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## **HOUSE BILL No. 4340**

February 28, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Wojno and Hood and referred to the Committee on Labor.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending section 21513 (MCL 333.21513), as amended by 2002 PA 125, and by adding section 21525.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 21513. The owner, operator, and governing body of a
- 2 hospital licensed under this article:
- 3 (a) Are responsible for all phases of the operation of the
- 4 hospital, selection of the medical staff, and quality of care
- 5 rendered in the hospital.
- 6 (b) Shall cooperate with the department in the enforcement of
  - this part, and require that the physicians, dentists, and other
  - personnel working in the hospital who are required to be licensed

- 1 or registered are in fact currently licensed or registered.
- 2 (c) Shall assure that physicians and dentists admitted to
- 3 practice in the hospital are granted hospital privileges consistent
- 4 with their individual training, experience, and other
- 5 qualifications.
- 6 (d) Shall assure that physicians and dentists admitted to
- 7 practice in the hospital are organized into a medical staff to
- 8 enable an effective review of the professional practices in the
- 9 hospital for the purpose of reducing morbidity and mortality and
- 10 improving the care provided in the hospital for patients. The
- 11 review shall include the quality and necessity of the care provided
- 12 and the preventability of complications and deaths occurring in the
- 13 hospital.
- (e) Shall not discriminate because of race, religion, color,
- 15 national origin, age, or sex in the operation of the hospital
- 16 including employment, patient admission and care, room assignment,
- 17 and professional or nonprofessional selection and training
- 18 programs, and shall not discriminate in the selection and
- 19 appointment of individuals to the physician staff of the hospital
- 20 or its training programs on the basis of licensure or registration
- 21 or professional education as doctors of medicine, osteopathic
- 22 medicine and surgery, or podiatry.
- 23 (f) Shall assure that the hospital adheres to medical control
- 24 authority protocols according to section 20918.
- 25 (g) Shall assure that the hospital develops and maintains a
- 26 plan for biohazard detection and handling.
- 27 (H) SHALL ASSURE THAT THE HOSPITAL DEVELOPS AND MAINTAINS A

- 1 STAFFING PLAN ACCORDING TO SECTION 21525.
- 2 SEC. 21525. (1) THE DEPARTMENT MAY REFUSE TO LICENSE A
- 3 HOSPITAL UNDER THIS PART IF THE HOSPITAL FAILS TO DEVELOP AN ACUITY
- 4 SYSTEM THAT IS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR TO SUBMIT AN ANNUAL
- 5 STAFFING PLAN AS PRESCRIBED UNDER THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT
- 6 SHALL PROMULGATE RULES PRESCRIBING THE PROCESS FOR APPROVING A
- 7 HOSPITAL'S ACUITY SYSTEM AND STAFFING PLAN AND ANY OTHER RULES
- 8 REASONABLY NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES UNDER
- 9 THIS SECTION.
- 10 (2) THE STAFFING PLAN SHALL BE BASED ON REASONABLE PROJECTIONS
- 11 DERIVED FROM THE PATIENT CENSUS AND NURSING CARE NEEDS WITHIN EACH
- 12 HOSPITAL UNIT FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR AND SHALL TAKE INTO
- 13 CONSIDERATION ANY FORESEEABLE CHANGES WITHIN THE HOSPITAL UNIT FOR
- 14 THE NEXT YEAR. THE STAFFING PLAN SHALL INCLUDE, AT A MINIMUM, THE
- 15 FOLLOWING NURSE-TO-PATIENT RATIOS:
- 16 (A) ONE NURSE FOR EACH PATIENT IN AN OPERATING ROOM OR TRAUMA
- 17 EMERGENCY UNIT.
- 18 (B) ONE NURSE FOR EVERY 2 PATIENTS IN EACH CRITICAL CARE UNIT
- 19 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A LABOR AND DELIVERY UNIT OR A
- 20 POSTANESTHESIA UNIT.
- 21 (C) ONE NURSE FOR EVERY 3 PATIENTS IN AN ANTEPARTUM, EMERGENCY
- 22 ROOM, PEDIATRICS, STEP-DOWN, OR TELEMETRY UNIT.
- 23 (D) ONE NURSE FOR EVERY 4 PATIENTS IN AN INTERMEDIATE CARE
- 24 NURSERY OR A MEDICAL, SURGICAL, OR ACUTE CARE PSYCHIATRIC UNIT.
- 25 (E) ONE NURSE FOR EVERY 5 PATIENTS IN A REHABILITATION UNIT.
- 26 (F) ONE NURSE FOR EVERY 6 PATIENTS IN A POSTPARTUM OR WELL-
- 27 BABY NURSERY UNIT.

