

HOUSE BILL No. 5736

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 21, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Brown and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2007; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

PART 1

4 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

5 GENERAL SECTIONS

6 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
 7 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources
 8 under part 1 for fiscal year 2006-2007 is \$366,671,900.00 and state
 9 spending from state resources to be paid to local units of
 10 government for fiscal year 2006-2007 is \$19,899,200.00. The
 11 itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which
 12 spending to units of local government will occur:

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24 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are
 25 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
 26 to 18.1594.

1 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

2 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification
3 system.

4 (b) "Department" means the department of state police.

5 (c) "DHS" means the United States department of homeland
6 security.

7 (d) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.

8 (e) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

9 (f) "DOT" means the United States department of
10 transportation.

11 (g) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

12 (h) "FTE" means full-time equated.

13 (i) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

14 (j) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

15 (k) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

16 (l) "MCOLES" means the Michigan commission on law enforcement
17 standards.

18 (m) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

19 (n) "MDMB" means the Michigan department of management and
20 budget.

21 (o) "MDOC" means the Michigan department of corrections.

22 (p) "MDOS" means the Michigan department of state.

23 (q) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

24 (r) "MDTR" means the Michigan department of treasury.

25 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill
26 departments and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for
27 the 1% charge authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state

1 constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount
2 of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.

3 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state
4 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are
5 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
6 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state
7 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not
8 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position
9 to another within a department.

10 (2) The state budget director may grant exceptions to this
11 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the
12 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency
13 unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the
14 state, result in the inability of the state to receive federal
15 funds, or necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any
16 savings from maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director shall
17 report quarterly to the chairpersons of the senate and house of
18 representatives standing committees on appropriations the number of
19 exceptions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous
20 quarter and the reasons to justify the exception.

21 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
22 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for
23 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
24 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
25 in this bill under section 393(2) of the department of management
26 and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

27 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is

1 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state
2 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
3 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
4 in this bill under section 393(2) of the department of management
5 and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

6 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
7 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local
8 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
9 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
10 under section 393(2) of the department of management and budget
11 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

12 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
13 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private
14 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
15 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
16 under section 393(2) of the department of management and budget
17 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

18 Sec. 208. Unless otherwise specified, the department shall use
19 the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this bill.
20 This requirement may include transmission of reports via electronic
21 mail to the recipients identified for each reporting requirement,
22 or it may include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet
23 site.

24 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
25 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
26 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
27 services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to

1 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
2 businesses if they are competitively priced and of comparable
3 quality.

4 Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to
5 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
6 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
7 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department
8 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and
9 deprived communities for services, or supplies, or both.

10 Sec. 216. The department shall collect and computerize the
11 information of all vehicles that are entered into the state
12 accident data collection system and make this information available
13 to the public at cost. For bulk access to the accident records in
14 which the vehicle identification number (VIN) has been collected
15 and computerized, the department shall make those records available
16 to the public at cost, provided that the name and address have been
17 excluded. Revenue collected under this section shall be used for
18 the collection, validation, storage and dissemination of accident
19 data.

20 Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this
21 state, out-of-state travel for the fiscal year ending September 30,
22 2007 shall be limited to situations in which 1 or more of the
23 following conditions apply:

24 (a) The travel is required by legal mandate or court order or
25 for law enforcement purposes.

26 (b) The travel is necessary to protect the health or safety of
27 Michigan citizens or visitors or to assist other states in similar

1 circumstances.

2 (c) The travel is necessary to produce budgetary savings or to
3 increase state revenues, including protecting existing federal
4 funds or securing additional federal funds.

5 (d) The travel is necessary to comply with federal
6 requirements.

7 (e) The travel is necessary to secure specialized training for
8 staff that is not available within this state.

9 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate
10 funds.

11 (2) If out-of-state travel is necessary but does not meet 1 or
12 more of the conditions in subsection (1), the state budget director
13 may grant an exception to allow the travel. Any exceptions granted
14 by the state budget director shall be reported on a monthly basis
15 to the senate and house of representatives standing committees on
16 appropriations.

17 (3) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department
18 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and
19 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
20 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
21 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
22 submitted to the chairs and members of the senate and house of
23 representatives standing committees on appropriations, the fiscal
24 agencies, and the state budget director. The report shall include
25 the following information:

26 (a) The name of each person receiving reimbursement for travel
27 outside this state or whose travel costs were paid by this state.

1 (b) The destination of each travel occurrence.

2 (c) The dates of each travel occurrence.

3 (d) A brief statement of the reason for each travel
4 occurrence.

5 (e) The transportation and related costs of each travel
6 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general
7 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state
8 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,
9 and the proportion funded with other revenues.

10 (f) A total of all out-of-state travel funded for the
11 immediately preceding fiscal year.

12 **INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

13 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer
14 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of
15 the service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN system.

16 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
17 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user
18 fees to the department of information technology for technology-
19 related services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to
20 provisions of an interagency agreement between the departments and
21 agencies and the department of information technology.

22 Sec. 303. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information
23 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward
24 to support technology projects under the direction of the
25 department of information technology. Funds designated in this
26 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work

1 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984
2 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.

3 **HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING**

4 Sec. 401. Before January 1, 2007, the department shall report
5 to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state
6 police and military and veterans affairs on the status of
7 assessments collected and authorized under section 629e of the
8 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes
9 of supporting the secondary road patrol grant program. Each annual
10 report shall contain updated information on collection levels,
11 revised projected grant allotments to counties for the year, a
12 comparison of projected collections and grant distribution levels
13 with the funds appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol
14 program, and the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed
15 to meet appropriated levels for the preceding fiscal year or
16 expenditure levels from the previous fiscal year.

17 **FORENSIC SCIENCES**

18 Sec. 501. (1) When changes are made to the department's
19 protocol for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and
20 records, the department shall provide a copy to every police agency
21 in the state.

22 **MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS**

23 Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance
24 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a

1 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state
2 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the
3 MCOLES.

4 **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

5 Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may
6 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency
7 or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect
8 life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the
9 population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims
10 a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL
11 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390,
12 MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management
13 may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to
14 accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state
15 budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all
16 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
17 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that
18 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director
19 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the
20 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental
21 appropriation.

22 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the
23 department may receive and expend money from local, private,
24 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency
25 management training to local or private interests and for the
26 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,

1 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in
2 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
3 state budget office under this section, there is appropriated an
4 amount sufficient to cover the expenditures and the department and
5 the state budget office shall notify the house and senate
6 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
7 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
8 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
9 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
10 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
11 authorization.

12 POST UNIFORM SERVICES

13 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
14 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan
15 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited
16 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency
17 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of
18 this state from harm.

19 STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS

20 Sec. 1001. In addition to the appropriations in part 1 to the
21 department of state police for the aviation program, the department
22 is authorized to sell its aircraft and the proceeds from the sale
23 are appropriated and may be applied to the renovation cost of
24 replacement aircraft, cost of enhancing and maintaining existing
25 aircraft, pilot training cost, and reimbursement for use of other

1 state agency aircraft. If additional expenditure authorization in
2 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
3 state budget office under this section, the department and the
4 state budget office shall notify the house and senate
5 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
6 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
7 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
8 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
9 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
10 authorization.

11 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is
12 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by
13 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's
14 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to
15 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
