#### HOUSE BILL NO. 5556

(As passed the Senate May 15, 2002)

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 48701 (MCL 324.48701), as added by 1995 PA 57.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 48701. As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Amphibian" means any frog, toad, or salamander of the
- 3 class amphibia.
- 4 (b) "Crustacea" means any freshwater crayfish, shrimp, or
- 5 prawn of the order decapoda.
- 6 (c) "Game fish" includes all of the following:
- 7 (i) Mackinaw or lake trout (Christivomer namaycush).
- 8 (ii) Brook or speckled trout (Salvelinus fontinalis).
- 9 (iii) Brown and Loch Leven trout (Salmo trutta).

- 1 (j) "Reptiles" means any turtle, snake, or lizard of the
- 2 class reptilia.
- 3 (k) "Resident" means either of the following:
- 4 (i) A person who resides in a settled or permanent home or
- 5 domicile with the intention of remaining in this state.
- 6 (ii) A student who is enrolled in a full-time course at a
- 7 college or university within this state.
- 8 (1) "Trout lake" means a lake DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT
- 9 in which brook trout, brown trout, or rainbow trout are the pre-
- 10 dominating species of game fish found in the lake. , and such
- 11 lakes shall be designated by the department. The department may
- 12 designate certain trout lakes in which certain species of fish
- 13 are not desired and in which it is unlawful to use live fish of
- 14 any kind for bait.
- 15 (m) "Trout stream" means any stream or portion of a stream
- 16 that contains a significant population of any species of trout or
- 17 salmon as determined by the department. The department may
- 18 SHALL designate not more than  $\frac{100}{100}$  212 miles of trout streams in
- 19 which only lures or baits as the department prescribes may be
- 20 used in fishing, and the department may prescribe the size and
- 21 number of fish that may be taken from those TROUT streams. [THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT RESTRICT CHILDREN UNDER 12 YEARS OLD FROM TAKING A MINIMUM OF 1 FISH, EXCEPT FOR STURGEON (ACIPENSER FULVESCENS), IN ANY TROUT STREAM.] ANY
- 22 TROUT STREAM IN A COUNTY THAT INCLUDES A CITY WITH A POPULATION
- 23 OF 750,000 OR MORE SHALL BE SO DESIGNATED. IN ADDITION, THE
- 24 DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE AN ORDER ADOPTING CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING
- 25 WHICH TROUT STREAMS SHOULD BE SO DESIGNATED. BEFORE THE DEPART-
- 26 MENT ISSUES THE ORDER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT THE PROPOSED
- 27 ORDER TO THE COMMISSION. THE COMMISSION SHALL RECEIVE PUBLIC H04579'01 (S-2)
