#### HOUSE BILL NO. 4288

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 5101 and 5111 (MCL 333.5101 and 333.5111), as amended by 1994 PA 200.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5101. (1) As used in this article:
- 2 (A) "ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 3 SECTION 1 OF 1994 PA 358, MCL 287.891.
- 4 (B) "ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER" MEANS A COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL
- 5 OFFICER AS DESCRIBED IN SECTIONS 29A AND 29B OF THE DOG LAW OF
- 6 1919, 1919 PA 339, MCL 287.289A AND 287.289B, OR A CITY, VILLAGE,
- 7 OR TOWNSHIP ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 29C OF
- 8 THE DOG LAW OF 1919, 1919 PA 339, MCL 287.289C.

- 1 (C) (a) "Care" includes treatment, control,
- 2 transportation, confinement, and isolation in a facility or other
- 3 location.
- 4 (D) (b) "Communicable disease" means an illness due to a
- 5 specific infectious agent or its toxic products that results from
- 6 transmission of that infectious agent or its products from a res-
- 7 ervoir to a susceptible host, directly as from an infected indi-
- 8 vidual or animal, or indirectly through the agency of an interme-
- 9 diate plant or animal host, vector, or the inanimate
- 10 environment.
- 11 (E) (C) "HIV" means human immunodeficiency virus.
- 12 (F) (d) "HIV infection" or "HIV infected" means the status
- 13 of an individual who has tested positive for HIV, as evidenced by
- 14 either a double positive enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay test,
- 15 combined with a positive western blot assay test, or a positive
- 16 result under an HIV test that is considered reliable by the fed-
- 17 eral centers for disease control and is approved by the
- 18 department.
- 19 (G) (e) "Immunization" means the process of increasing an
- 20 individual's immunity to a disease by use of a vaccine, antibody
- 21 preparation, or other substance.
- 22 (H)  $\frac{\text{(f)}}{\text{(f)}}$  "Infection" means the invasion of the body with
- 23 microorganisms or parasites, whether or not the invasion results
- 24 in detectable pathologic effects.
- 25 (I) <del>(g)</del> "Serious communicable disease or infection" means
- 26 a communicable disease or infection that is designated as serious
- 27 by the department pursuant to this part. Serious communicable

- 1 disease or infection includes, but is not limited to, HIV
- 2 infection, acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, venereal disease,
- 3 and tuberculosis.
- 4 (J) (h) "Venereal disease" means syphilis, gonorrhea,
- 5 chancroid, lymphogranuloma venereum, granuloma inguinale, and
- 6 other sexually transmitted diseases -which THAT the department
- 7 DESIGNATES by rule may designate and require AND REQUIRES to be
- 8 reported.
- 9 (2) In addition, article 1 contains general definitions and
- 10 principles of construction applicable to all articles in this
- 11 code.
- 12 Sec. 5111. (1) In carrying out its authority under this
- 13 article, the department may promulgate rules to:
- 14 (a) Designate and classify communicable, serious communica-
- 15 ble, chronic, AND other noncommunicable diseases, infections, and
- 16 disabilities.
- 17 (b) Establish requirements for reporting and other surveil-
- 18 lance methods for measuring the occurrence of diseases, infec-
- 19 tions, and disabilities and the potential for epidemics. Rules
- 20 promulgated under this subdivision may require a licensed health
- 21 professional or health facility to submit to the department or a
- 22 local health department, on a form provided by the department, a
- 23 report of the occurrence of a communicable disease, serious com-
- 24 municable disease or infection, or disability. The rules promul-
- 25 gated under this subdivision may require a report to be submitted
- 26 to the department not more than 24 hours after a licensed health

- 1 professional or health facility determines that an individual has
- 2 a serious communicable disease or infection.
- 3 (c) Investigate cases, epidemics, and unusual occurrences of
- 4 diseases, infections, and situations with a potential for causing
- 5 diseases.
- 6 (d) Establish procedures for control of diseases and infec-
- 7 tions, including, but not limited to, immunization and environ-
- 8 mental controls.
- 9 (e) Establish procedures for the prevention, detection, and
- 10 treatment of disabilities and rehabilitation of individuals suf-
- 11 fering from disabilities or disease, including nutritional
- 12 problems.
- 13 (f) Establish procedures for control of rabies and the dis-
- 14 position of nonhuman agents carrying disease, including rabid
- 15 animals, SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3).
- 16 (g) Establish procedures for the reporting of known or sus-
- 17 pected cases of lead poisoning or undue lead body burden.
- 18 (h) Designate communicable diseases or serious communicable
- 19 diseases or infections for which local health departments are
- 20 required to furnish care including, but not limited to, tubercu-
- 21 losis and venereal disease.
- 22 (i) Implement this part and parts 52 and 53 including, but
- 23 not limited to, rules for the discovery, care, and reporting of
- 24 an individual having or suspected of having a communicable dis-
- 25 ease or a serious communicable disease or infection, and to
- 26 establish approved tests under section —5125—5123 and approved
- 27 prophylaxes under section -5127 5125.

