13 Sec. 3. Subject to this act, an occupational regulatory
14 agency shall suspend the license issued to an individual for a
15 regulated occupation.

16 Sec. 4. (1) Within 7 business days after receipt of a sus-
17 pension order issued pursuant to section 26a, 33, or 35 of the
18 support and visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the Public
19 Acts of 1982, being sections 552.626a, 552.633, and 552.635 of
20 the Michigan Compiled Laws, an occupational regulatory agency
21 shall send a written notice of the receipt of the suspension
22 order to the licensee who is the subject of the suspension
23 order.

24 (2) The notice sent pursuant to subsection (1) shall inform
25 the licensee who is the subject of the suspension order that the
26 occupational regulatory agency shall comply with the suspension
27 order issued by a court and shall automatically suspend the

1 licensee's license within 28 days after the date of mailing of
2 the notice unless the office of the friend of the court provides
3 an order from the court indicating that the suspension order has
4 been rescinded.

5 Sec. 5. (1) An occupational regulatory agency shall comply
6 with a suspension order and shall suspend the license of a
7 licensee 28 days after the date of mailing of the notice under
8 section 4 unless the office of the friend of the court provides
9 an order from a court indicating that the suspension order has
10 been rescinded.

11 (2) An order rescinding a suspension order is effective
12 immediately upon its entry by the court. An occupational regula-
13 tory agency shall reinstate the license of a licensee whose sus-
14 pension order is rescinded as provided in section 26b, 33, or 35
15 of the support and visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the
16 Public Acts of 1982, being sections 552.626b, 552.633, and
17 552.635 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. The effective date of
18 reinstatement of the license is considered to be the date of
19 entry of the order rescinding the suspension order.

20 (3) An occupational regulatory agency shall send a notice of
21 reinstatement of a license to the licensee within 7 business days
22 after receipt of the order rescinding the suspension order.

23 Sec. 6. This act shall not take effect unless all of the
24 following bills of the 88th Legislature are enacted into law:
