## HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 1084

A bill to authorize the removal, capture, or lethal control of a gray wolf that is preying upon a dog under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties; and to promulgate rules.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Department" means the department of natural resources.
- 3 (b) "Dog" includes a domesticated dog and a dog used for
- 4 hunting.
- 5 Sec. 3. (1) The owner of a dog or his or her designated agent
- 6 may remove, capture, or, if deemed necessary, use lethal means to
- 7 destroy a gray wolf that is in the act of preying upon the owner's
- 8 dog.
- 9 (2) The owner of the dog or his or her designated agent shall

- 1 report the taking of a gray wolf to a department official as soon
- 2 as practicable, but not later than 12 hours after the taking. A
- 3 person who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor
- 4 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of
- 5 not less than \$100.00 or more than \$1,000.00, or both, and the
- 6 costs of prosecution.
- 7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4), the owner
- 8 of the dog or his or her designated agent shall retain possession
- 9 of a gray wolf taken until a department official is available to
- 10 take possession of and transfer the gray wolf to the appropriate
- 11 department personnel for examination. A person who violates this
- 12 subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment
- 13 for not more than 90 days or a fine of not less than \$100.00 or
- 14 more than \$1,000.00, or both, and the costs of prosecution.
- 15 (4) If lethal means are used to destroy a gray wolf, a person
- 16 shall not move or disturb the deceased gray wolf until a department
- 17 official is available to take possession of and transfer the gray
- 18 wolf to the appropriate department personnel for examination or
- 19 until as otherwise directed by a department official. A person
- 20 shall not disturb the area where lethal means were used to destroy
- 21 a gray wolf until after an official investigation by the department
- 22 is complete. If a dog is physically attacked or killed, a person
- 23 who uses lethal means to destroy a gray wolf shall produce the dog
- 24 that was attacked for inspection by department officials. A person
- 25 who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable
- 26 by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not less
- 27 than \$100.00 or more than \$1,000.00, or both, and the costs of

- 1 prosecution.
- 2 (5) A department official shall respond to the scene where
- 3 lethal means were used to destroy a gray wolf not later than 12
- 4 hours after the department official is notified under subsection
- **5** (2).
- 6 (6) The owner of the dog or his or her designated agent may
- 7 report the taking of a gray wolf by utilizing the department's
- 8 report all poaching hotline at 1-800-292-7800.
- 9 Sec. 5. The department may promulgate rules to implement this
- 10 act pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA
- 11 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328.
- Sec. 7. (1) Sections 1 to 5 shall not be operational and
- 13 enforceable until 1 of the following occurs:
- 14 (a) A final appellate court issues a decision overruling the
- 15 decision of the United States district court for the District of
- 16 Columbia in The Humane Society of the United States v Dirk
- 17 Kempthorne, civil action no. 07-0677 (D.C.C. September 29, 2008),
- 18 and permits the final rule of the United States fish and wildlife
- 19 service in 72 FR p. 6052 (February 8, 2007) removing gray wolves
- 20 located in this state from the list of endangered and threatened
- 21 wildlife established under the federal endangered species act of
- 22 1973 to take effect.
- 23 (b) The United States fish and wildlife service promulgates a
- 24 final rule dated after March 12, 2007 that removes gray wolves
- 25 located in this state from the list of endangered and threatened
- 26 wildlife established under the federal endangered species act of
- 27 1973 and that final rule takes effect.

- 1 (2) Upon sections 1 to 5 becoming operational and enforceable
- 2 pursuant to subsection (1), the department shall post a notice on
- 3 the department's website that includes all of the following:
- 4 (a) The date sections 1 to 5 are operational and enforceable
- **5** pursuant to subsection (1).
- 6 (b) A summary of the provisions of sections 1 to 5.
- 7 Enacting section 1. If any federal or state litigation
- 8 overturns the decision to remove gray wolves from the list of
- 9 endangered species, the Michigan department of natural resources
- 10 shall report the impact of that litigation on this act to the
- 11 standing committees of the legislature with jurisdiction over
- 12 issues primarily dealing with natural resources and the
- 13 environment.