- 1 (2) The department shall promulgate rules to provide for the
- 2 confidentiality of reports, records, and data pertaining to test-
- 3 ing, care, treatment, reporting, and research associated with
- 4 communicable diseases and serious communicable diseases or
- 5 infections. The rules shall specify the communicable diseases
- 6 and serious communicable diseases or infections covered under the
- 7 rules and shall include, but are not limited to, hepatitis B,
- 8 venereal disease, and tuberculosis. The rules shall not apply to
- 9 the serious communicable diseases or infections of HIV infection,
- 10 or acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. The department shall
- 11 submit the rules for public hearing under the administrative pro-
- 12 cedures act of 1969 by November 20, 1989.
- 13 (3) IF A LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER, LOCAL HEALTH MEDICAL DIREC-
- 14 TOR, OR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER SUBSTANTIATES THAT AN ANIMAL OTHER
- 15 THAN LIVESTOCK AS DEFINED IN SECTION 5 OF 1988 PA 466, MCL
- 16 287.705, HAS BITTEN, SCRATCHED, CAUSED ABRASIONS TO, OR CONTAMI-
- 17 NATED WITH SALIVA OR OTHER INFECTIOUS MATERIAL AN OPEN WOUND OR
- 18 MUCUS MEMBRANE OF A HUMAN BEING, THEN THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER,
- 19 LOCAL HEALTH MEDICAL DIRECTOR, OR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER MAY
- 20 ORDER THAT THE ANIMAL BE EUTHANIZED AND ITS BRAIN EXAMINED FOR
- 21 RABIES BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OF ANY QUARANTINE PERIOD IF AN IMME-
- 22 DIATE DETERMINATION OF THE RABIES STATUS OF THE ANIMAL IS
- 23 NEEDED. THE ORDER MAY BE ISSUED IN LIEU OF OBTAINING A COURT
- 24 ORDER FOR THE ANIMAL'S DESTRUCTION UNLESS IT IS KNOWN THAT THE
- 25 ANIMAL WAS CURRENTLY VACCINATED FOR RABIES WITH AN APPROVED VAC-
- 26 CINE AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT. BEFORE ISSUING SUCH AN ORDER,
- 27 THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER, LOCAL HEALTH MEDICAL DIRECTOR, OR

- 1 ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER SHALL EXAMINE THE ANIMAL FOR IDENTIFYING
- 2 INFORMATION FROM A TATTOO OR SUBCUTANEOUS MICROCHIP IF THE
- 3 ANIMAL'S OWNER IS UNKNOWN AND THE ANIMAL IS A DOG, WOLF-DOG CROSS
- 4 AS DEFINED IN SECTION 2 OF THE WOLF-DOG CROSS ACT, 2000 PA 246,
- 5 MCL 287.1002, LARGE CARNIVORE AS DEFINED IN SECTION 2 OF THE
- 6 LARGE CARNIVORE ACT, 2000 PA 274, MCL 287.1102, DOMESTIC CAT OF
- 7 THE SPECIES FELIS CATUS, OR FERRET OF THE SPECIES MUSTELA FURO.
- 8 BEFORE ISSUING SUCH AN ORDER, THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER, LOCAL
- 9 HEALTH MEDICAL DIRECTOR, OR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER SHALL CONSULT
- 10 WITH THE HUMAN BEING'S ATTENDING PHYSICIAN, THE ACCREDITED VETER-
- 11 INARIAN WHO VACCINATED THE ANIMAL FOR RABIES, IF AVAILABLE, AN
- 12 ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN OTHER THAN THE ANIMAL'S VETERINARIAN, AND
- 13 ANY AGENCY THAT HAS QUARANTINED THE ANIMAL. THE ORDER SHALL
- 14 STATE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- (i) THE NATURE AND SEVERITY OF THE INJURY. 15
- (ii) THE REASON AN IMMEDIATE DETERMINATION OF THE RABIES
- 17 STATUS OF THE ANIMAL IS NEEDED.
- (iii) THE SPECIFIC REASONS THE PARTICULAR ANIMAL MAY HAVE 18
- 19 RABIES, CONSIDERING THE SPECIES OF THE ANIMAL, THE CIRCUMSTANCES
- 20 OF THE BITE, THE EPIDEMIOLOGY OF RABIES IN THE AREA, THE ANIMAL'S
- 21 CURRENT HEALTH STATUS, AND THE POTENTIAL FOR THE ANIMAL'S EXPO-
- 22 SURE TO RABIES.
