THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) A document or other object that contains the Ten
 Commandments may be displayed on public property if all of the
 following circumstances exist:
 - (a) It is displayed with other documents, public records, or objects of historical significance that have formed and influenced the legal or governmental system of the United States.
 - (b) It is displayed in the same manner as other documents, public records, or objects that are displayed at the same time and location.
 - (c) The display does not focus more attention on it than on

- 3 (2) As used in this act, "public property" means a building or
