## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## HOUSE BILL NO. 6035

## A bill to amend 1869 PA 12, entitled

"An act to authorize and encourage the formation of corporations to establish rural cemeteries; to provide for the care and maintenance thereof; to provide for the revision and codification of the laws relating to cemeteries, mausoleums, crypts, vaults, crematoriums, and other means of disposing of the dead; to make an appropriation therefor; and to impose certain duties upon the department of commerce,"

by amending section 7a (MCL 456.107a), as amended by 2003 PA 90.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7a. (1) The fund required to be set aside under section 7
- 2 for perpetual care regarding cemeteries established after March 10,
- 3 1967, or mausoleums which are not located in the confines of a
- 4 dedicated cemetery and are established after March 10, 1967, shall
- 5 be created by the deposit of \$25,000.00 \$75,000.00 into the fund
- 6 before any sale of burial rights, entombment rights or columbarium
- 7 rights is made.
- 8 (2) With respect to all cemeteries or mausoleums, whether

- 1 established before or after March 10, 1967, the fund shall be added
- 2 to by payment, perpetually, each month of not less than 15% of all
- 3 proceeds received during the previous month from the sales of
- 4 burial rights, entombment rights, or columbarium rights made after
- 5 March 10, 1967. No total deposit for a single adult burial right
- 6 sale or assignment shall be less than \$20.00. Notwithstanding the
- 7 minimum amount required to be paid into the endowment fund from the
- 8 proceeds of sales of lots or burial rights, any cemetery that has
- 9 an endowment fund of more than \$125,000.00 \$750,000.00 and
- 10 exceeding \$10,000.00 \$60,000.00 per acre of the developed portion
- 11 of the cemetery, may apply to the cemetery commission COMMISSIONER
- 12 for a waiver of the 15% or \$20.00 minimum requirement. The cemetery
- 13 commission COMMISSIONER shall take testimony and investigate as it
- 14 considers advisable pursuant to the application. If the cemetery
- 15 commission COMMISSIONER determines that the applicant has an
- 16 endowment fund of more than \$125,000.00 \$750,000.00 and exceeding
- 17 \$10,000.00 \$60,000.00 per acre of the developed portion of the
- 18 cemetery and that the income from the fund is sufficient to meet
- 19 the then current cost of keeping the applicant's cemetery in good
- 20 condition, it shall grant a waiver of the 15% and \$20.00 minimum
- 21 requirement and it shall grant appropriate modifications with
- 22 respect to contributions to the fund.
- 23 (3) No portion of the funds required to be set aside under
- 24 section 7 shall be used directly or indirectly for salaries of the
- 25 officers or directors of the cemetery association or corporation
- 26 and only the earnings from the funds shall be used for perpetual
- **27** care.

- 1 (4) The endowment care fund may be administered by the board
- 2 of directors itself, or by the trustees, individual or corporate,
- 3 as it may select under the terms of a trust instrument or
- 4 declaration. If it selects trustees to administer the fund, its
- 5 liability shall be limited to reasonable care in the selection.
- 6 Directors may serve as trustees if at least 2 members of the board
- 7 are selected.
- 8 (5) The funds established under this section shall be invested
- 9 subject to section 7302 of the estates and protected individuals
- 10 code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.7302, AND ARE SUBJECT TO THE
- 11 PRESCRIPTIONS OF THE CEMETERY REGULATION ACT, 1968 PA 251, MCL
- 12 456.521 TO 456.543.
- 13 (6) In addition to all other remedies at law or in equity that
- 14 any interested party may have, the attorney general and the circuit
- 15 court of the county in which the cemetery is located shall have all
- 16 the powers and jurisdiction granted to the attorney general and
- 17 court as to trusts covered by 1915 PA 280, MCL 554.351 to 554.353.
- 18 The remedies granted include all endowment care fund trusts without
- 19 regard to uncertainty or indefiniteness of its beneficiaries.
- 20 (7) As used in this section, "perpetual care" means all
- 21 general work necessary to keep the cemetery property in a
- 22 presentable condition at all times, including, but not limited to,
- 23 the cutting of grass at reasonable intervals; raking, cleaning,
- 24 filling, seeding, and sodding of graves; replacement, pruning, or
- 25 removal of shrubs and trees in order to assure access to interment
- 26 rights; and the repair and maintenance of enclosures, buildings,
- 27 drives, walks, and the various memorial gardens.

- 1 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- unless House Bill No. 6033 of the 94th Legislature is enacted into 2
- law. 3
