



SENATE BILL No. 1189

October 1, 1996, Introduced by Senators HOFFMAN, NORTH, MC MANUS, DUNASKISS and STEIL and referred to the Committee on Economic Development, International Trade and Regulatory Affairs.

A bill to repeal Act No. 309 of the Public Acts of 1941, entitled

"An act to give the state board of examiners of barbers jurisdiction to investigate trade practices among barbers, haircutters, barber and haircutting schools and colleges; to enforce such regulations pertaining to reasonable service charges and reasonable hours of operation of barber shops, haircutting shops, barber and haircutting schools and colleges as will tend to eliminate unfair and insanitary practices; fixing territorial units for such regulations; regulating barber schools, haircutting schools and colleges and practices therein; and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith,"

being sections 338.651 to 338.662 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:
