## **HOUSE BILL No. 6585**

September 20, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Pastor, Kooiman and Stahl and referred to the Committee on Family and Children Services.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act,"

by amending section 57a (MCL 400.57a), as amended by 1999 PA 26.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 57a. (1) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT**
- 2 shall establish and administer the family independence program to
- 3 provide assistance to families who are making efforts to achieve
- 4 independence.
- 5 (2) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall
- administer the family independence program to accomplish all of thefollowing:
  - (a) Provide financial support to eligible families while they pursue self-improvement activities and engage in efforts to become financially independent.
    - (b) Ensure that recipients who are minor parents live in

- 1 adult-supervised households in order to reduce long-term dependency
- 2 on financial assistance.
- 3 (c) Assist families in determining and overcoming the barriers
- 4 preventing them from achieving financial independence.
- 5 (d) Ensure that families pursue other sources of support
- 6 available to them.
- 7 (3) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall
- 8 establish income and asset levels for eligibility, types of income
- 9 and assets to be considered in making eligibility determinations,
- 10 payment standards, composition of the program group and the family
- 11 independence assistance group, program budgeting and accounting
- 12 methods, and client reporting requirements to meet the following
- 13 qoals:
- 14 (a) Efficient, fair, cost-effective administration of the
- 15 family independence program.
- 16 (b) Provision of family independence assistance to families
- 17 willing to work toward eventual self-sufficiency.
- 18 (4) AT THE TIME THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES AN INDIVIDUAL IS
- 19 ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE UNDER
- 20 THIS ACT, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER THAT INDIVIDUAL IS
- 21 ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK FIRST PROGRAM OR IF THE
- 22 INDIVIDUAL IS EXEMPT FROM WORK FIRST PARTICIPATION UNDER SECTION
- 23 57F. IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT AN INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE TO
- 24 PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK FIRST PROGRAM, FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM
- 25 ASSISTANCE SHALL BE PAID TO THAT INDIVIDUAL FOR NOT LONGER THAN A
- 26 CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF 48 MONTHS AFTER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE
- 27 STATE'S TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM ON OCTOBER

- 1 1, 1996. ANY MONTH IN WHICH THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN THE COUNTY IN
- 2 WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL RESIDES IS HIGHER THAN 10% DOES NOT COUNT
- 3 TOWARD THE CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF 48 MONTHS FOR FAMILY INDEPENDENCE
- 4 PROGRAM ASSISTANCE. ANY MONTH IN WHICH AN INDIVIDUAL IS TEMPORARILY
- 5 DEFERRED FROM WORK FIRST PARTICIPATION DOES NOT COUNT TOWARD THE
- 6 CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF 48 MONTHS IN A LIFETIME FOR FAMILY INDEPENDENCE
- 7 PROGRAM ASSISTANCE.
- 8 (5) ON DECEMBER 31, 2006, IF A FAMILY INDEPENDENCE ASSISTANCE
- 9 PROGRAM GROUP CONTAINING AN INDIVIDUAL THAT THE DEPARTMENT HAS
- 10 DETERMINED IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK FIRST PROGRAM HAS
- 11 RECEIVED FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE FOR A CUMULATIVE
- 12 TOTAL OF AT LEAST 24 MONTHS AFTER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE STATE'S
- 13 TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM ON OCTOBER 1, 1996,
- 14 THAT PROGRAM GROUP IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE 48-MONTH LIMITATION
- 15 OUTLINED IN SUBSECTION (4). FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE
- 16 SHALL BE PAID TO THAT PROGRAM GROUP FOR NOT LONGER THAN A
- 17 CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF 36 MONTHS AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2006.
- 18 (6) IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT AN INDIVIDUAL IS
- 19 ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK FIRST PROGRAM, FAMILY
- 20 INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE SHALL NOT BE PAID TO THAT
- 21 INDIVIDUAL'S PROGRAM GROUP FOR LONGER THAN 24 CONSECUTIVE MONTHS
- 22 DURING ANY PERIOD STARTING WITH THE FIRST PAYMENT RECEIVED AFTER
- 23 DECEMBER 31, 2006.
- 24 (7) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION PREVENTS THE DEPARTMENT FROM
- 25 PROVIDING FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE TO PROGRAM GROUPS
- 26 IN WHICH ADULT RECIPIENTS ARE DETERMINED TO BE EXEMPT UNDER SECTION
- 27 56I(1)(C) OR 57F(3).

- 1 (8) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REASSESS THE RECIPIENT'S ELIGIBILITY
- 2 FOR FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE NOT LATER THAN 24 MONTHS
- 3 AFTER THE DATE THE APPLICATION FOR FAMILY INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM
- 4 ASSISTANCE WAS APPROVED.
- 5 (9) -(4) Not later than October 1, 2001, the -family
- 6 independence agency DEPARTMENT shall implement an automated finger
- 7 imaging system designed to prevent an individual from receiving
- 8 cash assistance, food stamps, or both under more than 1 name.
- 9 Beginning at the effective date of the establishment and
- 10 implementation of the finger imaging system, an individual applying
- 11 for cash assistance, food stamps, or both must provide the -family
- 12 independence agency DEPARTMENT with an automated finger image or
- 13 images as a condition of eligibility. Finger imaging obtained
- 14 pursuant to UNDER this subsection shall be used only for the
- 15 purposes of reducing fraud in obtaining public benefits or
- 16 assistance under this act.
- 17 (10) -(5) The -family independence agency DEPARTMENT shall
- 18 establish the automated finger image system that, at a minimum,
- 19 includes the following:
- 20 (a) Confidentiality of the automated finger image records
- 21 taken <del>pursuant</del> ACCORDING to this section.
- 22 (b) A system for administrative appeal of a matter relating to
- 23 the taking or verification of an individual's automated finger
- 24 image.
- 25 (c) A requirement to exempt children from providing the
- 26 automated finger image unless there is a reasonable suspicion that
- 27 the family group is committing fraud. For the purpose of this

- 1 subdivision, "family group" means a family and all those
- 2 individuals living with a family who apply for or receive cash
- 3 assistance, food stamps, or both.
- 4 (d) A requirement to exempt individuals from whom the
- 5 automated finger image technology is unable to obtain an accurate
- 6 finger image.
- 7 (e) A requirement to exempt patients placed in nursing homes
- 8 from providing the automated finger image.
- 9 (f) In addition to the population groups named in subdivisions
- 10 (c), (d), and (e), authority to exempt certain other population
- 11 groups from providing the automated finger image including, but not
- 12 limited to, homebound recipients.
- 13 (11) -(6) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall
- 14 remove an individual's finger image from the department's file if
- 15 the individual has not received benefits or assistance from the
- 16 family independence agency DEPARTMENT within the previous 12
- months.
- 18 (12) (7) The -family independence agency DEPARTMENT may
- 19 negotiate and enter into a compact or reciprocal agreement with
- 20 another state department, the federal government, an agency of the
- 21 federal government, or an agency of another state for the purpose
- 22 of implementing and administering the finger imaging provisions of
- 23 this section as long as the compact or reciprocal agreement is not
- 24 inconsistent with the limitations of use and access contained in
- 25 subsection -(4) (9).
- 26 (13) -(8) The -family independence agency DEPARTMENT shall
- 27 conduct -semi-annual SEMIANNUAL security reviews to monitor the

- 1 automated finger imaging system to insure that all of the following
- 2 occur:
- 3 (a) All records maintained as part of the system are accurate
- 4 and complete.
- 5 (b) Effective software and hardware designs have been
- 6 instituted with security features to prevent unauthorized access to
- 7 records.
- 8 (c) Access to record information is restricted to authorized
- 9 personnel.
- 10 (d) System and operational programs are used that will
- 11 prohibit inquiry, record updates, or destruction of records from a
- 12 terminal other than automated finger imaging system terminals that
- 13 are designated to permit inquiry, record updates, or destruction of
- 14 records.
- 15 (e) System and operational programs are used to detect and
- 16 report all unauthorized attempts to penetrate an automated finger
- imaging system, program, or file.
- 18 (14)  $\overline{(9)}$  Beginning December 31 of the first year the
- 19 automated finger imaging system has been fully implemented, the
- 20 family independence agency DEPARTMENT shall compile and report
- 21 annually to the senate and house committees having jurisdiction
- 22 over <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** matters the following
- 23 information concerning the operation of the automated finger
- 24 imaging system:
- 25 (a) An analysis of the costs and savings of the system
- 26 including, but not limited to, administrative costs, operation
- 27 costs, and actual savings due to confirmed fraud and fraud

- 1 deterrence.
- 2 (b) The number of individuals who have applied for assistance
- 3 under more than 1 name.
- 4 (c) The number of individuals refusing to provide a finger
- 5 image and the reasons for the refusal.
- 6 (d) A detailed summary of the results of reviews required by
- 7 subsection  $\frac{(8)}{(13)}$ .
- 8 (15)  $\overline{(10)}$  Except as necessary to carry out a compact or
- 9 agreement under subsection -(7) (12) or unless otherwise required
- 10 by law, the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall not sell,
- 11 transfer, or release information identifying an individual named in
- 12 the automated finger imaging system record to a third person,
- 13 including, but not limited to, another state department or agency.
- 14 (16) -(11) A person shall not disclose information from the
- 15 automated finger imaging system record in a manner that is not
- 16 authorized by law or rule. A violation of this subsection is a
- 17 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or
- 18 a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 19 (17) -(12) At the time an individual applies for cash
- 20 assistance, food stamps, or both, the <u>family independence agency</u>
- 21 **DEPARTMENT** shall inform the individual of all of the following:
- 22 (a) The requirement to allow the department to take a finger
- 23 image from the individual.
- 24 (b) The fact that the finger image may be compared to the
- 25 finger images of other benefit recipients to prevent duplicate
- 26 participation.
- 27 (c) The fact that the department is prohibited by law from

- 1 using the finger image for a different purpose.
- 2 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 3 unless all of the following bills of the 93rd Legislature are
- 4 enacted into law:
