SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5607

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 224 (MCL 257.224), as amended by 1995 PA 129.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 224. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act
- 2 regarding tabs or stickers, upon registering a vehicle, the
- 3 secretary of state shall issue to the owner 1 registration plate.
- 4 (2) A registration plate shall display the registration number
- 5 assigned to the vehicle for which the registration plate is issued;
- 6 the name of this state, which may be abbreviated; and when the
- 7 registration plate expires, which may be shown by a tab or sticker
- 8 furnished by the secretary of state.
- 9 (3) A registration plate issued for motor vehicles owned and
- 10 operated by this state; a state institution; a municipality; a
- 11 privately incorporated, nonprofit volunteer fire department; or a

- 1 nonpublic, nonprofit college or university of this state shall not
- 2 expire at any particular time but shall be renewed when the
- 3 registration plate is worn out or is illegible. This registration
- 4 plate shall be assigned upon proper application and payment of the
- 5 applicable fee and may be used on any eligible vehicle titled to
- 6 the applicant if a written record is kept of the vehicles upon
- 7 which the registration plate is used. The written record shall
- 8 state the time the registration plate is used on a particular
- 9 vehicle. The record shall be open to inspection by a law
- 10 enforcement officer or a representative of the secretary of state.
- 11 (4) A registration plate issued for a vehicle owned by the
- 12 civil air patrol as organized under sections 1 to 8, chapter 527,
- 13 60 Stat. 346 to 347, 36 U.S.C. 36 USC 201 to 208; a vehicle owned
- 14 by a nonprofit organization and used to transport equipment for
- 15 providing dialysis treatment to children at camp; an emergency
- 16 support vehicle used exclusively for emergencies and owned and
- 17 operated by a federally recognized nonprofit charitable
- 18 organization; a vehicle owned and operated by a nonprofit veterans
- 19 center; a motor vehicle having a truck chassis and a locomotive or
- 20 ship's body which is owned by a nonprofit veterans organization and
- 21 used exclusively in parades and civic events; a vehicle owned and
- 22 operated by a nonprofit recycling center or a federally recognized
- 23 nonprofit conservation organization until December 31, 2000; a
- 24 motor vehicle owned and operated by a senior citizen center; and a
- 25 registration plate issued for buses including station wagons,
- 26 carryalls, or similarly constructed vehicles owned and operated by
- 27 a nonprofit parents' transportation corporation used for school

- 1 purposes, parochial school, society, church Sunday school, or other
- 2 grammar school, or by a nonprofit youth organization or nonprofit
- 3 rehabilitation facility shall be issued upon proper application and
- 4 payment of the applicable —fee— TAX provided in section 801(1)(g)
- 5 or (h) to the applicant for the vehicle identified in the
- 6 application. The vehicle shall be used exclusively for activities
- 7 of the school or organization and shall be designated by proper
- 8 signs showing the school or organization operating the vehicle. The
- 9 registration plate shall expire on December 31 in the fifth year
- 10 following the date of issuance. The registration plate may be
- 11 transferred to another vehicle upon proper application and payment
- 12 of a \$10.00 transfer fee.
- 13 (5) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2007, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT ISSUE
- 14 OR TRANSFER A STANDARD DESIGN BEADS ON PAINT REGISTRATION PLATE OR
- 15 ISSUE A REGISTRATION TAB OR STICKER FOR THAT PLATE, BUT SHALL OFFER
- 16 A NEW STANDARD DESIGN REGISTRATION PLATE THAT COMPLIES WITH THE
- 17 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ACT. THE NEW STANDARD DESIGN REGISTRATION
- 18 PLATE SHALL BE OF A COMMON COLOR SCHEME AND DESIGN THAT IS MADE OF
- 19 FULLY REFLECTORIZED MATERIAL AND SHALL BE CLEARLY VISIBLE AT NIGHT.
- 20 THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBSECTION IS CONTINGENT UPON
- 21 APPROPRIATIONS SUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COSTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 22 DESIGNING, MANUFACTURING, DISTRIBUTING, AND ISSUING THE NEW
- 23 STANDARD DESIGN REGISTRATION PLATE. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL
- 24 FILE A WRITTEN REPORT WITH THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE AND THE
- 25 CLERK OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE COSTS INCURRED AND
- 26 REVENUE EXPENDED TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBSECTION WITHIN
- 27 30 DAYS AFTER ALL OF THE STANDARD DESIGN BEADS ON PAINT

- 1 REGISTRATION PLATES TO BE REPLACED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION HAVE BEEN
- 2 REPLACED.
- 3 (6) -(5) The registration plate and the required letters and
- 4 numerals on the registration plate shall be of sufficient size to
- 5 be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight.
- 6 The secretary of state may issue a tab or tabs designating the
- 7 month and year of expiration.
- 8 (7) $\overline{(6)}$ The secretary of state shall issue for every
- 9 passenger motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type of
- 10 registration plate as the type of registration plate issued for
- 11 private passenger vehicles.
- 12 (8) -(7) A person shall not operate a vehicle on the public
- 13 highways or streets of this state displaying a registration plate
- 14 other than the registration plate issued for the vehicle by the
- 15 secretary of state, except as provided in this chapter for
- 16 nonresidents, and by assignment provided in subsection (3).
- 17 (9) -(8)— The registration plate displayed on a vehicle
- 18 registered on the basis of elected gross weight shall indicate the
- 19 elected gross weight for which the vehicle is registered.
- 20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 21 unless all of the following bills of the 93rd Legislature are
