The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Law and Corrections.

Reps. Faunce, Law, Sanborn, DeHart, Richner, O'Neil, Julian, Kelly and Shulman introduced House Bill No. 4702. entitled

A bill to amend 1953 PA 232, entitled "An act to revise, consolidate, and codify the laws relating to probationers and probation officers, to pardons, reprieves, commutations, and paroles, to the administration of correctional institutions, correctional farms, and probation recovery camps, to prisoner labor and correctional industries, and to the supervision and inspection of local jails and houses of correction; to provide for the siting of correctional facilities; to create a state department of corrections, and to prescribe its powers and duties; to provide for the transfer to and vesting in said department of powers and duties vested by law in certain other state boards, commissions, and officers, and to abolish certain boards, commissions, and offices the powers and duties of which are transferred by this act; to allow for the operation of certain facilities by private entities; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain other state departments and agencies; to provide for the creation of a local lockup advisory board; to prescribe penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act; to make certain appropriations; to repeal certain parts of this act on specific dates; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act," by amending section 38 (MCL 791.238), as amended by 1994 PA 217.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Law and Corrections.

Reps. Cassis and Geiger introduced

House Bill No. 4703, entitled

A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled "Income tax act of 1967," (MCL 206.1 to 206.532) by adding section 253. The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

Rep. Kowall introduced

House Bill No. 4704, entitled

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," (MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1304. The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Education.

Rep. Raczkowski moved that the House adjourn. The motion prevailed, the time being 11:59 p.m.
