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SENATE BILL No. 49

January 24, 2007, Introduced by Senator WHITMER and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to create the Michigan women's history commission; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments, agencies, commissions, and officers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "Michigan women's history commission act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Department" means the department of history, arts, and5 libraries.
 - (b) "Michigan women's history commission" or "commission" means the Michigan women's history commission created in section 3.
 - Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan women's history commission is created within the department. The budgeting, procurement, and related functions of the commission and administrative responsibilities for

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- 1 the staff of the commission shall be performed under the direction
- 2 and supervision of the department.
- 3 (2) The commission shall consist of the following members:
- 4 (a) One member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 5 representatives.
- 6 (b) One member appointed by the senate majority leader.
- 7 (c) One member appointed by the governor from the Michigan
- 8 hall of fame of the Michigan women's studies association.
- 9 (d) Eight members at large appointed by the governor.
- 10 (e) The 3 following members serving ex officio without vote:
- 11 (i) The director of the Michigan department of education.
- 12 (ii) The director of the Michigan women's commission.
- 13 (iii) The director of the department.
- 14 (3) The first members appointed under subsection (2) shall be
- 15 appointed no later than April 1, 2008.
- 16 (4) Members of the commission appointed under subsection
- 17 (2)(c) and (d) shall serve for terms of 3 years or until a
- 18 successor is appointed, whichever is later, except that of the
- 19 members first appointed 3 shall serve for 1 year, 3 shall serve for
- 20 2 years, and 3 shall serve for 3 years. A member of the commission
- 21 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives or the
- 22 senate majority leader under subsection (2)(a) or (b),
- 23 respectively, shall hold office for a term of 2 years to coincide
- 24 with the term of office of state representative.
- 25 (5) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled for the
- 26 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 27 (6) The governor, speaker of the house of representatives, or

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- 1 senate majority leader may remove a member of the commission
- 2 appointed by him or her for incompetency, dereliction of duty,
- 3 malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance in office, or any other
- 4 good cause.
- 5 (7) At the first meeting, the commission shall elect from
- 6 among its members a chairperson and other officers as it considers
- 7 necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the commission
- 8 shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of
- 9 the chairperson or if requested by 7 or more members appointed
- 10 under subsection (2)(a), (b), (c), and (d).
- 11 (8) A majority of the members of the commission appointed
- 12 under subsection (2)(a), (b), (c), and (d) constitute a quorum for
- 13 the transaction of business at a meeting of the commission. A
- 14 majority of the members appointed under subsection (2)(a), (b),
- 15 (c), and (d) present and serving are required for official action
- 16 of the commission.
- 17 (9) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 18 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 19 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 20 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 21 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 22 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- 23 MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 24 (11) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 25 compensation. Members of the commission may be reimbursed for their
- 26 actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 27 official duties as members of the commission.

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- 1 Sec. 4. The commission shall do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Review, plan, and implement a master plan to promote and
- 3 preserve the history of women in this state to enhance Michigan's
- 4 tourism product and expand educational materials.
- 5 (b) Work in conjunction with state and federal authorities to
- 6 sponsor commemorations, linkages, seminars, and public forums on
- 7 women in this state.
- 8 (c) Assist and promote the making of applications for
- 9 inclusion in the national and state register of historic places for
- 10 significant historic places related to women in Michigan.
- 11 (d) Assist and develop partnerships to seek public and private
- 12 funds to carry out activities to protect, preserve, educate, and
- 13 promote the legacy of women in this state.
- 14 (e) Assist the department of education and other appropriate
- 15 organizations in developing and distributing curricula on women's
- 16 history.
- 17 Sec. 5. The commission shall annually report to the governor
- 18 and both houses of the legislature on the activities of the
- 19 commission in the prior calendar year.
