THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5101. (1) As used in this article:
- 2 (A) "ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 3 SECTION 1 OF 1994 PA 358, MCL 287.891.
- 4 (B) (B) (Care includes treatment, control, transporta-
- 5 tion, confinement, and isolation in a facility or other
- 6 location.

- 8 specific infectious agent or its toxic products that results from

- 4 (D) -(c) "HIV" means human immunodeficiency virus.

- 7 either a double positive enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay test,

- 9 position of nonhuman agents carrying disease, including rabid
- 10 animals. IF A LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER BELIEVES THAT AN ANIMAL HAS
- 11 BITTEN, SCRATCHED, CAUSED ABRASIONS TO, OR CONTAMINATED WITH
- 12 SALIVA OR OTHER INFECTIOUS MATERIAL AN OPEN WOUND OR MUCUS MEM-
- 13 BRANE OF A HUMAN BEING, A LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER MAY ORDER THAT THE
- 14 ANIMAL BE EUTHANIZED AND ITS BRAIN EXAMINED FOR RABIES BEFORE THE
- 15 EXPIRATION OF ANY QUARANTINE PERIOD ESTABLISHED BY THE
- 16 DEPARTMENT. THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER SHALL CONSULT WITH AN
- 17 ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN BEFORE ISSUING SUCH AN ORDER. THE ORDER
- 18 SHALL STATE THE REASON FOR THE ORDER, SUCH AS THE VACCINATION
- 19 STATUS OF THE ANIMAL, THE OCCURRENCE OF RABIES IN THE AREA, THE
- 20 ABSENCE OF PROVOCATION FOR THE INCIDENT, THE SEVERITY OF A WOUND,
- 21 OR A WOUND'S PROXIMITY TO THE BRAIN.
- 22 (g) Establish procedures for the reporting of known or sus-

- 24 (h) Designate communicable diseases or serious communicable

- 7 (2) The department shall promulgate rules to provide for the
- 8 confidentiality of reports, records, and data pertaining to test-
- 9 ing, care, treatment, reporting, and research associated with
- 10 communicable diseases and serious communicable diseases or
- 11 infections. The rules shall specify the communicable diseases
- 12 and serious communicable diseases or infections covered under the
- 13 rules and shall include, but are not limited to, hepatitis B,
- 14 venereal disease, and tuberculosis. The rules shall not apply to
- 15 the serious communicable diseases or infections of HIV infection,
- 16 or acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. The department shall
- 17 submit the rules for public hearing under the administrative pro-
- 18 cedures act of 1969 by November 20, 1989.
