## **OVERVIEW**

The Department of Agriculture promotes agricultural interests of the state and develops safeguards to protect the public from disease and unsanitary conditions in connection with food production and food handling, product labeling, dairy products, animals, and plants. The Department's responsibilities in the field of consumer protection include enforcement of laws relating to food, standard weights and measure, farm produce storage, and dairy products; inspection and enforcement of animal health; control of plant pests and diseases; and inspection of beans and perishable fruits and vegetables. The Department is also charged with regulating Michigan's pari-mutuel horse racing industry through the Office of the Racing Commissioner, a type I agency located in the Department. The Department's mission is: "To serve, promote and protect the agricultural interests of the people of the State of Michigan."

#### Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2001-02:

#### **GENERAL SECTIONS**

**Sec. 201.** Payments to Locals. Lists state spending from state resources and state payments to local units of government. <u>House</u> updates total state spending from state resources under part 1 and state payments to units of local government reflected in the (H-1) version. <u>Senate</u> updates total state spending and payments to locals reflected in the (S-1) version. <u>Conference</u> includes total state spending and payments to locals reflective of the final conference version.

**Sec. 212. Indemnification Payments.** Allows the Department to use funds from any line item to provide indemnity of up to \$100,000 per order pursuant to the Animal Industry Act; requires a report; authorizes Department to make indemnification for fair market value of livestock killed by a wolf and allows the Department to use funds from Department of Natural Resources reimbursement for such indemnification; requires retroactive payments for certain indemnification payments; and requires TB work project funds be used.

House retains current law. Senate includes livestock killed by coyotes. Conference includes the Senate version.

**Sec. 218. Program Reports.** Requires report on programs funded under Act.

**House** updates. **Senate** does not include in substitute. **Conference** does not include.

**Sec. 221. Early Retirement.** Gives hiring priority to food and animal inspection positions as a result of early retirement. **House** includes this new language. **Senate** does not include in substitute. **Conference** does not include.

Sec. 222. Legislative Contact. Prohibits disciplinary action from being taken against an employee that communicates with the Legislature.

House includes this new language. Senate does not include in substitute. Conference does not include.

Sec. 223. Early Retirement. Requires that the early retirement savings associated with the 2002 program be transferred to the appropriate line item by November 15, 2002.

House does not include in substitute. Senate includes this new language. Conference includes leadership standard language.

#### **EXECUTIVE**

**Sec. 303. Statistical Reporting Service.** Directs use of \$120,000 in statistical reporting service for ongoing rotational crop surveys on fruit, vegetable, and nursery stock.

House retains current law. Senate changes the funding to \$90,000. Conference includes the Senate version.

Sec. 304. Animal Health Diagnostic Lab. Requires report on programs funded under Act.

House does not include in substitute. Senate includes this new language. Conference does not include.

# **FOOD & DAIRY**

Sec. 402. Food-borne Outbreaks. Requires Department to report to the Legislature significant food-borne outbreaks, including enforcement activities.

<u>House</u> retains current law, updating the years. <u>Senate</u> changes the due date month of the report from February to April. <u>Conference</u> includes Senate version.

**Sec. 405. Local Public Health Funding.** Requires the Department, in conjunction with DCH, to have a process in place requiring local units of government to obtain prior departmental approval before reallocating or redistributing program funds. **House** does not include in substitute. **Senate** retains current law, renumbering to Sec. 403. **Conference** includes Senate version.

# **PESTICIDE & PLANT PEST MANAGEMENT**

**Sec. 502. Use of Disease and Pest Intervention Funds.** Requires appropriation for disease and pest intervention fund program to be used by the Department as needed to respond to exotic or regulatory pests or diseases. **House** retains current law. **Senate** does not include in substitute. **Conference** does not include.

#### Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2001-02:

# **ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP**

**Sec. 604. Local Conservation Districts.** Allocates \$690,000 for district forestry and wildlife programs to assist with private land management; allocates \$130,000 for training; sets \$20,000 as base grant for districts meeting minimum grant requirements; and allocates remainder of funding for competitive grants, requiring at least 100% cash or in-kind local match.

House retains current law. Senate eliminates forestry funding language. Conference includes Senate version.

**Sec. 605. Open Space Development Rights Payments.** Designates the appropriation in section 106 to reimburse local units of government for lost revenues associated with open space development rights easements. Requires unspent funds to lapse to the general fund at the end of the year.

House does not include in substitute. Senate includes this new language. Conference includes Senate language.

## MARKET DEVELOPMENT

**Sec. 703. Michigan Grown Commodities.** Requires the grown in Michigan appropriation be used for competitive grants to raise in-state consumer awareness of Michigan grown commodities; grants are to be made by the Michigan Commission of Agriculture according to specified priorities; requires that grants be between \$5,000 and \$25,000; requires 50:50 cash match; requires report from the Commission of Agriculture to legislature 10 days prior to making grant.

House retains current law. Senate eliminates specific reference to funding amount. Conference does not include.

**Sec. 705.** Export Program. Allocates \$200,000 for the coordination of state participation in the federal Market Access Program and for the leveraging of federal funds for the development of new and the enhancement of existing export markets for state agriculture products.

<u>House</u> retains current law. <u>Senate</u> includes technical changes and allocates \$100,000. <u>Conference</u> includes Senate language, with \$100,000 in part 1.

#### FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS

Sec. 801. Simulcast Revenue Report. Requires monthly report on simulcasting license fee revenues.

House does not include in substitute. Senate retains current law. Conference includes Senate version.

**Sec. 802. Standardbred Purses and Supplements.** Directs use of standardbred purses and supplements – licensed tracks appropriation for four races at state licensed pari-mutuel tracks; allocates \$20,600 to Arabian/Appaloosa horse racing and \$61,900 to quarter horse racing.

<u>House</u> updates numbers as stated above. <u>Senate</u> allocates \$23,400 to Arabian and Appaloosa horse racing and \$70,100 for quarter horse racing. <u>Conference</u> includes Senate version

**Sec. 808. Youth Show.** Requires that \$11,400 from the premiums appropriation be used as a grant to the Michigan horse show association – fall youth show.

<u>House</u> does not include in substitute. <u>Senate</u> eliminates "at the Michigan exposition and fairgrounds." <u>Conference</u> includes Senate version

Sec. 810. Michigan Festivals. Allocates funding to Michigan festivals contingent on 100% cash or in-kind match.

House retains current law. Senate does not include in substitute. Conference includes Senate version

**Sec. 815.** Race Meets at County Fairs. Provides \$50,000 to race meet operators for promotions, capital improvements, or operations at race meets which are conducted on facilities leased from county fairs (Jackson, Mt. Pleasant, Saginaw).

House retains current law. Senate reduces amount to \$49,000. Conference includes Senate version

**Sec. 816. Fairs and Festivals.** Allocates \$60,000 to the Department to provide grants to the industry for statewide volunteer staff education and promotion of commodities.

House does not include in substitute. Senate includes this new language. Conference does not include.

Sec. 817. Horse Shows. Allocates \$100,000 for grants to national or international equine events held at MSU.

House does not include in substitute. Senate includes this new language. Conference does not include.
