A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 4104 (MCL 324.4104).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4104. (1) The department may promulgate and enforce
- 2 rules as the department considers necessary governing and provid-
- 3 ing a method of conducting and operating all or a part of sewer-
- 4 age systems including sewage treatment works.
- 5 (2) The department shall classify sewage treatment works
- 6 with regard to size, type, location, and other physical condi-
- 7 tions affecting those works and according to the skill, knowl-
- 8 edge, experience, and character that the person who is in charge
- 9 of the active operation of the sewage treatment works has to
- 10 possess in order to successfully operate the works, to prevent
- 11 the discharge of deleterious matter capable of being injurious to

- 1 the health of the people, or to other public interests. The
- 2 department shall examine or provide for the examination of per-
- 3 sons as to their qualifications to operate sewage treatment
- 4 works. The department shall promulgate rules regarding the clas-
- 5 sification of sewage treatment works, the examinations for certi-
- 6 fication of operators for those works, and the issuance and revo-
- 7 cation of certificates, and shall issue and revoke certificates
- 8 in accordance with those rules. THE DEPARTMENT'S CERTIFICATION
- 9 UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS.
- 10 (3) Every sewage treatment works subject to this part shall
- 11 be under the supervision of a properly certified operator AN
- 12 INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS A CURRENT CERTIFICATION UNDER SUBSECTION
- 13 (2), except that this section does not require the employment of
- 14 a certified operator in a waste treatment works that receives
- 15 only wastes that are not potentially prejudicial HARMFUL to the
- 16 public health.
