## **HOUSE BILL No. 4207**

January 30, 1997, Introduced by Reps. Schroer, Anthony, LaForge and Brater and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 21707 and 21715 (MCL 333.21707 and 333.21715) and by adding sections 21714 and 21720c.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 21707. (1) The SUBJECT TO SECTION 21714, THE course
- 2 of medical treatment provided to a patient in a nursing home
- 3 shall be prescribed by the patient's physician.
- 4 (2) This part does not:
- 5 (a) Authorize the supervision, regulation, or control of the
- 6 practice of any method of healing.
- 7 (b) Authorize the medical supervision, regulation, or con-
- 8 trol of the remedial care or nonmedical nursing care of patients
- 9 in a nursing home operated for the adherents of a bona fide
- 10 church or religious denomination who rely upon treatment by

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- 1 prayer or spiritual means only in accordance with the creed or
- 2 tenets of that church or denomination. The residents, patients,
- 3 personnel, or employees, other than food handlers, of the NURSING
- 4 home are not required to submit to a medical or physical
- 5 examination. However, the nursing home shall be inspected and
- 6 licensed under laws pertaining to fire, safety, sanitation, and
- 7 building construction.
- 8 SEC. 21714. (1) IF A PATIENT IN A LICENSED HOSPITAL IS
- 9 UNDER THE CARE OF A PHYSICIAN AT THE TIME THE PATIENT APPLIES FOR
- 10 ADMISSION TO A NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT, AND
- 11 IF THE PHYSICIAN WILL CONTINUE TO DIRECT THE CARE OF THE PATIENT
- 12 AT THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT, THE NURSING
- 13 HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT SHALL REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO
- 14 BE EXAMINED BY THE PHYSICIAN WITHIN 1 MONTH BEFORE THE PATIENT IS
- 15 ADMITTED TO THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT.
- 16 THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT SHALL ALSO
- 17 REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO SUBMIT A COPY OF THE EXAMINATION AT THE
- 18 TIME OF THE PATIENT'S ADMISSION. IF THE PATIENT HAS AN ACUTE
- 19 ILLNESS SUBSEQUENT TO THE INITIAL EXAMINATION REQUIRED UNDER THIS
- 20 SUBSECTION, BUT BEFORE ADMISSION TO THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL
- 21 LONG-TERM CARE UNIT, THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE
- 22 UNIT SHALL REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO BE REEXAMINED BY THE PHYSICIAN
- 23 WITHIN 1 WEEK BEFORE ADMISSION TO THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL
- 24 LONG-TERM CARE UNIT. A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT OR CERTIFIED NURSE
- 25 PRACTITIONER MAY PERFORM THE INITIAL EXAMINATION REQUIRED UNDER
- 26 THIS SUBSECTION UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE PHYSICIAN.

- 1 (2) IF A PATIENT IS NOT UNDER THE CARE OF A PHYSICIAN WHO
- 2 WILL CONTINUE TO DIRECT THE CARE OF THE PATIENT AT THE TIME THE
- 3 PATIENT APPLIES FOR ADMISSION TO A NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL
- 4 LONG-TERM CARE UNIT, THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE
- 5 UNIT SHALL REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO BE EXAMINED BY A PHYSICIAN
- 6 WITHIN 7 DAYS BEFORE OR 14 DAYS AFTER ADMISSION TO THE NURSING
- 7 HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT.
- 8 (3) A NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL LONG-TERM CARE UNIT SHALL NOT
- 9 ADMIT A PATIENT UNLESS THERE ARE ORDERS PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN
- 10 FOR THE PATIENT'S IMMEDIATE CARE IN THE NURSING HOME OR HOSPITAL
- 11 LONG-TERM CARE UNIT.
- 12 (4) THE DIRECTOR OF NURSING IMMEDIATELY SHALL ENTER STANDING
- 13 AND OTHER TREATMENT ORDERS PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN FOR THE CARE
- 14 OF A PATIENT IN A NURSING HOME IN THE PATIENT'S PERMANENT MEDICAL
- 15 RECORD AND SHALL SIGN THE ENTRY, UNLESS THE ORDERS HAVE ALREADY
- 16 BEEN ENTERED AND SIGNED BY THE PRESCRIBING PHYSICIAN OR PURSUANT
- 17 TO SUBSECTION (5). IF THE DIRECTOR OF NURSING MAKES AND SIGNS AN
- 18 ENTRY UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE PHYSICIAN WHO PRESCRIBED THE
- 19 STANDING OR OTHER TREATMENT ORDERS SHALL COUNTERSIGN THE ORDERS
- 20 WITHIN 1 MONTH AFTER THE DATE THE STANDING OR OTHER TREATMENT
- 21 ORDERS ARE ENTERED INTO THE PATIENT'S PERMANENT MEDICAL RECORD BY
- 22 THE DIRECTOR OF NURSING.
- 23 (5) IF STANDING OR OTHER TREATMENT ORDERS FOR THE CARE OF A
- 24 PATIENT IN A NURSING HOME ARE ENTERED INTO THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL
- 25 RECORD BY A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT OR A CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTI-
- 26 TIONER, THE SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN SHALL COUNTERSIGN THE ORDERS
- 27 WITHIN 1 MONTH AFTER THE ENTRY.

- 1 Sec. 21715. (1) A SUBJECT TO SECTION 21720C, A nursing
- 2 home shall provide : (a) A program of planned and continuing
- 3 nursing care under the charge of a registered nurse in a skilled
- 4 facility and a licensed practical nurse with a registered nurse
- 5 consultant in an intermediate care facility. This subdivision
- 6 shall expire December 31, 1979. (b) A A program of planned and
- 7 continuing medical care under the charge of 1 OR MORE
- 8 physicians.
- 9 (2) Nursing care and medical care shall consist of services
- 10 given to individuals who are subject to prolonged suffering from
- 11 illness or injury or who are recovering from illness or injury.
- 12 The services shall be within the ability of the NURSING home to
- 13 provide and shall include the functions of medical care -such as-
- 14 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, diagnosis and treatment of an ill-
- 15 ness; nursing care via assessment, planning, and implementation;
- 16 evaluation of a patient's health care needs; and the carrying out
- 17 of required treatment prescribed by a physician.
- 18 SEC. 21720C. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT LICENSE A NURSING
- 19 HOME OR RENEW A NURSING HOME LICENSE UNDER THIS PART UNLESS THE
- 20 NURSING HOME HAS DESIGNATED A PHYSICIAN TO SERVE AS MEDICAL
- 21 DIRECTOR OF THE NURSING HOME.
- 22 (2) A MEDICAL DIRECTOR DESIGNATED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) IS
- 23 RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 24 (A) IMPLEMENTATION OF RESIDENT CARE POLICIES.
- 25 (B) COORDINATION OF MEDICAL CARE IN THE NURSING HOME.
- 26 (C) THE OVERALL QUALITY OF MEDICAL SERVICES IN THE NURSING
- **27** HOME.