- 1 (3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ESTABLISH MINIMUM NURSE-TO-PATIENT
- 2 RATIOS FOR ANY OTHER HOSPITAL UNIT NOT INCLUDED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 3 (2).
- 4 (4) A HOSPITAL SHALL POST IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE READILY
- 5 ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC A NOTICE THAT IS DEVELOPED AND PROVIDED BY
- 6 THE DEPARTMENT AND THAT OUTLINES THE MANDATORY MINIMUM NURSE-TO-
- 7 PATIENT RATIOS REQUIRED TO BE MAINTAINED UNDER THIS SECTION. THE
- 8 NOTICE SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION ABOUT THE CONFIDENTIAL REPORTING
- 9 SYSTEM ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (6). UPON REQUEST, THE HOSPITAL
- 10 SHALL PROVIDE COPIES OF THE STAFFING PLAN FILED WITH THE DEPARTMENT
- 11 TO THE PUBLIC.
- 12 (5) EACH HOSPITAL UNIT SHALL MAINTAIN A DAILY LOG THAT
- 13 REFLECTS THE NUMBER OF PATIENTS ADMITTED, RELEASED, AND PRESENT IN
- 14 THE UNIT, THE ACUITY LEVEL OF THE PATIENTS IN THE UNIT, THE NUMBER
- 15 OF REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSES AND LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES ON
- 16 DUTY IN THE UNIT, AND THE AVERAGE NURSE-TO-PATIENT RATIO FOR THAT
- 17 DAY. THESE RECORDS SHALL BE RETAINED FOR A PERIOD OF 7 YEARS AND
- 18 SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE PUBLIC UPON
- 19 REQUEST, PROVIDED THAT THE INFORMATION RELEASED COMPLIES WITH
- 20 APPLICABLE STATE AND FEDERAL PRIVACY LAWS AND REGULATIONS.
- 21 (6) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A CONFIDENTIAL
- 22 SYSTEM THAT IS AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC FOR REPORTING A HOSPITAL'S
- 23 FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ITS STAFFING PLAN OR ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS
- 24 UNDER THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INVESTIGATE EACH COMPLAINT
- 25 RECEIVED AND SHALL NOTIFY THE COMPLAINANT IN WRITING OF THE RESULTS
- 26 OF A REVIEW OR INVESTIGATION OF THE COMPLAINT AND ANY ACTION
- 27 PROPOSED TO BE TAKEN. IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT A HOSPITAL

- 1 FAILED TO MAINTAIN ITS STAFF IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STAFFING PLAN
- 2 AND STAFFING STANDARDS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION, THE
- 3 DEPARTMENT MAY ASSESS THE HOSPITAL AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE OF NOT
- 4 MORE THAN \$1,000.00 FOR EACH VIOLATION OR FOR EACH DAY THAT THE
- 5 VIOLATION CONTINUES.
- 6 (7) IF A HOSPITAL FAILS TO SUBMIT AN ANNUAL STAFFING PLAN AS
- 7 REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ASSESS THE
- 8 HOSPITAL AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE OF UP TO \$10,000.00 FOR EACH
- 9 VIOLATION AND, IF THE STAFFING PLAN REMAINS UNFILED, FOR EACH DAY
- 10 OF CONTINUED NONCOMPLIANCE.
- 11 (8) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 12 (A) "ACUITY SYSTEM" MEANS A SYSTEM ESTABLISHED TO MEASURE AND
- 13 PREDICT THE HOSPITAL'S NURSING CARE NEEDS FOR ITS PATIENTS IN EACH
- 14 HOSPITAL UNIT BASED ON THE SEVERITY OF THE ILLNESSES, THE NEED FOR
- 15 SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY, THE INTENSITY OF NURSING
- 16 INTERVENTIONS REQUIRED, AND THE COMPLEXITY OF THE CLINICAL JUDGMENT
- 17 NEEDED TO DESIGN, IMPLEMENT, AND EVALUATE A PATIENT CARE PLAN. IT
- 18 SHALL INCLUDE A MEANS TO ADDRESS FLUCTUATIONS IN PATIENT LEVELS AND
- 19 NURSING CARE NEEDS DUE TO OTHER HOSPITAL UNIT ACTIVITY INCLUDING,
- 20 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DISCHARGES, TRANSFERS, AND ADMISSIONS.
- 21 (B) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH.
- 22 (C) "HOSPITAL UNIT" MEANS EACH PATIENT CARE COMPONENT WITHIN A
- 23 HOSPITAL.
- 24 (D) "STAFFING PLAN" MEANS A WRITTEN PLAN THAT ESTABLISHES THE
- 25 MINIMUM SPECIFIC NUMBER OF REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSES AND
- 26 LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES REQUIRED FOR EACH HOSPITAL UNIT BASED ON
- 27 THE NURSING CARE NEEDS OF THAT UNIT TO ENSURE SUFFICIENT NURSING

- 1 STAFF TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE PROTECTION AND CARE FOR ALL OF THE
- 2 HOSPITAL'S PATIENTS.
