## **HOUSE BILL No. 6551**

December 3, 2002, Introduced by Reps. Kowall and Vear and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

by amending section 479b (MCL 750.479b), as added by 1994 PA 33.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 479b. (1) An individual who takes a weapon other than
- 2 a firearm from the lawful possession of a peace officer or a cor-
- 3 rections officer is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment
- 4 for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,500.00,
  - or both, if all of the following circumstances exist at the time
- the weapon is taken:
  - (a) The individual knows or has reason to believe the person from whom the weapon is taken is a peace officer or a corrections officer.
  - (b) The peace officer or corrections officer is performing his or her duties as a peace officer or a corrections officer.

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- 1 (c) The individual takes the weapon without consent of the
- 2 peace officer or corrections officer.
- 3 (d) The peace officer or corrections officer is authorized
- 4 by his or her employer to carry the weapon in the line of duty.
- 5 (2) An individual who takes a firearm from the lawful pos-
- 6 session of a peace officer or a corrections officer is guilty of
- 7 a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 10 years or
- 8 a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both, if all of the follow-
- 9 ing circumstances exist at the time the firearm is taken:
- 10 (a) The individual knows or has reason to believe the person
- 11 from whom the firearm is taken is a peace officer or a correc-
- 12 tions officer.
- 13 (b) The peace officer or corrections officer is performing
- 14 his or her duties as a peace officer or a corrections officer.
- 15 (c) The individual takes the firearm without the consent of
- 16 the peace officer or corrections officer.
- 17 (d) The peace officer or corrections officer is authorized
- 18 by his or her employer to carry the firearm in the line of duty.
- 19 (3) This section does not prohibit an individual from being
- 20 charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation
- 21 of law that is committed by that individual while violating this
- 22 section.
- 23 (4) A term of imprisonment imposed for a violation of this
- 24 section may run consecutively to any term of imprisonment imposed
- 25 for another violation arising from the same transaction.
- 26 (5) As used in this section:

- 1 (a) "Corrections officer" means a prison or jail guard or
- 2 other employee of a jail or a state or federal correctional
- 3 facility, who performs duties involving the transportation, care,
- 4 custody, or supervision of prisoners.
- 5 (b) "Peace officer" means 1 or more of the following:
- 6 (i) A police officer of this state or a political subdivi-
- 7 sion of this state.
- 8 (ii) A police officer of any entity of the United States.
- 9 (iii) The sheriff of a county of this state or the sheriff's
- 10 deputy.
- 11 (iv) A public safety officer of a college or university who
- 12 is authorized by the governing board of that college or univer-
- 13 sity to enforce state law and the rules and ordinances of that
- 14 college or university.
- (v) A conservation officer of the department of natural
- 16 resources.
- 17 (vi) A conservation officer of the United States department
- 18 of interior.
- 19 (vii) A PRIVATE SECURITY POLICE OFFICER EMPLOYED BY A HOSPI-
- 20 TAL OR MEDICAL CENTER WHO IS AUTHORIZED BY LAW AND BY THE GOVERN-
- 21 ING BOARD OF THAT HOSPITAL OR MEDICAL CENTER TO ENFORCE THE LAWS
- 22 OF THIS STATE AND THE RULES OF THE HOSPITAL OR MEDICAL CENTER.
