## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## SENATE BILL NO. 228

A bill to establish a loan repayment program for repayment of certain educational loans to agricultural employees in rural areas; to provide for the administration of the program; and to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state officers, agencies, and departments.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "rural
- 2 agricultural recruitment act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Agricultural commodities" includes, but is not limited
- 5 to, the products of aquaculture, hydroponics, and silviculture.
- 6 (b) "Agricultural employee" means an individual engaged in
- 7 eligible agricultural employment.
- 8 (c) "Agricultural facility" means land, or a building or other

- 1 improvement on or to land, used for agricultural processing.
- 2 (d) "Agricultural processing" means transforming, packaging,
- 3 sorting, or grading livestock or livestock products, plants or
- 4 plant products, or other agricultural commodities into goods that
- 5 are used for intermediate or final consumption, including goods for
- 6 nonfood use, or the manufacture, production, or construction of
- 7 agricultural equipment, implements, and supplies. The term
- 8 includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- 9 (i) Grain handling and processing, including grain storage,
- 10 drying, treatment, conditioning, milling, and packaging.
- 11 (ii) Seed and feed grain development and processing.
- 12 (iii) Fruit and vegetable processing, including preparation,
- 13 canning, and packaging.
- 14 (iv) Processing of livestock and livestock products, dairy
- 15 products, poultry and poultry products, fish, or apiarian products,
- 16 including slaughter, shearing, collecting, preparation, canning,
- 17 and packaging.
- 18 (v) Fertilizer and agricultural chemical manufacturing,
- 19 processing, application, and supplying.
- 20 (vi) Farm machinery, equipment, and implement manufacturing and
- 21 supplying.
- 22 (vii) Manufacturing and supplying of agricultural commodity
- 23 processing machinery and equipment, including machinery and
- 24 equipment used in slaughter, treatment, handling, collecting,
- 25 preparation, canning, or packaging of agricultural commodities.
- 26 (viii) Construction, manufacturing, implementation, supplying,
- 27 or servicing of irrigation, drainage, and soil and water

- 1 conservation devices or equipment.
- 2 (ix) Fuel processing and development for the production of fuel
- 3 from agricultural commodities or by-products.
- 4 (x) Processing and packaging of agricultural commodities
- 5 specifically for export.
- 6 (xi) Forestry product processing and supplying, including
- 7 sawmilling, wood chipping, timber harvesting, and manufacturing of
- 8 prefabricated buildings, paper, furniture, or other goods from
- 9 forestry products.
- 10 (xii) Facilities and equipment for research and development of
- 11 products, processes, and equipment for the production, processing,
- 12 preparation, or packaging of agricultural commodities and by-
- 13 products.
- 14 (e) "Approved institution" means a degree- or certificate-
- 15 granting public or independent nonprofit college or university,
- 16 junior college, or community college in this state.
- 17 (f) "Authority" means the Michigan higher education assistance
- 18 authority created by 1960 PA 77, MCL 390.951 to 390.961.
- 19 (g) "Eligible agricultural employment" means either of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (i) Full-time employment at an agricultural facility located in
- 22 a rural area.
- 23 (ii) Engaging in veterinary practice in a rural area, primarily
- 24 as a large animal veterinarian.
- 25 (h) "Eligible debt" means the total unpaid principal balance,
- 26 accrued interest, and accrued expenses owed by an agricultural
- 27 employee for qualified loans he or she obtained after July 1, 2001

- 1 to attend an associate's degree program, bachelor's degree program,
- 2 or vocational education program at an approved institution,
- 3 calculated at the time he or she first applies for a repayment
- 4 under this act.
- 5 (i) "Qualified loan" means a student loan or student loan
- 6 guarantee under any of the following programs:
- 7 (i) The federal Perkins loan program described in 34 CFR part
- 8 674.
- 9 (ii) The federal Stafford loan program described in 34 CFR part
- **10** 682
- 11 (iii) The Michigan alternative student loan program authorized
- 12 by section 4a of the higher education loan authority act, 1975 PA
- 13 222, MCL 390.1154a.
- 14 (j) "Rural area" means a county in this state that has a
- 15 population of 70,000 or less.
- 16 (k) "Vocational education program" means a postsecondary
- 17 vocational education program that awards certificates of completion
- 18 to its graduates.
- 19 Sec. 3. (1) The authority shall administer a partial repayment
- 20 program for agricultural employees who have incurred eligible debt.
- 21 After each year of continuous eligible agricultural employment, for
- 22 not more than 10 years, the authority may repay up to 2.5% of an
- 23 agricultural employee's eligible debt, or \$750.00, whichever is
- 24 less.
- 25 (2) In its sole discretion, the authority may make a pro rata
- 26 repayment of a repayment described in subsection (1) for an
- 27 agricultural employee who completes part of a year of eligible

- 1 agricultural employment, paid to the employee or his or her estate,
- 2 if 1 of the following occurs before that year of eligible
- 3 employment is completed:
- 4 (a) The employee dies.
- 5 (b) The employee is unable to continue performing eligible
- 6 agricultural employment because of a permanent disability.
- 7 (c) The authority finds other extenuating circumstances that
- 8 are considered by the authority to constitute a compelling reason
- 9 to make a pro rata repayment for that partial year of eligible
- 10 agricultural employment.
- 11 (3) The authority may accept funds from any source for the
- 12 operation of the repayment program created in subsection (1) and
- 13 shall distribute those funds in a manner consistent with this act.
- Sec. 4. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the authority may repay
- 15 eligible debt under section 3 to an individual determined by the
- 16 authority to meet all of the following eligibility criteria:
- 17 (a) He or she completed the period of continuous eligible
- 18 agricultural employment required under section 3 for the repayment.
- 19 (b) He or she received an associate degree or bachelor's
- 20 degree from an approved institution after the 2003-2004 academic
- 21 year and before beginning his or her eligible agricultural
- 22 employment.
- (c) He or she is a United States citizen or permanent resident
- 24 of the United States.
- 25 (d) He or she resided continuously in this state for the
- 26 completed period of eligible agricultural employment.
- (e) He or she is in compliance with this act and the rules

- promulgated under this act.
- 2 (f) He or she has not been convicted of a felony involving an
- 3 assault, physical injury, or death.
- 4 (g) He or she meets any other standards established in rules
- **5** promulgated by the authority under section 5.
- 6 (2) The authority shall not provide repayment of eligible debt
- 7 under this act to more than 1,000 recipients in the 2005-2006 state
- 8 fiscal year and shall not provide repayment to more than 1,000 new
- 9 recipients in each subsequent state fiscal year. Recipients shall
- 10 be selected based on the order applications are received by the
- 11 authority from eligible individuals.
- 12 Sec. 5. (1) The authority shall determine the form of an
- 13 application for repayment of eligible debt under this act and
- 14 establish an application process.
- 15 (2) The authority may promulgate rules necessary for the
- 16 implementation of the authority's functions under this act pursuant
- 17 to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 18 24.201 to 24.328. The rules may include additional standards of
- 19 eligibility for agricultural employees to receive repayment of
- 20 eligible debt under this act.
