by amending sections 509t, 726, 759a, and 769 (MCL 168.509t, 168.726, 168.759a, and 168.769), section 509t as amended by 1998 PA 21, section 759a as amended by 1996 PA 207, and section 769 as amended by 1995 PA 261, and by adding sections 750a, 750b, and 750c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 509t. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law
 to the contrary, a person who is a qualified elector in this
 state and who registers to vote in a manner consistent with the
 national voter registration act of 1993, is considered a regis tered voter under this act.

6 (2) A person who registers to vote in a jurisdiction in this7 state by mail shall vote in person if that person has not

previously voted in person in that jurisdiction. This subsection
 does not apply to any of the following registered voters:

3 (a) A person entitled to vote by absentee ballot under the
4 uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting act, Public Law
5 99-410, 100 Stat. 924.

6 (b) A person who has a disability as defined in section 103
7 of the persons with disabilities civil rights act, 1976 PA 220,
8 MCL 37.1103, or who is 60 years of age or older.

9 (c) A person who is entitled to vote other than in person10 under any other federal law.

11 (D) A PERSON WHO IS ENTITLED TO VOTE BY THE INTERNET UNDER12 SECTIONS 750A TO 750C OF THIS ACT.

13 (3) This section does not preclude this state from prosecut-14 ing a violation of this act that is also a violation of any fed-15 eral election or voting rights law.

Sec. 726. No ballots A BALLOT shall be delivered to an r elector by any person other than ONLY BY 1 of the inspectors of election and only within the polling place, except as provided in this act for absent voters. VOTER ballots AND INTERNET VOTER BALLOTS.

SEC. 750A. (1) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2000 AND THROUGH DECEMBER
31, 2004, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ESTABLISH A PILOT PROJECT
TO TEST INTERNET VOTING IN AT LEAST 6 BUT NOT MORE THAN 8 PILOT
JURISDICTIONS. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL NAME PILOT JURISDICTIONS THAT VARY IN SIZE OF POPULATION. THE SECRETARY OF STATE

(4) ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1, 2005, THE SECRETARY OF STATE

(1) AT ANY TIME DURING THE 75 DAYS BEFORE A PRI-7 MARY, A SPECIAL PRIMARY, AN ELECTION, OR A SPECIAL ELECTION, BUT 8 NOT LATER THAN 1 WEEK BEFORE THE PRIMARY, SPECIAL PRIMARY, ELEC-9 TION, OR SPECIAL ELECTION, AN ELECTOR WHO QUALIFIES TO VOTE AS AN 10 INTERNET VOTER MAY APPLY FOR AN INTERNET VOTER BALLOT. 14 THAT COMPLIES WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ACT, THE LOCAL CLERK
15 SHALL FORWARD TO THE APPLICANT THE MEANS TO VOTE BY INTERNET AS
16 DESCRIBED IN SECTION 750C. IF THE APPLICANT IS NOT A REGISTERED
17 VOTER AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION TO VOTE BY INTERNET, THE CLERK
18 SHALL PROVIDE THE FORMS TO ALLOW THE APPLICANT TO REGISTER UNDER
19 SECTION 504 AND SHALL NOT PROVIDE THE MEANS TO VOTE BY INTERNET
20 UNTIL THE RECEIPT OF A SIGNED REGISTRATION FORM OR AFFIDAVIT
21 UNDER SECTION 500G.

(5) (4) The size of a precinct shall not be determined by
registration forms completed under this section.

(6) (5) A person described in subsection (1)(a) and (b)
25 and a spouse or dependent of that person who is accompanying that
26 person is registered to vote in a special primary or special
27 general election if he or she was registered to vote under this

1 section in the primary or general election immediately preceding 2 the special primary or special general election. The city, 3 VILLAGE, or township clerk who received that person's completed 4 registration forms in the primary or general election shall for-5 ward to that person at his or her last known address an absent 6 voter ballot OR AN INTERNET VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION for the spe-7 cial primary or special general election immediately upon the 8 clerk's receipt of the absent voter ballots for the special pri-9 mary or special general election.

10 (7) (6) Pursuant to UNDER the uniformed and overseas citi-11 zens absentee voting act, Public Law 99-410, 100 Stat. 924, the 12 state director of elections shall approve a ballot form and reg-13 istration procedures for electors in the armed services and elec-14 tors outside the United States, including the spouses and depen-15 dents accompanying those electors.

16 (8) (7) As used in this section, "armed services" means 17 any of the following:

18 (a) The United States army, navy, air force, marine corps,19 or coast guard.

20 (b) The United States merchant marines.

21 (c) A reserve component of an armed service listed in22 subdivision (a) or (b).

(d) The Michigan national guard as defined in section 105 of
24 the Michigan military act, Act No. 150 of the Public Acts of
25 1967, being section 32.505 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1967 PA
26 150, MCL 32.505.

Sec. 769. (1) An absent OR INTERNET voter may vote in person within his or her precinct at an election —, notwithstanding that— EVEN THOUGH he or she applies for an absent OR INTERNET voter ballot and the ballot is mailed or otherwise delivered to the <u>absent</u> voter by the clerk. This subsection only applies if the absent OR INTERNET voter does not vote the <u>absent</u> voter ballot mailed or otherwise delivered by the clerk.

9 (2) Before voting in person, except as otherwise provided in
10 this section, the absent voter shall return the absent voter
11 ballot to the board of election inspectors in his or her
12 precinct. If an absent voter ballot is returned under this sub13 section, the board of election inspectors shall mark it
14 "CANCELED" and place it in the regular box with other canceled
15 ballots.

(3) An absent voter who did not receive an absent voter
17 ballot that he or she applied for or lost or destroyed an absent
18 voter ballot he or she received, OR AN INTERNET VOTER WHO DID NOT
19 RECEIVE THE MEANS TO VOTE BY THE INTERNET THAT HE OR SHE APPLIED
20 FOR, and who desires to vote in person in his or her precinct on
21 election day, shall sign an affidavit to that effect before an
22 election inspector and be allowed to vote as otherwise provided
23 in this act. However, a voter being allowed to vote under this
24 subsection is subject to challenge as provided in section 727.
25 (4) A person who votes at an election both in person and by
26 means of an absent OR INTERNET voter ballot or a person who

attempts to vote both in person and by means of an absent OR
 INTERNET voter ballot is guilty of a felony.

3 (5) An election official who becomes aware of a person who
4 votes or attempts to vote both in person and by means of an
5 absent OR INTERNET voter ballot shall report that information to
6 the prosecuting attorney for that county and to the secretary of
7 state.
