THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. The office shall do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Serve as a state agency authorized to administer
- 3 title IV-D.
- 4 (b) Assist a governmental agency or department in locating an
- 5 adult responsible for the child for any of the following
- 6 purposes:

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- (i) To establish parentage.
- 8 (ii) To establish, set the amount of, modify, or enforce
- 9 support obligations.

- 1 (iii) To disburse support receipts.
- 2 (iv) To make or enforce child custody or parenting time
- 3 orders.
- 4 (c) Coordinate activity on a state level in a search for an
- 5 adult responsible for the child.

- 26 Sec. 3a. (1) The office shall develop and implement a tax
- 27 refund offset program for friend of the court cases to provide

- 1 for the collection of past due support from the state and federal
- 2 income tax refunds of a parent who is obligated to support a

- 4 (2) -(1) Upon receipt of a request from the office of the
- 5 friend of the court under section 24 of the support and parenting
- 6 time enforcement act, 1982 PA 295, MCL 552.624, the office of
