A bill to amend 1933 PA 167, entitled "An act to provide for the raising of additional public revenue by prescribing certain specific taxes, fees, and charges to be paid to the state for the privilege of engaging in certain business activities; to provide, incident to the enforcement thereof, for the issuance of licenses to engage in such occupations; to provide for the ascertainment, assessment and collection thereof; to appropriate the proceeds thereof; and to prescribe penalties for violations of the provisions of this act," by amending sections 1, 4a, 4g, 4j, and 4q (MCL 205.51, 205.54a, 205.54g, 205.54j, and 205.54q), section 1 as amended by 1998 PA 451, section 4a as amended by 1998 PA 490, section 4g as amended by 1998 PA 60, section 4j as added by 1985 PA 225, and section 4g as added by 1998 PA 258, and by adding sections 4r, 4s, 4t, 4u, 4v, and 4w.

House Bill No. 4300, entitled

A bill to make and supplement appropriations for the department of corrections and certain state purposes related to corrections for the fiscal years ending September 30, 1999 and September 30, 2000; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for reports; to provide for the creation of certain advisory committees and boards; to prescribe certain powers and duties of the department of corrections, certain other state officers and agencies, and certain advisory committees and boards; to provide for the collection of certain funds; and to provide for the disposition of fees and other income received by certain state agencies.

The House of Representatives has amended the Senate substitute (S-1) as follows:

- 1. Amend page 2, line 13, by striking out "1,568,641,800" and inserting "1,567,641,800".
- 2. Amend page 2, line 17, by striking out "1,562,026,200" and inserting "1,561,026,200".
- 3. Amend page 2, line 24, by striking out "1,487,579,100" and inserting "1,486,579,100".
- 4. Amend page 4, line 22, by striking out all of lines 22 and 23.
- 5. Amend page 5, line 4, by striking out "44,856,900" and inserting "43,856,900".
 6. Amend page 5, line 12, by striking out "41,001,100" and inserting "40,001,100".
- 7. Amend page 28, line 8, after "at" by striking out "\$1,535,927,000.00" and inserting "\$1,534,927,000.00".
- 8. Amend page 32, line 8, by striking out all of section 213 and inserting:

"Sec. 213. (1) The department shall submit to the department of management and budget, the house and senate appropriations committees, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the house and senate standing committees having jurisdiction over technology issues, quarterly reports on the department's efforts to change the department's computer software and hardware as necessary to perform properly in the year 2000 and beyond. These reports shall identify actual progress in comparison to the department's approved work plan for these efforts.

- (2) Beginning with the report on April 1, 2000, the department shall submit to the department of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the senate and house standing committees having jurisdiction over technology issues, quarterly reports identifying for the immediately preceding quarter of significant problems with information systems, occurrences of information system failure as a result of noncompliance with year 2000 standards, and previously unidentified areas of significant impact. These reports shall identify systems needing corrective action and the contractual obligations of accountable parties. These reports shall give the status of the progress made in repairing and testing applications, the status of vendor supplied solutions to problems, information on the activation of manual or contract processes used to correct problems, and an itemization of the additional costs incurred.
- (3) The department may present progress billings to the department of management and budget for the costs incurred in changing computer software and hardware as necessary to perform properly in the year 2000 and beyond, and for costs incurred as a result of initiating corrective actions. At the time progress billings are presented for reimbursement, the department shall identify the funding sources that should support the work performed, and the department of management and budget shall forward the appropriate funding.".
 - 9. Amend page 37, line 14, by striking out all of sections 226 and 227.
- 10. Amend page 38, line 19, by striking out all of section 228.
- 11. Amend page 41, line 22, by striking out all of section 308 and inserting:

"Sec. 308. The departments and agencies receiving appropriations under this act shall receive and retain copies of all reports funded from appropriations in part 1. Federal and state guidelines for short-term and long-term retention of records shall be followed.".

12. Amend page 42, line 3, by striking out all of section 310 and inserting:

"Sec. 310. The department shall provide a report prepared by the department's internal auditor on the activities of the internal auditor for the prior fiscal year. This report shall include a listing of each audit or investigation performed by the internal auditor pursuant to sections 486(4) and 487 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1486 and 18.1487. The report shall identify the proportion of time spent on each of the statutory responsibilities listed in sections 485(4), 486(4), and 487 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1485, 18.1486, and 18.1487, and the time spent on all other activities performed in the internal audit function. The first report shall be due on March 1, 2000 and biennially thereafter beginning on May 1, 2001 and shall be submitted to the governor, auditor general, the senate and house appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the director."

13. Amend page 42, line 17, by striking out all of section 311 and inserting:

"Sec. 311. The department shall pilot the placement of reports required by this act on the Internet with electronic notification to legislative offices of Internet access to reports. During fiscal year 2000, all reports shall continue to be distributed to the legislature in the current printed format."

- 14. Amend page 52, line 13, after "806." by striking out "(1)".
- 15. Amend page 52, following line 20, by striking out all of subsections (2) and (3).
- 16. Amend page 64, following line 10, by striking out all of section 1502.

A resolution to support the Ready to Learn Leadership Summit.

Whereas, Brain research demonstrates conclusively that early brain development, and later capacity for learning, is largely determined by quality, caring interactions with infants and young children, or lack thereof; and

Whereas, Healthy intellectual, social, and emotional development of young children requires the formation of stable, loving relationships with parents and other caregivers; and

Whereas, Children are greatly prepared for school if they experience love and respect, exposure to language, and opportunities to play and explore; and

Whereas, Children are harmed in their development if they experience neglect, abuse, and exposure to toxic substances; and

Whereas, Longitudinal studies have shown that children who enter kindergarten are better prepared through positive, early education and care experiences. These children have a far greater chance of improved educational outcomes, higher rates of graduation, better preparedness to enter the workforce, and reduction in the need for special education, welfare, corrections, and other remedial services; and

Whereas, All sectors of society are influenced by the quality of early childhood education and care in the state, and all sectors are able to influence the quality of children's development; and

Whereas, The goals of the state of Michigan, the Legislature, and the Administration include workforce development, enhancing educational outcomes, reduction of crime, and welfare reform; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, That participants of the Ready to Learn Leadership Summit are urged to commit to developing a universal, high quality system of early childhood education and care; and be it further

Resolved, That with costs and initiative to be shared by the private and public sectors, the Summit has as its measure of success or failure the extent to which all children in Michigan enter kindergarten ready to succeed; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the organizers of the Ready to Learn Leadership Summit as a token of our support for this worthy endeavor.
