

SENATE BILL No. 375

April 3, 2003, Introduced by Senator BASHAM and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 819 (MCL 257.819), as amended by 1990 PA 168.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

15 \$1,000,000.00 shall be credited to the gasoline inspection and
16 testing fund.
