SENATE BILL No. 1233

March 25, 2008, Introduced by Senators BASHAM and CASSIS and referred to the Committee on Economic Development and Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 2405 (MCL 339.2405), as amended by 2007 PA 157.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2405. (1) If a license is applied for by a corporation,
- 2 partnership, association, limited liability company, or other
- 3 entity, the applicant shall designate 1 of its officers, partners,
- 4 members, or managing agent as a qualifying officer who, upon taking
- 5 and passing the examination, and upon meeting all other

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- 6 requirements of this article, is entitled to a license to act for
- 7 the corporation, partnership, association, limited liability
- 8 company, or other entity. The qualifying officer shall also obtain
- 9 and maintain a license under this article as an individual BY JUNE
- 10 1, 2011. The qualifying officer shall be responsible for exercising
- 11 the supervision or control of the building or construction

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- 1 operations necessary to secure full compliance with this article
- 2 and the rules promulgated under this article. A license shall not
- 3 be issued to a corporation, partnership, association, limited
- 4 liability company, or other entity unless each partner, trustee,
- 5 director, officer, member, and a person exercising control is at
- 6 least 18 years of age, and meets the requirements for a license
- 7 under this article other than those relating to knowledge and
- 8 experience. If an individual licensee is also a qualifying officer,
- 9 the individual's name and license number shall be listed on any
- 10 license issued to the individual as a qualifying officer. In the
- 11 case of a license issued under this subsection, each officer,
- 12 partner, member, or managing agent, whether or not he or she is the
- 13 qualifying officer, shall provide a copy of his or her operator's
- 14 license or state personal identification card to the department for
- 15 use by the department only for identification purposes. A licensee
- 16 granted inactive status under section 2404b is not eligible to
- 17 serve as a qualifying officer.
- 18 (2) The license of a corporation, partnership, association,
- 19 limited liability company, or other entity shall be suspended when
- 20 a license or license application of a qualifying officer, partner,
- 21 trustee, director, officer, member, or a person exercising control
- 22 of the corporation, partnership, association, limited liability
- 23 company, or other entity is suspended, revoked, or denied. The
- 24 suspension shall remain in force until the board determines that
- 25 the disability created by the suspension, revocation, or denial has
- 26 been removed.
- 27 (3) A suspension, revocation, or denial of a license of an

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- 1 individual shall suspend, revoke, or deny any other license held or
- 2 applied for by that individual issued under this article. A
- 3 suspension, revocation, or denial of a license by the department
- 4 shall suspend, revoke, or deny any other license held or applied
- 5 for under this article by the qualifying officer of a corporation,
- 6 partnership, association, limited liability company, or other
- 7 entity whose license is suspended, revoked, or denied.
- 8 (4) If the qualifying officer of a licensee ceases to be its
- 9 qualifying officer, the license is suspended. However, upon
- 10 request, the department may permit the license to remain in force
- 11 for a reasonable time to permit the qualification of a new
- 12 qualifying officer.
