Sec. 32. (1) There is hereby continued in IN the office of the secretary of state, the bureau of elections created by Act No. 65 of the Public Acts of 1951, FORMER 1951 PA 65 CONTINUES under the supervision of a STATE director of elections, to be appointed by the secretary of state under civil service regulations. The STATE director of elections shall be vested with the powers and shall perform the duties of the secretary of state under his supervision, with respect to the supervision and administration of the election laws. THE STATE DIRECTOR OF ELECTIONS SHALL PERFORM

- 2 OTHER DUTIES AS PRESCRIBED IN THIS ACT. The STATE director of 1 2 elections shall be a nonmember secretary of the state board of 3 canvassers. (2) The STATE director of elections -, with the approval of the state board of canvassers, shall prepare a statement for 5 designation on the ballot in not more than 100 words, exclusive of 6 caption, of the purpose of any proposed amendment or question -7 to be submitted to the electors as required under section 2 of 8 article -12 XII of the state constitution OF 1963.
