


House Bill 4554 would amend the Michigan Vehicle Code (MCL 257.907) to increase the fine that can be assessed when a person illegally parks in a parking space designated for handicapper use. Currently, a judge, district court referee, or district court magistrate must order a person to pay costs and a civil fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$100. Under the bill, a person would be ordered to pay costs and a civil fine of not less than \$150 or more than \$200.

<u>House Bill 4555</u> would amend the act that authorizes state universities and colleges to enact parking, traffic and pedestrian ordinances (MCL 390.892a). The bill would require that the governing board establish a civil fine of not less than \$150 or more than \$200 for a violation of a provision that prohibits parking in a parking space reserved for use by people with disabilities. Currently the civil fine is not less than \$50 or more than \$100.
